

Ancestors of Mahala Renneker

Generation No. 1

1. **Mahala Renneker**, born 15 Oct 1826 in Stone Creek, Phillipsburg, Tuscarawas Co., OH.; died 02 Aug 1904 in Newcomerstown, Tuscarawas Co., OH.. She was the daughter of 2. **Johann Peter Renneker** and 3. **Christiana Harbaugh**. She married (1) **Jesse Anderson Wyandt** 04 Apr 1843 in Newcomerstown, Tuscarawas Co., OH.. He was the son of Jacob Wiant, Jr. and Catherine (spouse of Jacob, Jr.) Wiandt.

JESSE ANDERSON WIANDT

Jesse Anderson Wiandt was born August 6, 1805 in Greenfield Township, Bedford County, Pennsylvania. He was the son of Jacob Wiandt according to the 1820 PA census, and had three brothers by the names of Adam, Israel, and Jacob who all eventually removed to Tuscarawas County, OH as well.

Jesse's grandfather was Johan Wendel Wiand (1709-1787), who came from Freinsheim, Germany and settled in New Goshenhoppen, Upper Hanover Township, Montgomery County, PA. His great grandfather was Jacob Wygandt (1679-1719) of Freinsheim, Germany.

In 1823, at the age of 18, young Jesse journeyed to Jefferson County, OH. This trip was probably taken via the "national trail" (which today is U.S. #40) across the Laurel Ridge, through Uniontown and Little Washington, then Wheeling, WVa. and into Ohio. He then went to Carroll County, OH where, at age 24, he was married to Mary Runyan, who was a native of Pennsylvania as well. The wedding was held on March 12, 1829 and performed by John Wagonhols, Minister of the Gospel.

Mary (Runyan) Wiandt was born around March of 1808 and was 21 years old when she and Jesse were married. From Carroll County the Wiandts moved to Tuscarawas County, OH and settled in Salem Township. A son was born to them in Salem Twp. on July 22, 1837 and they named him Reuben Runyan Wiandt.

Mary died on January 23, 1843 at the age of 34 years and 10 months leaving Jesse, then 38, with little Reuben at five and a half years of age. Mary was buried in The Old Pioneer Cemetary which is located in Newcomerstown on South Bridge Street where the Penn Central Railroad crosses. Its official designation is Tuscarawas County Cemetary, Oxford Twp. #163.

The population of Tuscarawas County in those days was almost wholly German or of German descent. They were a thrifty and frugal race and many became quite wealthy. The indians had then left the country and bears had dissappeared, but wolves and deer were yet abundant.

The winter of '42/43 was a sad time for the Wiandts who had lost both wife and mother. Reuben being so young and impressionable, would likely lose memory of Mary, who gave him birth, but to Jesse, the now middle-aged pioneer, her death was certainly a strike to his heart. He had recently constructed a log cabin for his family one mile south of Wolf. The winter snow and the cold winds made Jesse think of the coming spring when he would have to plant his crops alone or perhaps work for someone else to earn enough to provide for himself and little Reuben. Many a night was spent beside the oil lamp with head in hands and heavy eyelids, planning a new life for he and his son. Hence, being a thrifty German and probably with encouragement from Dr. Enoch Wolf, his friend and neighbor, Jesse went out in search of a new wife and almost immediately found one. Jesse must have been quite the handsome gentleman, because at age 38 he managed to meet, court, and marry a maiden of age 16!

Her name was Mahala Renneker and she was born on October 15, 1826. She was a daughter of Peter and Christianna (Harbaugh) Renneker who had settled in Stone Creek, OH, (which today is Phillipsburg) and had raised a rather large farm as well as a large family of 4 sons and 4 daughters. Sixteen was a prime age for marrying in those days, so Mahala was a good candidate when Jesse Wiandt rode into town! Mahala and Jesse were married on April 4, 1843 by E.C. Young, M.G. (Minister of the Gospel).

Jesse led his young bride from the big farm to the little old log cabin which occupied the spot on which the later home would be built. The country was still a wilderness then, and the journey from her parent's farm above Stone Creek to the cabin one mile south of Wolf was not an unpretentious one!

