1931-2014

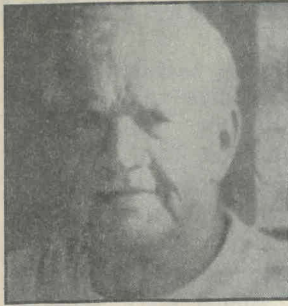
NEWARK — It's rare to find a person today that never missed a day of work during their entire working career, nor a person who rarely missed his grandchildren's sporting events.

Andrew D. "Jip" Simpson, 84, of Newcomerstown, died Wednesday, Dec. 31, 2014, at his residence.

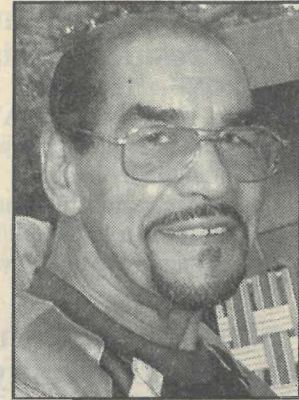
He was born Monday, March 3, 1930, in Cambridge, to the late Andrew and Goldie (Quarles) Simpson.

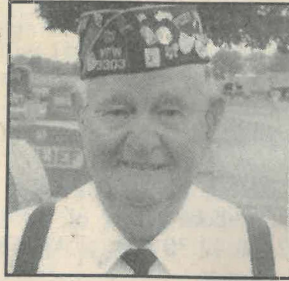
**LESTER W. MARLATT SR.**

Hazel Garretson, 94, born in West Virginia on Sept. 19, 1921, was the daughter of the late Bill and Rosa Edwards.

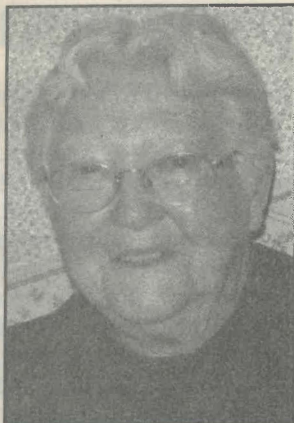
She went to her heavenly home on Monday, Dec. 14, 2015.

Donald was born in Canton on March 20, 1940, a son of the late Eli T. and Janet C. Biery Jones.

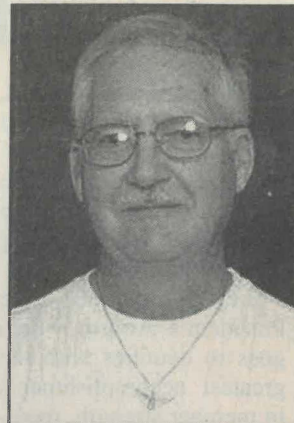
He was a graduate of Port Washington High School, class of 1958.

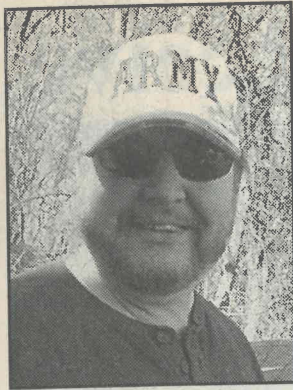
He was employed at Walmart in Coshocton, and had previously worked at Boltaron for 26 1/2 years.
