## Greetings,

Talk about surprises! I can't begin to thank you for your unexpected envelope with the Engel material in it. It is greatly appreciated. Your information fills in some of my gaps and solves a few mysteries. You will surely appreciate the information that I have enclosed. I have done a lot more research since my chart was first published in the TC Connections III.

First, the family surname is Engel, which means Angel in German. The name is pronounced as 'Angel' in English. Most of the early records in Tuscarawas County have the surname spelled as Angel. Neplew Cousing 5

Phillip is the sort of Nicholas and Catherine Engel and his siblings were Catherine, Abalonia, Barbara, Jacob, Juliana, Joseph and Benjamin. I have not been able to trace most of these children but you have found some of them in the Moravian Church records.

The family settled in Tuscarawas County about 1848 just west of the Tuscarawas River across from Midvale in Warwick Twp. I believe that the family came from Germany at the time of the revolution in 1848. They may have been apart of this revolution or they were escaping from the same. By 1860, Philip and Margaret had moved to New Philadelphia.

I knew about Maria (Mary) Engel but I had no idea about John, who was born and died between the censuses. I checked the cemetery records in Warwick Twp and Goshen Twp for Maria, but never found her. Perhaps she is buried in the Sharon Moravian Church Cemetery.

I did not know that Margaret's surname was Wolfe. Hopefully some of her family also moved to Tuscarawas County. I appreciate the photo of Margaret. I am sorry to say that I do not have any Engel photos to send you outside of the tombstone pictures. I have been to the family plot many times with the latest being last summer.

I have enclosed my unfinished family history on the Engel. I have been sidetracked by a number of projects and will get back to it some day. I have all of the documentation that is mentioned in the history plus the documentation is fully referenced and you can find them at the courthouse. If you need any of the documentation, I will make copies and forward them to you. Let me know what you need.

My one sister, <u>Kathy Hunka</u>, lives in Newcomerstown and my other sister, <u>Sarah Hinton</u>, lives just across the border in Coshocton County.

I have been doing genealogical research since 1988 and approximately 90% of the people that I have contacted or who had contacted me never have anything to exchange. It is a real pleasure to have been given this material from you.

# Engel Family

# Philip Engel

Philip Engel was born in Wohnsheim, Grand Duchy of Hesse-Darmstradt, on 22 July 1822.<sup>1</sup> He married Margaret Wolf in December 1845. She was born on 27 March 1825 in Wohnsheim.

They immigrated to the United States arriving in New York City on 6 November 1849.<sup>2</sup> They had come from Le Havre, France, on the ship *Argo*. With them were their daughters, Margaret and Maria, possibly a sister named Maria Engel and a brother-in-law, Henry Wolf.



They had seven known children. The first three children were born in Wohnsheim while the remaining children were born in Warwick Township, Tuscarawas County, Ohio.

Valentine Engel was born on 10 February 1846 and he died in April 1846 in Wohnsheim.

Margaret Engel was born on 10 December 1847 in Wohnsheim. On 24 February 1867, Margaret married John William Eckert in New Philadelphia, Tuscarawas County.<sup>3</sup> Margaret died on 16 September 1924 in New Philadelphia and she was buried in the Fair Avenue Cemetery in New Philadelphia.<sup>4</sup>

Mary Engel was born on 17 September 1848 and she died on 3 November 1850 in Warwick Township, Tuscarawas County, from whooping cough. She is buried in the Sharon Moravian Cemetery in Warwick Township.<sup>5</sup> There is no tombstone for Mary.

John Engel was born on 15 November 1850 and he died on 21 April 1851. He is buried in the Sharon Moravian Cemetery.<sup>6</sup> There is no tombstone for John.

Philip Engle was born in 1853. He married Wilhelmima Heilperstein on 8 March 1874 in New Philadelphia.<sup>7</sup> He died on 20 January 1881 in New Philadelphia.<sup>8</sup>

Charles Engle was born on 29 December 1854. He married Maria Elizabeth Kreiger on 18 May 1882 in New Philadelphia.<sup>9</sup> He died on 25 October 1890 in New Philadelphia.<sup>10</sup> His will was written on 20 October 1890 and it was probated on 31 October 1899.<sup>11</sup>

Elizabeth Engle was born on 12 October 1859. She married Samuel Simpson on 7 October 1890 in New Philadelphia.<sup>12</sup> She died on 11 November 1912 in New Philadelphia.

