SURROUNDING NOT AS GOOD AS LOS ANGELES. CORONADO BEACH HOTEL OPENED FEB 1<sup>ST</sup> 1888. SAID TO COVER SEVEN ACRES OF GROUND. RETURNED TO LOS ANGELES RENTED COTTAGE ON BUNKER HILL AVE. 20.00 FOR MONTH. COAL HERE IS \$30.00 A TON. WOOD FOR KINDLING 50 CENTS FOR SACK ABOUT TEN LBS. TO THE SACK.

WAS OVER TO SANTA MONICA 15 MILES FROM LOS ANGELES, BEAUTIFUL VIEW OF THE GRAND OLD PACIFIC OCEAN FROM THE TIP OF THE ARCADIA HOTEL.

FEB. 1<sup>ST</sup> W.W. MISKIMEN LEFT HERE FOR SAN DIEGO. FEB 2<sup>ND</sup> WARM SUNSHINE MET BIG JIM WILLIAMS AND A MR. HAY FROM COSHOCTON, MET MR. FRANK CINENT AND BRO, THEY SHOWED ME THROUGH THE THEATRE BUILDING OWNED BY O.W. CHILDS. FRANK IS SELLING TICKETS TO SEE UNCLE TOMS CABIN, ONLY ONE DOLLAR FOR TICKET. E.A.L. SICK HAS NOT BEEN OUT OF THE HOUSE FOR SEVERAL DAYS, IS BETTER THIS EVENING. B.F. BOBO & WIFE IS BOARDING WITH US OR RATHER WE ARE KEEPING HOUSE TOGETHER.

CALLED ON DR. HAGAN. THE DR. IS NOT ABLE TO BE IN HIS OFFICE, HIS HEALTH IS NOT GOOD.

THERE IS SOME SMALL POX IN THIS CITY, BUT IS KEPT WELL UNDER CONTROL. I NOTICE QUITE A NUMBER OF CONSUMPTIVES HERE, MANY OF THEM ARE DYING. THIS IS NOT A GOOD PLACE TO COME IF YOU HAVE CONSUMPTION. TWO HAVE DIED HERE ON BUNKER HILL IN THE LAST 2 WEEKS. BOTH OF THEM HAD THE CONSUMPTION, WERE HERE FOR THEIR HEALTH. I CAN SEE ONE OR MORE IN EVERY HOTEL IN THE CITY WHO HAVE COME HERE THINKING THIS CLIMATE WILL HELP THEM. POOR FELLOWS I FEEL SORRY FOR THEM, THEY LOOK SO BAD, AND SEVERAL HAVE TOLD ME THEY ARE WORSE SINCE THEY CAME HERE, WENT TO SEE FRED ANNSCHLAG. HE IS IN JAIL FOR THE MURDER OF MR. HITCHCOCK AND WIFE. HE KILLED THEM BOTH WITH A SHARP HATCHET AND THEN BURRIED THEM IN THE SAND. WAS ARRESTED AND IS NOW ON TRIAL. THE SHERIFF OF THIS COUNTY GAVE ME A PASS. I WENT IN TO SEE ANSCHLAG IN THE JAIL. TALKED WITH HIM A SHORT TIME. HE KILLED THE MAN AND HIS WIFE SO HE WOULD NOT HAVE TO PAY HIM WHAT HE OWED HIM. HE HAD BOUGHT MR. HITCHCOCK RANCH TOLD MR. H TO MAKE OUT THE DEED AND HAVE EVERYTHING READY AND HE ANSCHLAG WOULD PAY HIM THE MONEY. MR. H MADE OUT THE DEED HAD IT SIGNED SEALED AND ALL READY TO HAND OVER. MR A HAD NO MONEY SO HE MURDERED THE MAN AND HIS WIFE, STOLE THE PAPERS AND THOUGHT HE HAD A VERY CHEAP PROPERTY. MOVED IN THE HOUSE AND WENT TO

WORK BUT HE ONLY HELD POSSESSION ONE DAY. HE WILL OR SHOULD HANG. THE JAIL HERE IN LOS ANGELES IS A FIRST CLASS BUILDING. IT HAS AT THIS TIME 243 PRISONERS. SEVEN IN FOR MURDER, 3 MEN AND TEN WOMEN. IT IS NOT SAFE FOR A PERSON TO BE OUT HERE AFTER 9 AT NIGHT. I HEAR ALMOST EVERY MORNING OF SOME ONE WHO WAS ROBBED THE NIGHT BEFORE. IT IS 20 MINUTES OF ELEVEN, I WILL GO TO BED,

FEB 2<sup>ND</sup>, 1888

FEB 3RD. WARM SUNSHINE BOUGHT MYSELF A PAIR OF CALF BUTTON SHOES PRICE THREE DOLLARS FOR THEM. RECEIVED A LETTER FROM RENO. THE FOLKS ARE ALL WELL THERE.

