

42 seniors again to r

Fifty years ago, Newcomerstown High School conducted commencement for members of the Class of 1942, and this week many of that gang of 29 boys and 39 girls will visit West Main Street in Newcomerstown again.


Why West Main Street? Because five decades ago the stretch of West Main Street from the C&M Railroad tracks to River Street was common ground for the citizens of Newcomerstown and nearby townships.

In this short distance was located the major retail center of their collective world, an important setting of social interaction for persons of all ages.

Saturday was West Main

Street's busiest day. It was crowded with people and automobiles with the latter parked at an angle to the curb. Every merchant, financial institution and office was open for business and for greeting and conversing with friends, neighbors and relatives. The longer you talked and listened, the more information you collected and spread.

Every Saturday, except for a Christmas or New Year's Day, there were more people than automobiles on West Main Street. Many families did not have a car, but they could — and would — walk uptown or downtown or crosstown to West Main Street. Some retailers kept their doors open until 11 p.m. or later if

the possibility of one more sale existed.

Almost without exception a sale involved cash, either in full or as the initial payment of a layaway plan. "Grown-ups," as "school kids" perceived their parents and other members of the older generation, believed strongly in the consumer policy: Save up, then buy. Today's magic plastic, the credit card, was unknown to them.

The Class of 1942 had a typical senior year until Monday, Dec. 8. The football team, dominated by seniors, set a new school record for wins in a single season by winning one more game than the great 7-0-0 team of these seniors' freshmen year. The home games were played on Fridays, under lights first used the previous season.

The marching band, respledent in complete uniforms, performed at halftime for the second year in a row. Evastine Rice, a senior, was leader of the eight drum majorettes. During timeouts, seniors Doris Wilkin and Suzanne Gainor led the cheerleading corps of seven girls. At the Oct. 31 game, senior Norma Miller reigned as homecoming queen.

Unquestionably, the superstar of these Friday nights was senior Wib "Lightning" Little. Running from the tailback position in the single wing, Little contributed spectacularly to the Trojans' first-ever league championship. After the season, he received one of the halfback positions on the United Press All-Ohio High School team.

The other seniors on this team were Wally Curtiss (C), Don Harrison (RG), Charlie Cunningham (RT), Chet Hanson (RE), Fred Snyder (LT), Packy McFarland (QB), Bob Gaynor (HB) and Don Wolff (FB).

In this bygone era, football was important partly because it was the only varsity sport offered in the autumn and there was no television to keep people at home on Friday nights.

Other facets of life were different, too. For example, the local paper reached Bob Duncan's newstand on Mondays and Thursdays and was called the Newcomerstown News and Index. Charles Phillips was the editor and each issue was composed and printed in the same building now occupied by Newcomerstown News editor Ray Booth and his colleagues.

The Dec. 8 issue of the News and Index reported that five Trojan footballers had been named to the Eastern Ohio League's All-Star team. In addition to Little, those honored were Curtiss, Snyder, McFarland and Wolff.

This joyful news, however, was the last article written about the Class of 1942 during peacetime, for that morning, Congress voted to go to war against Japan. Jeannette Rankin of Montana cast the only dissenting vote.

A typical senior year was no longer possible.

Immediately following this entry into World War II, the Heller Brothers Co. announced an increase in plant security to insure the protection of its work force of approximately 1,300, who had been busy filling defense orders for a number of months.

At the same time, superintendent of schools, C.L. McMahan, announced cancellation of the varsity basketball team's trip to West Virginia and North Carolina planned for the Christmas holiday period.

And the question on everyone's mind was: Where will the Japs strike next?

Enemy armed forces never reached Newcomerstown, but in February there was an unexpected invasion. The specific strain of hemolytic streptococcus which causes scarlet fever arrived and by Feb. 10, Mayor Earl Treasurer and Dr. C.A. Hanson, president of the board of education, ordered the schools closed.

Two junior high school teachers, Miss Rachel Barnett and Mr. Donald Pickering, were under quarantine with the illness. Four other teachers were under quarantine observation. Trojan basketball practice was suspended and the public library, located on the second floor of 143 W. Main Street, was shut down. Churches cancelled Sunday services.

The most dramatic medical episode of this quarantine period involved a popular member of the senior class. The *News and Index* reported her case thusly:

"Confined to her home with scarlet fever, Miss Virginia Laughlin, 17, underwent an operation for appendicitis Sunday morning (Feb. 15, 1942) at 2 o'clock, at her home on River Street.

"Miss Laughlin, quarantined over a week ago, was stricken with acute appendicitis Friday.

"As a result of the quarantine, local physicians had to perform the operation at home, using facilities at hand. The operation was performed on a dining room table."

On Tuesday night, Feb. 24, the Trojan basketball team hosted Cadiz in what, today, in the middle school auditorium. This contest was the last regular season game for six seniors: Lee Hootman (F), Bob Gaynor (G), Packy McFarland (G), Chet Hanson (C), Lloyd Craigo (G) and Don Wolff (F).

The final score was 48-27 in favor of the hosts. Hootman, the team's leading scorer, was highpoint man with 19. This victory, the 13th of the year, established a new school record for most victories in a single season, replacing the varsity record of 12 wins set when these seniors were in the eighth grade playing junior high basketball for coach Gene Riffle.

The most cherished of these 13 victories was a 44-38 upset of the New Philadelphia Quakers.

In March, the American Legion sponsored a patriotic essay contest for high schools in Tuscarawas County. Three of the eight prizes were won by Newcomerstown students. Senior girl winner was Jo Ann Trees. The assigned subject for the 348 students who volunteered was: "The system of checks and balances in the federal constitution and its relationship to the individual citizen."

On Wednesday, March 16, volunteers from the American Legion, Elks, Lions Club and Veterans of Foreign Wars launched a series of monthly salvage drives: rags, old rubber, paper and metals were needed for the war effort. Otto J. Beiter, a member of the board of education, served as general chairman.

Late in March, the W.M. Brode Co. was awarded a defense contract to build two gradeseparation underpasses at the Ravenna arsenal. Their low bid was for \$277,623.

Other local activities in March included civilian defense classes in firefighting, home nursing and first aid; the sale of approxirinately 1,820 state licenses plates for motor vehicles; and an announcement by senior Gloria Norris, the current Newcosean sales manager, that the price of a 1942 yearbook would be \$1.75.

In April, the News and Index contined to publish twice a week. The April 9 issue revealed that clothing store owner Norman Lerenman, who planned to join the Army in the near future, had appointed Elmer Sneary as store manager for the duration of the war. Lerenman's business was located at 130 W. Main St., today the location of Bowman Sportswear.

The April 13 issue reported that 90 local residents had been certified in first aid, an air warden's group had been formed in Newcomerstown, and 21 men were drafted into the Army.

At the high school, coach Phil Bickle was conducting spring football practice and the senior class play was in rehearsal. Every senior know how many days remained in the school year.

On May 5, "Spring Fever," a comedy in three acts, was presented to parents and friends by 10 members of the English and speech. Cost of admission was 40 cents, adults, and 30 cents, children.







Classmates were present from Ohio, California, Pennsylvania, Kansas, Kentucky and Wisconsin.