Springtime of '43 came in as a meadowlark for the new Wiandt family! Jesse had secured the position as proprietor of the local grist mill. Little Reuben would now have a new mother and Jesse would have someone to tend his home and, unbeknownst to her, raise a family of 16 children! Within a month of their newly established home, Jesse and Mahala Wiandt got busy starting a family of their own!

February 23, 1844, a son was born to the Wiandts. They would name him Samuel Renneker Wiandt, after Mahala's brother, Samuel Renneker. Reuben, then six and a half would have a playmate and Jesse would soon have two trainees for the mill. {Sam married Ellen Gibbens on April 15, 1869 by U. Jesse Knisely, Ph.D., M.G. and removed to Missouri.}

June 8, 1845, the first daughter was born. She was named Mary Wiandt. {Mary married a Mr. Creamer and removed to Iowa}.

December 2, 1846, came another son. He was named George Washington Wiandt. It was a common, comic, yet noble deed in those days to name one's offspring after presidents or other famous people. {George also located his family in Iowa}.

October 15, 1848, came the second daughter, Lavina. Jesse was now 43 and Mahala, just 22. {Lavina grew up and married a Mr. Mumma and removed to Illinois}.

October 26, 1850, came another girl, Sarah Jane. {Sarah Jane Wiandt was married to Benjamin Franklin Burdette (11/21/1848-8/1/1922) of Winchester, Guernsey Co., OH on Christmas day 1878 by U. Jesse Knisely, Ph.D., M.G. at the Lutheran St. Paul's Church in Newcomerstown, OH. To them were born 4 children; Alvin, Artha Mahala (Burdette) Fisher, William, and Elmer. Benjamin was a C & M watchman and bridgetender for many years, eventually losing his eyesight and suffering for 11 months before passing on}.

August 7, 1852, came the fourth son to Jesse and Mahala and he was given the name Thomas Jefferson Wiandt. {Thomas was married to Jane "Jenny" Hammel on January 9, 1875 by C.J. Hunter, M.G., Presbyterian, who travelled between New Philadelphia, Urichsville, and Dennison. Tom and Jenny would have 11 children; Etta W. (Wiandt) Hosfelt, James Franklin, Mare E. (Wiandt) Goode, Jesse Anderson, John Thomas, Bessie Belle (Wiandt) Thompson, Martha (Wiandt) Lehman, Charles, Mabel (Wiandt) Meyers, George, and Washington. Tom and Jenny farmed around Tuscarawas Co. while raising their family then removed to Highland Park, Detroit, MI, where he died 12/7/1933 and she died 12/21/1927}.

June 25, 1854, came the fourth daughter to the Wiandts. They named her Catherine. {She grew up and married a Mr. Elliott and removed to Iowa}.

The Jesse Wiandt family was now half-established in 1854:

April 14, 1856, came the birth of yet another girl. She would be named Christina Elizabeth after her grandmother, Christianna Renneker. {She married a Mr. Davis and remained in Ohio through her years}.

October 26, 1857, came the birth of Henry Clay Wiandt. Henry's birth signalled a generation change in Jesse's family for soon his eldest son would himself be a married man. {Henry married a girl, M. Stocker on September 3, 1876 by Frederick Regula, J. P., Jefferson Twp. and they removed to Colorado}.

August 19, 1858, came the marriage of Reuben Wiandt, then 21, to Artha M. Richie, daughter of Daniel and Louisa Richie of Tuscarawas County. {Reuben and Artha were members of the Newcomerstown Lutheran Church. Two children were born to them; Daniel Jesse (7/25/1859-1899) and John L. (9/2/1865-5/26/1956). Reuben was a Salem Twp. trustee and devoted most of his attention to agricultural pursuits and owned a well-improved farm of 130 acres. Reuben died in 1923 and Artha in 1932. They are buried with their sons and their wives at East State Street Cemetery, Newcomerstown.

December 26, 1859, came another son to Jesse and Mahala. He was named James Wiandt. He would be five months younger than his own nephew, Daniel Jesse, son of Reuben.

February 26, 1862, came another daughter. She was named Malinda Isabelle Wiandt.

