TO WHEATLY RESEARCHERS:

This page needs some explanation: It is part of a letter I was writing to one of our second cousins. He was a grandson of our Aunt Anne, whose name was not included in the letter because he presumably already had such information.

Ours was a very close-knit family, especially through my grandmother Maria Pilling Moore, for we Zimmers shared her home until 1929 when three of us children had already finished college.

Anne Pilling 1833-1913 married Conrad Stocker 1829-1912 sometime prior to the Civil War. It's odd, how strange events frequently help us arrive at a date. The Pillings nearest neighbors were the Nugens, and at the time of the wedding two guests from the neighbor's house who were classmates at West Point, James Nugen from Newcomerstown and his buddy, a fellow named Phil Sheridan from Somerset, Ohio. As was the custom then, all the wedding guests rode horseback to accompany the newly-weds to their cabin at Port Washington.

Talk about wandering off the subject!!!! The second cousin to whom I was writing was the Rev. Paul F. Stocker of Bethlehem, Pa. and formerly head of the Moravian Church in America.