THERE IS A WHITE ROSE BUSH IN THE FRONT YARD IN FULL BLOOM, ALL KINDS OF FLOWERS BLOOM HERE EVERY MONTH IN THE YEAR, OUT IN THE OPEN AIR.

RECEIVED MY DEED FROM THE RECORDER OF TRELARE COUNTY. MR. W.F. THOMAS: TREASURER. LOTS IN LAKE VIEW TRELARE COUNTY, NUMBERS 33-64 INCLUSIVE COMPRISING THE NORTH HALF OF BLOCK 88. BOTH THESE LOTS OF MR. JOHN F. LYONS NOTARY PUBLIC 607 MONTGOMERY STREET ,SAN FRANCISCO ,CALIFORNIA. DEED IN BOOK 26 OF DEEDS, PAGE 151 & 152 RECORDS OF TRELARE CO CALIFORNIA.

FEB. 4<sup>TH</sup> THIS MORNING FEELS LIKE A SUMMER MORNING IN OHIO. IT IS WARM BRIGHT SUNSHINE. EXCURSION TO ELSINORE, LOTS FOR SALE THERE VERY CHEAP, BUT AS I HAVE NO MONEY TO INVEST, I WILL STAY HERE AND LOOK AT THE PEOPLE, AND WAIT UNTIL MRS. E A L GETS SO SHE CAN BE OUT AND AROUND. MET REV KERN FROM PA. HE IS A M.E. PREACHER. SAYS HE HAS MET REV S.A. THOMPSON. BR. THOMPSON LIVES IN POMONA 30 MILES FROM HERE. A TOWN OF 3000 INHABITANTS. I WAS IN PAMONA. BUT DID NOT KNOW THEN THAT BRO THOMPSON LIVED THERE.

START OF 2<sup>ND</sup> ARTICLE FOR "THE NEWS"

FEB. 5<sup>TH</sup>, 1888

FEB 5<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY ATTENDED SABBATH SCHOOL AT THE FORT ST. M.E. CHURCH. ABOUT 550 OR 600 IN ATTENDANCE, WAS KINDLY RECEIVED. STAYED FOR PREACHING. SERMON BY REV CANTINE FORMERLY OF CHICAGO. THE TEXT WAS HELP ONE ANOTHER. DR. CANTINE IS A FIRST CLASS PREACHER. AFTER SERVICE HE ANNOUNCED THAT HE WANTED \$750.00 TO BUILD A COTTAGE AT SAN FERNANDO, THIS COUNTY. SAN FERNANDO IS A METHODIST TOWN. WE HAVE A THEOLOGICAL SCHOOL THERE AND THE DIFFERENT CHURCH SOCIETIES ARE BUILDING COTTAGES FOR THE STUDENTS TO LIVE IN WHILE ATTENDING SCHOOL. FORT ST. M.E. CHURCH IS THE STRONGEST IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA.

THE WEATHER IS VERY PLEASANT. I AM SITTING IN MY ROOM IN MY SHIRT SLEEVES, BOTH WINDOWS UP, VERY WARM OUT IN THE SUN. STRAWBERRIES ARE RIPE HERE AND IN MARKET.

THREE OF OUR BISHOPS WILL BE HERE ON THE 8<sup>TH</sup>. ATTENDED CHURCH THIS EVENING AT THE FORT STREET CHURCH. DR. CANTINE PREACHED FROM THE TEXT A SOFT ANSWER TURNETH AWAY WRATH. DR. CANTINE IS DOING A GREAT GOOD HERE. I BELIEVE HIM TO BE A GOOD HONEST MAN.