Philip and Margaret are listed in the 1850 census returns for Warwick Township, Tuscarawas County.<sup>13</sup> Philip's surname is spelled as 'Angel.' He is working as a farmer. In the family are the daughters Margaret and Mary.

Philip purchased 12 acres of land from John and Elizabeth Shoemaker in Warwick Township on 10 April 1850.<sup>14</sup> Nicholas Engel witnessed this land transaction. On 13 August 1853 Philip and Margaret sold this property to Josiah Warton.<sup>15</sup>

Henry and Margaret Glaser sold lot number nine in the east addition of New Philadelphia on 1 April 1853.<sup>16</sup> Philip went on and purchased lot number 318 from John and Almina Chapin on 25 March 1856<sup>17</sup> and lot number 10 in the Helmick's Addition from Ernest and Magdalena Schmidt on 7 June 1865.<sup>18</sup>

On 15 March 1865 Philip purchased a little over five acres from Oliver and Frances Taylor in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of township 8 in range 2.<sup>19</sup> Margaret purchased lot number 9 in the Helmick's Addition from Frederick and Dorothy Eibert on 2 April 1863.<sup>20</sup>

By 1860 the family had moved to New Philadelphia where Philip was working as a barber.<sup>21</sup> Added to the family were Philip, Charles and Elizabeth. Also living with the family are John Eckert (who would marry Philip's daughter Margaret) and Jacob Engel (who maybe the father of Philip).

In 1870 Philip listed his occupation as a retail grocer in this year's federal census.<sup>22</sup> Both he and Margaret list their birthplace as Darmstradt, which is apart of today's Germany. Philip, Charles and Elizabeth are still living in the household.

Philip died on 9 December 1876 in New Philadelphia<sup>23</sup> and he was buried on 12 December 1876 in the Fair Avenue Cemetery. He wrote his will on 18 August 1871 and it was probated on 14 December 1876.<sup>24</sup>

Margaret and Charles Engel are listed in the 1878 Directory of Tuscarawas County as living on 35 West Fair Street in New Philadelphia.<sup>25</sup> Charles' occupation is listed as a musician.

Margaret Engel is listed as the head of household during the 1880 census along with her children Charles and Elizabeth.<sup>26</sup> Her occupation is that of a housekeeper while Charles is working as a saloonkeeper.

O 59 05 Philadelphia<sup>27</sup> and she was buried in 21 November in the Fair Avenue Cemetery. Her will was written on 10 May 1883 and it was probated on 26 November 1884.<sup>28</sup>

Margaret Engel was born on 10 December 1847 in Wohnsheim, Grand Duchy of Hesse-Darmstradt. On 24 February 1867 she married John William Eckert in New Philadelphia, Ohio.29 The Reverent Frederick Fleischer of the German Protestant Church married them.

John was born in Bisterschied, Rheinpfalz, Kingdom of Bavaria, on 3 September 1844. He arrived in the United States in December 1858.

They had nine children: Eliza, Charles, Emma, Ida, Margaret, Clara, Mary, Edward and an unnamed infant who died shortly after birth. All the children were born in New Philadelphia.

## Nicholas Engel

It appears that Nicholas Engel was the uncle to Philip Engel and he is probably the reason why Philip moved to Tuscarawas County.

Nicholas Engel was born on 17 November 1801 in Wohnsheim, Grand Duchy of Hesse-Darmstradt. He was married to Catherine Ritter on 4 December 1827 in Wohnsheim. She was born on 7 April 1807 in Wohnsheim. They immigrated to the United States on 29 June 1836. They had eight children. The first four children were born in Wohnsheim while the remaining children were born in Tuscarawas County.

The family is listed in the 1840 federal census for Tuscarawas County.<sup>49</sup> They are living in Warwick Township and in the family two boys and three girls are marked. Nicholas is listed as Nicholas Ingle.

