opment was recognized by the Newcomertown Chamber of Commerce when it was presented a Chief Award. The award is for investing in improvements, starting a business or supporting the community over a long period of time without previous acknowledgment.

Janet Bush explained that the development received its manufactured home license Dec. 29 and the first manufactured home resident moved in February. There are 11 homes in the development, including some model homes that are ready to move into.

"We're state approved for 44 lots," Bush explained. The TV service is also available. Creekside is able to provide city water and sewer. Cable service is also available. Creekside is in the Newcomertown corporation, family that located at Creekside from the Dover-New Philadelphia area.

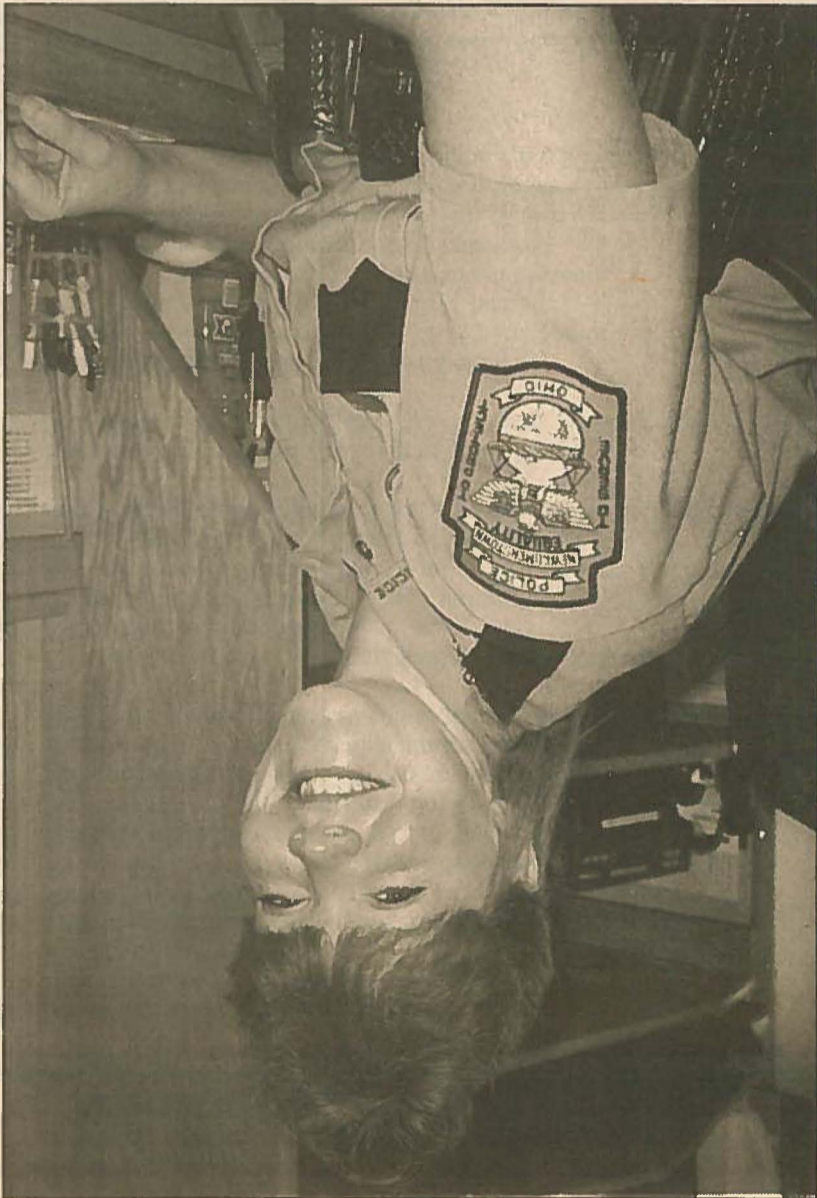

A young girl, lost and bewildered at Friday nights Homecoming football game knew who to turn to, the trustworthy one in the gray uniform armed with cuffs, gun, a badge with a name-tag reading Officer Shannon Gribble. Gribble, born and raised in Newcomerstown, had a dream to become an officer of the law. To honor and protect the community, she pursued her six month training course at the Buckeye Career Center located in New Philadelphia affiliated with the Ohio Police Officers Training Association.

In 1996, Gribble began as a reserve officer and dispatcher in 1996, the moved into the community. "At first people yelled 'hey, it's a lady cop,'" explained Gribble. "This is a great opportunity, I'm familiar with the town, the parents and I've always wanted to be an officer." There's a long history of law enforcers in her family and Sgt. Brian Hursey pushed for Gribble's employment with the department and the council was happy to vote for it.

"Sometimes they need a woman for certain situations," said Gribble, "And if I knew that I could help even one person and make a good impression, then I would be satisfied."