The family was now pretty large and hard to feed, but still not yet in full bloom! Jesse was now age 57, Mahala age 36, Reuben - 25, his wife Artha - 22, their son Daniel Jesse - 2 1/2, Sam - 18, Mary - 17, George - 16, Lavina - 14, Sarah - 12, Tom - 10, Catherine - 8, Christina - 6, Henry - 5, and Jimmy - 3.

November 26, 1863, came one more son. He was named John Brough Wiandt. {John located in Urichsville, OH when he grew up}.

August 26, 1865, Mary Wiandt, the second born to Jesse and Mahala, was married to William A. Stonebrook by S.M. Hickman, M.G. {She would later marry Mr. Creamer and move to Iowa}.

September 2, 1865, another son was born to Reuben and Artha. They named him John L. Wiandt. {He would grow up to marry a girl named Ada}.

February 1, 1866, came another son to Jesse and Mahala. They named him William Wiandt. He would be the last son born to the couple and spent his lifetime in Ohio.

February 26, 1868, another daughter was born. She was named Ellen Wiandt, and would become the youngest child to live a long life. {Ellen later married a Mr. King and settled in Ohio}.

April 15, 1869, Samuel Renneker Wiandt married Ellen Gibbens at the St. Paul Lutheran Church in Newcomerstown by U. Jesse Knisely, Ph.D., M.G.

May 22, 1870, the last child was born to Mahala and Jesse. She was named Laura Wiandt. Jesse at that time was 65 years of age, Mahala was 44, Reuben - 33, his wife Artha - 30, their sons Daniel Jesse - 11 and John L. - 5, Samuel - 26, Mary - 25, George - 24, Lavina - 22, Sarah - 20, Thomas - 18, Catherine - 16, Christina - 14, Henry - 13, Jim - 11, Malinda - 8, Johnny - 7, Billy - 4, Ellen - 2, and Laura - infant. The way Jesse and Mahala reared this family, there were probably only 10 or 11 children at home at any given time and some either had not yet been born or had already been out on their own. What a job to raise 16 children in those trying times!

January 6, 1873, young Laura passed from this world just before the age of three.

April, 1874, the plat for Wolf's Station was laid out by Dr. Enoch G. Wolf, a long-time neighbor who was also a carpenter by trade. He donated the right-of-way, built the railway station, started the post office, worked in the mercantile business, built the Methodist Church, and laid out a cemetery all from his 200 acre tract of land.

January 9, 1875, Thomas Jefferson Wiandt and Jenny Hammel were married. December 25, 1878, Sarah Wiandt and Benjamin Franklin Burdette were married.

August 20, 1895, Jesse Anderson passed away at the age of 90 years and 26 days. He was laid to rest at the East State Street Cemetery, Oxford Twp. #162. His tombstone d.d. reads ? - 9/1/1895 90y 26d.

August, 1904, Mahala (Renneker) Wiandt passed away at the home of her son, William, at the age of 77 years and 10 months. She was laid to rest beside her beloved Jesse. And so ends the mortal career of these honest, yet sturdy pioneers.

LETTER TO JAMES F. WIANDT

Newcommerstown, Ohio

August 6, 1922

Dear Niece & Nephew,

I received your letter a few days ago & will try & write you few lines. It is hard for me to tell you the sad news, Frank passed away on the 1 on this month & was laid to rest. He was sick for 4 months. It was something awful the wayt he suffered. I took care of him day and night for three months myself till he got so helpless I could not handle him. He got so he couldn't walk a step nor get up out of his chair. He could not lay down during all his sickness. Just sat in his chair day and night till he was just worn out. He got in such a shape it would almost make anyone heart sick to be about him. No one knows what a time I put in. I got down sick myself for awhile we had to have a man to come & take care of him at night the last month of his sickness, for I was not able to. Our doctor bill is almost a hundred dollars. I can hardly explain to you what his trouble was for he had too many diseases mixed together, but come down & I will try & tell you all about it. It leaves me all alone & it is awful lonely for me. I have one of Elmer's little girls here for a while. We laid him away respectable if it takes our little home to pay for it. Well I will not write any more this time as I am not feeling so very well. Write when you get this and please excuse this paper for I am just out of writing paper.
