

Father John Kempf

CLEVELAND — The Rev. Fr. John D. Kempf, former pastor and teacher throughout the Columbus Diocese, including Newcomerstown, died Tuesday (Dec. 28, 1993) at Cleveland Metro-General Hospital.

Fr. Kempf has been a priest for nearly 40 years, serving as priest of St. Francis deSales Church in Newcomerstown during the 1960's. While at Newcomerstown, he helped coach football and was involved with creating the area's youth baseball program. He assisted the community's drive for the purchase of the first emergency vehicle for the Newcomerstown Volunteer Fire Department. Fr. Kempf was guest speaker for the dedication of the new baseball fields behind Neighbor Street. He was pastor of Dresden St. Ann and its Mattingly St. Mary Mission in the 1970's and early 1980's. He was a teacher, coach and bus driver at the Chillicothe Catholic Central, Dennison St. Mary and Columbus Watterson high schools for many years. He was also involved with the Boy Scouts for more than 45 years as a Scoutmaster and in other capacities.

Fr. Kempf was a combat soldier in World War II in France and Germany, serving for four years with the 100th Infantry Division, and has been chaplain of their alumni group for over 30 years. He has also been a member of the American Legion, serving as national chaplain, state chaplain and in other positions; a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and he has been affiliated with the Disabled American Veterans. He has been active in the Knights of Columbus, serving as chaplain of the

Zanesville Msgr. Dury Council, Friar of Zanesville's Rosecrans Assembly and as state chaplain.

Most recently, he served as the resident Chaplain at the Light of Hearts Villa in Bedford, Ohio, until he left to live with his sister, Marion E. Schuckert, in Independence, Ohio. In addition to his sister, he leaves a brother, Stanley A. Kempf; two nephews, Frederick and Thomas; three nieces, Patricia, Ann and Kate; and 10 great-nieces and nephews.