MR. B.F. BOBO WAS WITH ME. MRS. E. A. L. IS MUCH BETTER, EXPECTED TO SEE BRO S.A. THOMPSON. DID NOT SEE HIM. THINK HE WILL BE HERE ON WEDNESDAY OF THIS WEEK. THE M. E. CHURCH IS THE STRONGEST ON THIS COAST. THE CHURCHES HERE ARE ALL WELL ATTENDED. QUITE A NUMBER OF THE TOWNS IN THIS COUNTY WILL NOT PERMIT A SALOON TO BE RUN IN THE CORPORATION. THIS CITY OF LOS ANGELES HAS ENOUGH SALOONS FOR THE WHOLE COUNTY.

FEB 6<sup>TH</sup>, 1888

BRIGHT, WARM, MORNING DAY. RECEIVED A LETTER FROM HOME, FOLKS ALL WELL.

REGULAR MEETING OF LOS ANGELES LODGE F.& A.M. NO. 42 ON SPRING STREET. MR. BOBO AND MYSELF WENT TO LODGE. BOTH PASSED GOOD EXAMINATION. WERE VERY KINDLY RECEIVED BY THE BRETHREN. LOS ANGELES LODGE CHARGES \$50.00 FOR THE DEGREES. ALL PAID AT ONE TIME, WHEN THE PETITION IS PRESENTED,

THE CITY IS FULL OF STRANGERS, HAVE BEEN AT SEVERAL OF THE HOTELS TODAY, HAVE LOOKED IN THE FACES OF SEVERAL HUNDRED PEOPLE. ALL STRANGERS. IT IS POSSIBLE FOR A MAN TO BE LONESOME,

EVEN WHEN THERE IS THOUSANDS IN PLAIN VIEW. AT LEAST SUCH WAS MY EXPERIENCE FOR A SHORT TIME TODAY. BUT GOING TO LODGE TONIGHT HAS BEEN QUITE A RELIEF. THEY WERE STRANGERS WHEN I SENT IN, BUT NOT WHEN I CAME OUT. SO MOTE IT BE.

FEB. 7, 1888

WEATHER SAME AS YESTERDAY. MR BOBO TOOK ME OVER TO EAST LOS ANGELES. THIS IS THE FIRST TIME I HAVE BEEN OVER IN THAT PART OF THE CITY. IT IS BUILDING UP VERY FAST. THERE ARE MANY BEAUTIFUL BUILDING LOTS. BOYLE HEIGHTS WILL BE IN TIME THE MOST DESIRABLE PLACE IN EAST LOS ANGELES. I MET A MISTER ANDREAS TODAY. HE TELLS ME HE WAS WITH HARDESTY BROS IN CANAL DOVER FOR SEVERAL YEARS. HE MET MR. JOSEPH STINT TODAY AT THE POST OFFICE. MR STOUT SAYS HE EXPECTS TO BE IN DOVER ABOUT THE FIRST OF MARCH. HE GOES HOME BY NEW ORLEANS.

I RECEIVED A LETTER TODAY FROM MR. G.W. MISKIMEN, POST MARKED ENSENADA , FEB 3<sup>RD</sup> 1888, BAJA, CALIFORNIA. THIS PLACE IS 65 MILES SOUTH OF SAN DIEGO IN MEXICO, OR AS IT IS CALLED HERE LOWER CALIFORNIA. GOERGE SAYS THERE IS A BOOM THERE BUT HE WOULD NOT GIVE 25 CENTS AN ACRE FOR IT AND BE COMPELLED TO LIVE THERE.

SENT TWO VALENTINE TO OHIO TODAY. ONE TO MARY M. ONE TO IDA C. LYONS. HOPE THEY WILL BOTH BE PLEASED. HERE I WOULD LIKE TO SEE BOTH THE KIDS.

RECEIVED THE INDEX TODAY. DATED JAN 5 & 12. THEY WERE GLADLY RECEIVED ALTHOUGH A MONTH OLD. WE DO NOT GET OUR PAPERS HERE AS PROMPT AS WE OUGHT TO. LAST WEEK ONE DAY I TOOK MY PLACE IN THE REAR OF THE LINE FORMED IN FRONT OF THE WINDOW MARKED H TO M. I THINK IT WAS A LEAST ½ HOUR BEFORE I COULD SPEAK TO THE LADY AT THE WINDOW. THEN SHE TOLD ME VERY PLEASANTLY NO PAPERS FOR MR. LYONS. I SAID THE PAPERS WERE SENT HERE FROM RENO. SHE SMILED AND ELEVATED HER EYEBROWS AND SAID, THEY WILL BE DISTRIBUTED IN A FEW DAYS. SO I GOT TWO TODAY, JAN 5 & 12<sup>TH</sup> AND WILL GET THE REST I SUPPOSE NEXT WEEK.

