Widow's Claim for Pension.

The State of Ohio, County of Suscarawas, ss.

On this twelfth day of December, A. D., 1864, personally appeared before (1) me, Peter Henry, Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas

a Court of Record within and for said county, Catherine Bradshaw aged 27 years, a resident of Newcomertown in the county of Suscarawas, and State of Ohio, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862: (2)

That she is the widow of George W. Bradshaw, who was a Corporal in Company No. 1, commanded by (Captain) Lieutenant Coville, in the fifth Regiment of Ohio Vol. Infantry, commanded by Col. McElain, in the war of 1861. (3)

That her said husband died at New Campbellville, in the State of Georgia, on the 27th day of May, A. D. 1864

(4) from a wound occasioned by a piece of a shell striking him while in a lying posture & the Rebels were shelling our forces at the place of our position as I am informed while in the line of duty in the service of the United States.

She further declares that she was married to the said George W. Bradshaw at Peter Palmer, on the 14th day of November, A. D., 1858, by one Harrison Sayre, a Minister; that her name before her marriage was Catherine Mandis, and that ever since the death of her said husband, she has remained a widow: as will more fully appear by reference to the proof annexed. (5)

She believes there is a Public Record of a copy thereof may be found here to attach and in the best evidence she can obtain

That during the existence of the aforesaid marriage, there were born to her and her said husband the following named children, who are now under the age of sixteen years, viz:

Thomas Bradshaw, born the 7th day of September 1856; Mary E. W. was born on the 16th day of August 1858; George W. was born the 4th day of January 1861 and Robison L. Bradshaw was born on the 4th day of October 1863.

all of whom are still living, and reside in Newcomertown Ohio.

She also declares that she has in no manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted, the Rebellion in the United States.

She further says that her Post Office address is Newcomertown Suscarawas County, State of Ohio.

Laughhead, residents of New Philadelphia in the County of Juscarawas, and State of Ohio, persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit, and who, being by me duly sworn, say that they were present and heard the contents of the foregoing declaration read to the said Catharine Broadshaw and saw her sign her name make her mark thereto. They further swear that they were acquainted with the said George Broadshaw, deceased, in his life-time, and know that he and the said Catharine Broadshaw, lived and cohabited together as man and wife, up to the time when he entered the service, and that they were generally recognized as such by their acquaintances and neighbors, and their marriage was never questioned. That during the continuance of said marriage there were born to them the following named children, all of whom are now under the age of sixteen years, viz: (7) Thomas M. Broadshaw, Mary E. B., George B. and Robison L. Broadshaw.

That since the death of her said husband, the said Catharine Broadshaw has not married, but is still a widow; and that she is the identical person she represents herself to be. All the foregoing statements they make from their own personal knowledge; and they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.