During the 1850 census of Tuscarawas County Nicholas and Catherine Engel were living in Warwick Township.<sup>50</sup> With them are their children Barbara, Jacob, Joseph and Benjamin. Nicholas' occupation was a farmer. Joseph and Benjamin were twins. The family is listed as 'Angel.'

Nicholas's eldest daughter, Catherine, was married to Eli Harbaugh and this family was also living in Warwick Township during the 1850 census. Living with the Harbaugh's were two more daughters of Nicholas's, Abalonia and Juliana.

Peter Engel was born on 17 November 1828.

Catherine Engel was born on 7 February 1830. She married Eli Harbaugh on 5 November 1848 in Tuscarawas County. Henry F. Harbaugh, who was born circa 1849. Rufus Owen Harbaugh was baptized on 15 December 1850.<sup>51</sup>

Abalonia Engel was born on 18 August 1832. She married Ernest Senef on 10 December 1850 in Tuscarawas County. She died on 12 December 1906 in Warwick Township, Tuscarawas County. Ernest was born on 12 January 1828 and he died on 17 August 1904. They are both buried in St. James Lutheran Cemetery in Warwick Township. They had seven known children: Theodore, Adam, Catherine, Henry, Peter, Julia and Mary.

Barbara Engel was born on 21 August 1834. Barbara married John Schumacher on 2 February 1871 in Tuscarawas County.

Jacob Engel was born on 24 December 1838<sup>52</sup>. Juliana Engel was born on 11 September 1840. Julian married Philip Schmecheimer on 6 Jan 1869 in Tuscarawas County. Joseph and Benjamin Engel were born on 20 September 1843.

The family moved to Iowa in April 1854. During the 1860 federal census the family is living in Washington County, Dutch Creek Township.<sup>53</sup> With Nicholas and Catherine are their children Jacob, Julia, Joseph and Benjamin.

# Jacob Engel

Jacob Engel was born circa 1790 probably in what is now Germany. He was living with the family of Phillip and Margaret Engel during the 1860 census of New Philadelphia.<sup>54</sup> He may have been the father of Philip.

Jacob was a baptismal sponsor for Jacob Engel, the son of Nicholas and Catharine Engel, on 3 February 1839.<sup>53</sup> No more information has been found for Jacob Engel.





## **History of the Library**



Ohio librarians are proud of the state's "long history of literacy." But Dover had to wait until 1902, and like many communities had to wait on an "angel" for financial help. It came from the American Sheet and Tin Plate Co. who wanted a library for its employees, and the general public.

It was located at the corner of Front and Factory Streets (Tuscarawas Avenue). It contained 2,000 books in charge of a Mr. and Mrs. Simpson, and included everything from "Six Thousand Years of History" to "Mrs. Wiggs of the Cabbage Patch." Modern day mystery fans will appreciate it also contained "The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes."

In 1907 the community of Dover took over, moved the library to the corner of Cherry and Fifth Streets, and the Simpson family remained custodians until 1914.

The new high school was built in 1916. The library building was dismantled and the library moved to the school basement. In 1923 came the state law requiring a community library board. Mrs. L.H. Alexander, Francis Briegal, Mrs. P.G. Justice, S.O. Mase, Mrs. Ella Seibel, Dr. K. Earl Shaweker, and Rev. J.E. Weinland, comprised the first board. The first librarian was Vivian McCarthy who served as a high school senior.

Mrs. Justice retired from the board in six months, assumed librarian's duties and served "competently and devotedly" for 22 years.

In 1927 an "unfortunate impression" arose. A newspaper story reported that many Dover residents thought the basement library was a student library. But figures were released saying that circulation had increased 100 percent in four years and it was feared the library would soon outgrow its quarters.

In August 1934, The Daily Reporter headlined the fact that the library was opening in an "Elaborate New Home." This was the former private home at 417 Walnut Street, which was to house close to 11,000 books. The "new" library was described as "commodious, with excellent natural lighting, serving its purpose well and conveniently accessible to both high school student and the general public."

hat building no longer exists. In 1953 funds for a new library were acquired with a bond issue and the present building opened its doors in 1955. Dan Cooley, a 1965 Dover High graduate, became library director in 1980 and retired in 2009. Jim Gill became the library director in January of 2010.