FEB 8<sup>TH</sup>. WEATHER SAME AS YESTERDAY. TOOK A BUGGY RIDE THIS MORNING OVER TO THE EAST SIDE. ON MY RETURN TOOK TRAIN FOR PASADENA. THE COUNTRY IS THICKLY SETTLED BETWEEN HERE AND PASADENA. THE MOST ATTRACTIVE SCENE IS THE RAYMOND HOUSE. IT IS BUILT ON A HIGH HILL THAT OVERLOOKS PASADENA AND FROM THIS HOTEL YOU CAN SEE THE PACIFIC OCEAN, WHICH IS 24 MILES WEST. YOU ALSO HAVE A BEAUTIFUL VIEW OF THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY, AND OTHER SMALL TOWNS IN GABRIEL VALLEY. PASADENA IS THE MOST

BEAUTIFUL PLACE THAT I HAVE SEEN IN THIS COUNTRY. THERE IS SEVERAL PEOPLE HERE THAT ARE WORTH MILLIONS AND I THINK POOR PEOPLE WOULD NOT FEEL AT HOME HERE. THEY CLAIM 1200 POPULATION. NO SALOONS IN THE CITY. THERE ARE SEVERAL TOWNS IN THIS COUNTRY WHERE THEY WILL NOT PERMIT SALOONS. THAT IS THE CASE IN OTHER TOWNS IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA.

I RETURNED TO LOS ANGELES AT 8 PM. STARTED TO VISIT SOUTHERN CAL. LODGE. HAD MET WITH THEM BEFORE. GENERAL MILES WAS PASSED TO THE DEGREE OF FELLOW CRAFT. THE GENERAL IS A FINE LOOKING MAN ABOUT 55 YEARS OLD. THERE WAS 70 BRETHREN PRESENT. SOUTHERN CAL LODGE MEETS IN MASONIC TEMPLE ON THE CORNER OF SPRING AND 1<sup>ST</sup> STS. I MET A BROTHER FROM ALEXANDRIA EGYPT. HE COULD TALK SEVERAL LANGUAGES, ONLY ONE OF WHICH I COULD UNDERSTAND.

THIS IS A GOOD PLACE TO SEE PEOPLE OF ALL KINDS. FROM ALL COUNTRIES. THE CHINESE ARE HERE IN SWARMS. THEY WILL HAVE A GRAND TIME ON THE 10<sup>TH</sup> OF THIS MONTH. IT IS THEIR NEW YEAR'S DAY.

THIRD ARTICLE FOR THE NEWS

FEB 9<sup>TH</sup>

WE HAD SOME FOG HERE LAST NIGHT. THIS MORNING IT IS CLOUDY. LOOKS LIKE IT WOULD RAIN. WENT TO SEE O W CHILDS, HE REMEMBERS HARRIET & MARY. HE SAID HE OFTEN WENT TO SEE MRS. VOGENITZ, WAS A WARM FRIEND OF BOB & HARRIET'S, REMEMBERS MARY WHEN SHE WAS YOUNG. HE LEFT NEWCOMERSTOWN 37 YEARS AGO. HAS 6 CHILDREN, 4 BOYS AND TWO GIRLS. THE OLDEST BOY IS 23. HIS NAME IS WILLIE CHILDS. IS A MODEL YOUNG MAN. GOOD LOOKING AND IS A GOOD BUSINESS MAN. HAS NO BAD HABITS. CHILDS AND FAMILY ARE CATHOLICKS, THEIR HOME HERE REMINDS ONE OF THE OLD CASTILIAN RESIDENSES, BEAUTIFULLY DESCRIBED IN FIRST CLASS NOVELS.

FEB 10<sup>TH</sup>

WARM BUT, CLOUDY. WENT TO INGLEWOOD, THIS COUNTY. MET MR. S.P. CAPPUCK, HE IS PRESENT LIVING THERE. HE IS A RELATIVE OF MR WILLIAMSON OF NEW PHILADELPHIA. WENT FROM INGLEWOOD TO BOLONOA HARBOR. THEY ARE SPENDING AN IMMENCE AMOUNT OF MONEY THERE IN TRYING TO DIG OUT A HARBOR. WAS ROYALY ENTERTAINED AT INGLEWOOD BY AGENTS CHILDS AND SILENT. THEY ARE SELLING LOTS THAT REASONABLE. IT IS A BEAUTIFUL SIGHT FOR A TOWN, AND THEY WILL MAKE IT A SUCCESS, I BELIEVE. THEY HAVE ARTISIAN WELLS THERE OF GOOD WATER. LOTS FROM \$350 TO \$1700.00, BUT THIS PRICE THEY DO ALL THE PAVING AND CONDUCT WATER TO EVERY LOT.

FEBRUARY 11, 1888

SATURDAY

WARM SUNSHINE, AS WARM AS JUNE IN OHIO. THE HILLS HERE ARE COVERED NOW WITH GREEN GRASS. EARLY IN MAY THE SUN CLOAKS EVERY THING GREEN IN THIS COUNTRY, EXCEPT WHERE YOU IRRIGATE. THERE IS ONLY ABOUT ONE HUNDRED DAYS IN THE YEAR HERE THAT THE GRASS IS GREEN, THE OTHER TWO HUNDRED AND 65 DAYS, THE FIELDS AND HILLS LOOK LIKE OUR STREETS IN AUGUST.

RENTED A ROOM FROM MR. WILLSON. NO. 231 BUNKER HILL AVENUE. PAY HIM \$20.00 FOR MONTH FOR ONE ROOM, PRICE IS THAT FOR HIGH.

SUNDAY,

FEB 12, 1888

BEAUTIFUL SUNSHINE DAY. THE BIRDS ARE SINGING, THE AIR IS FRAGRANT WITH THE BREATH OF FLOWERS. ATTENDED THE FIRST ST. M.E. SUNDAY SCHOOL. STAYED TO PREACHING, REV CONTINE PREACHED FROM THE TEXT, SANCTIFY YOURSELF THROUGH THE TRUTH. HIS WORD IS TRUTH. THIS CHURCH IS CROWDED EVERY SABATH, SIMPSON TABERNACLE, CORNER STONE SERVICE AT 2 PM, HELD ON THE GROUND OF HAFE STREET. BETWEEN SEVENTH & EIGHTH STREETS. ADDRESS BY BISHOP FIASS, BISHOP FISSLER WAS TO HAVE DELIVERED THE ADDRESS BUT HIS VOICE WAS NOT IN CONDITION. BISHOP FIASS IS A GRAND GOOD MAN. I THINK THERE WAS THREE THOUSAND PEOPLE PRESENT. THE BUILDING WHEN COMPLETED IS ESTIMATED TO COST 63 THOUSAND DOLLARS INCLUDING THE ORGAN. THE ORGAN COSTS 12 THOUSAND DOLLARS. WAS INTRODUCED TO BISHOP FIOSS, BISHOP FOWLER WAS PRESENT AND PERFORMED THE SERVICES OF LAYING THE CORNER STONE. THERE WAS SEVERAL PARTIES ON THE GROUND SUBSCRIBED ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS EACH, QUITE A NUMBER 500.00. I THINK THEY HAD ABOUT HALF THE AMOUNT RAISED TODAY. THERE ARE VERY MANY PEOPLE HERE THAT CAN AFFORD TO GIVE THOUSANDS.

THE FIRST WORDS I EVER HEARD BISHOP FIASS SAY WERE GOD LOVES HIS CHURCH FOR WHAT IT COST, FOR WHAT IT IS AND FOR WHAT IT WILL BE. THE BISHOP IS A VERY STRONG PROHIBITIONIST, AND IS NOT AFRAID TO SPEAK HIS SENTIMENTS. THERE IS A GROWING ANTI SALOON SENTIMENT HERE IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. AND IF BISHOP FIASS LIVED HERE AND WOULD OR COULD PUT IN HIS TIME ON THAT LINE, I BELIEVE IN SIX MONTHS EVEN CALIFORNIA WOULD VOTE TO ABOLISH SALOONS.

SO AS TO HEAR REV CANTINE PREACH TONIGHT, TEXT THE LOST SHEEP. HOUSE CROWDED, FOUR CAME FORWARD FOR PRAYERS.

MONDAY,  
FEB. 13, 1888