Gribble has not only contributed to the police department, but also to the children. She is coach of a t-ball team and also involved with working with local elementary and pre-schools regarding safety issues. Some issues Gribble expresses include bicycle safety, what to do around strangers, and teaching them about violence and precautions to take in case of an emergency.

Incorporating those issues, Gribble will be involved in Kids Day America. There will be seminars on educated the community on procedures in case of an emergency. There will also be identification fingerprinting for the children.

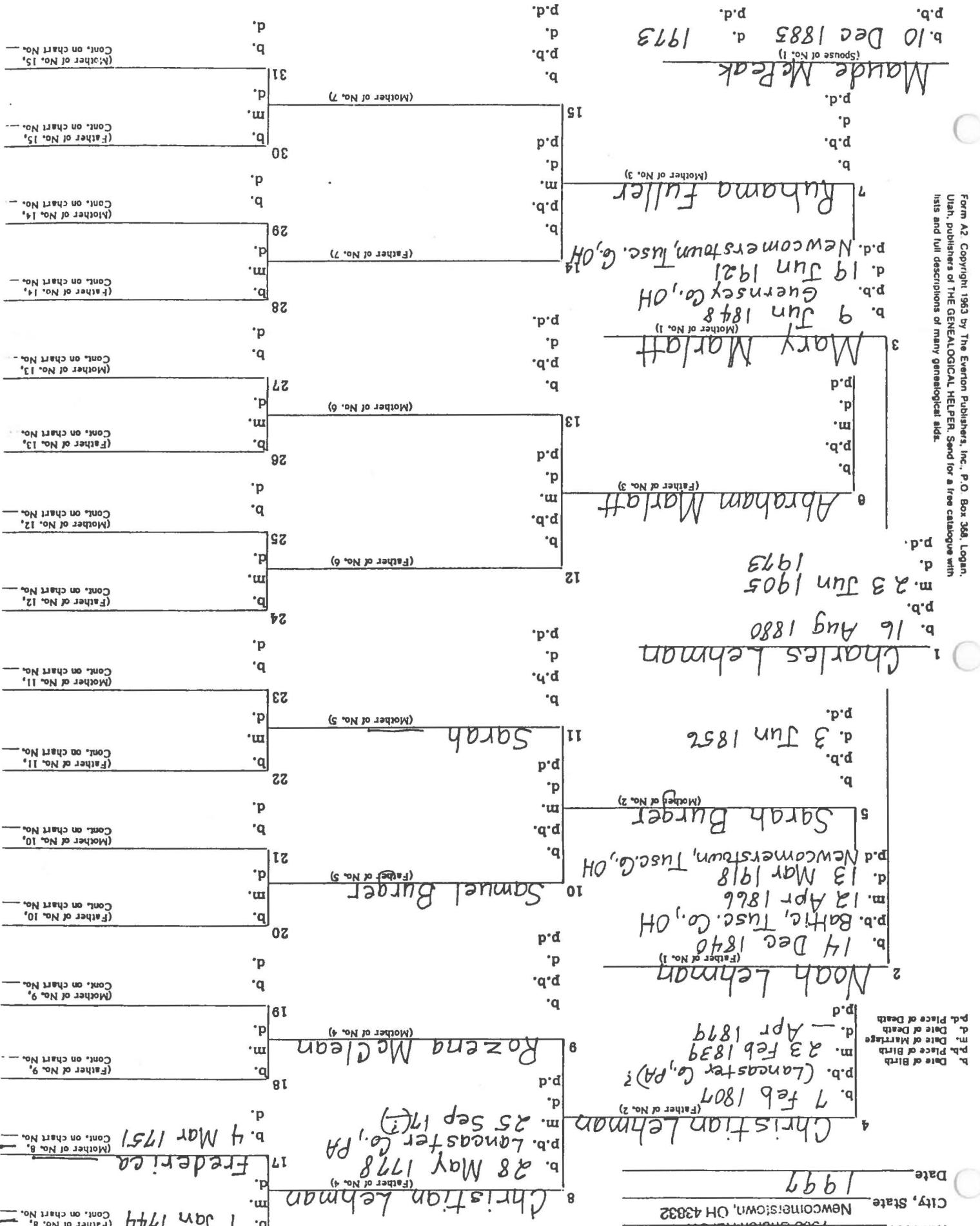

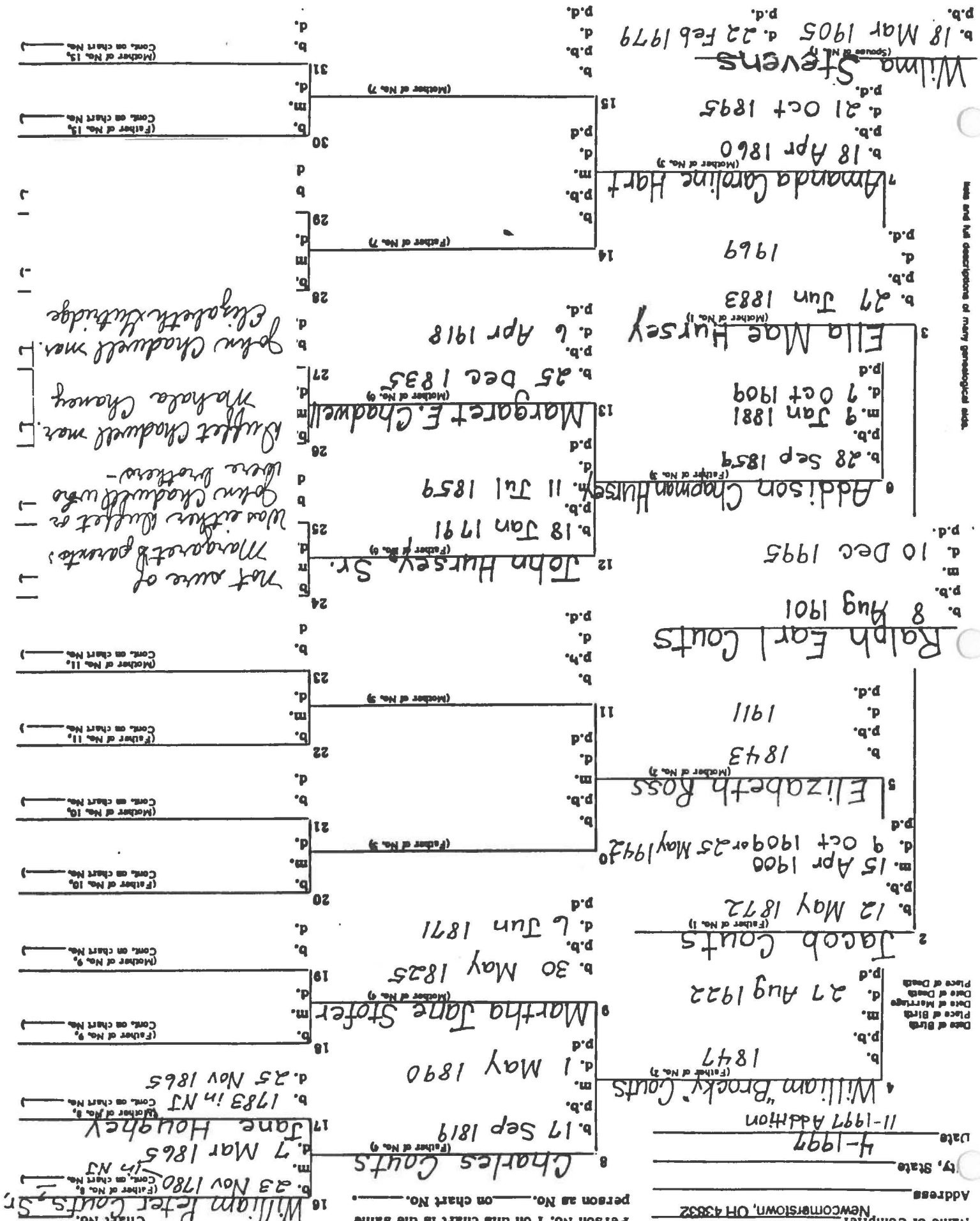

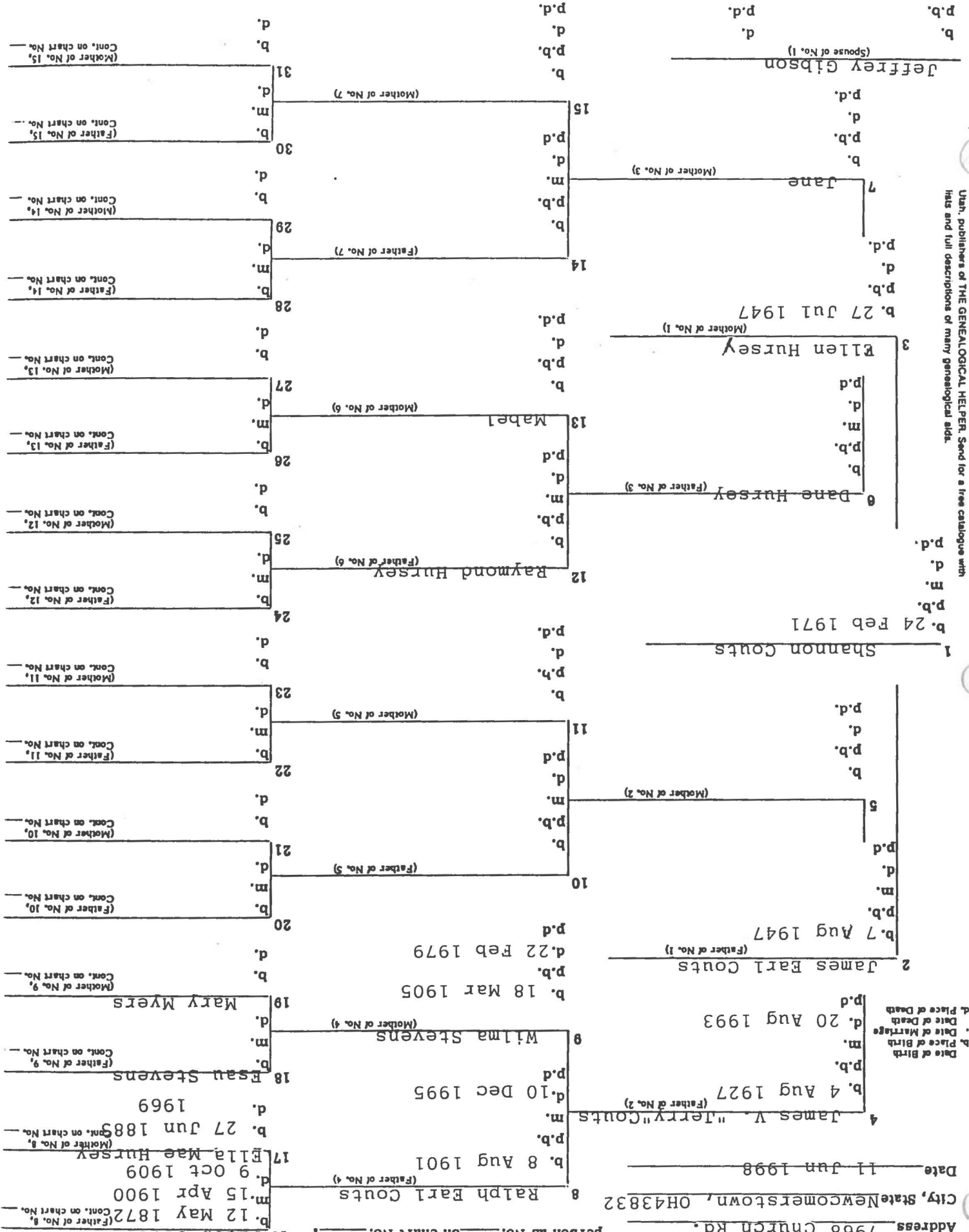

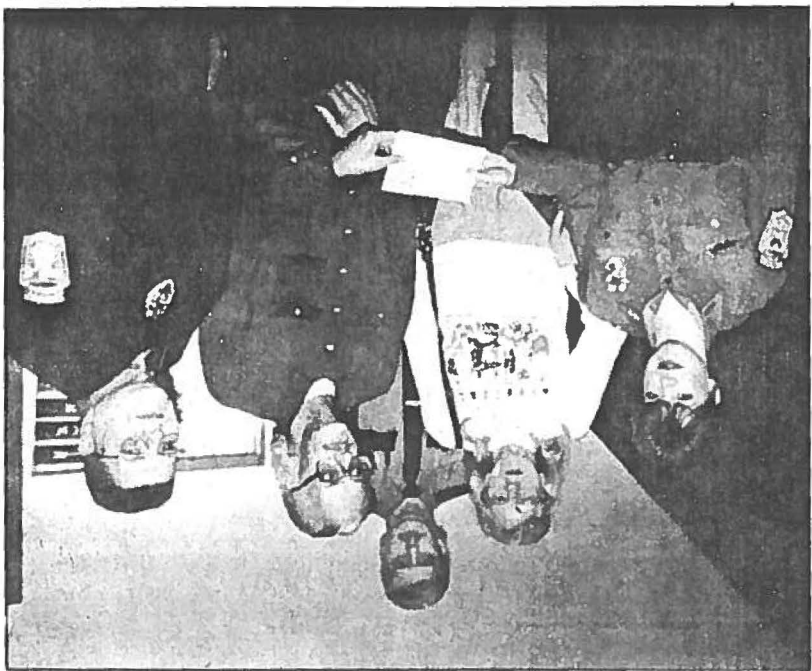

Col. Ed Johnson (ret.), former-ly of Plainfield, was the guest speaker this year during the Waggoner Cemetery Memorial Day Service, May 15, held at River Greens Golf Course due to inclement weather.

"Sacrifice is meaningless unless we remember," Johnson said during his address.

He said this Memorial Day marks the 136th time it has been celebrated in the United States. 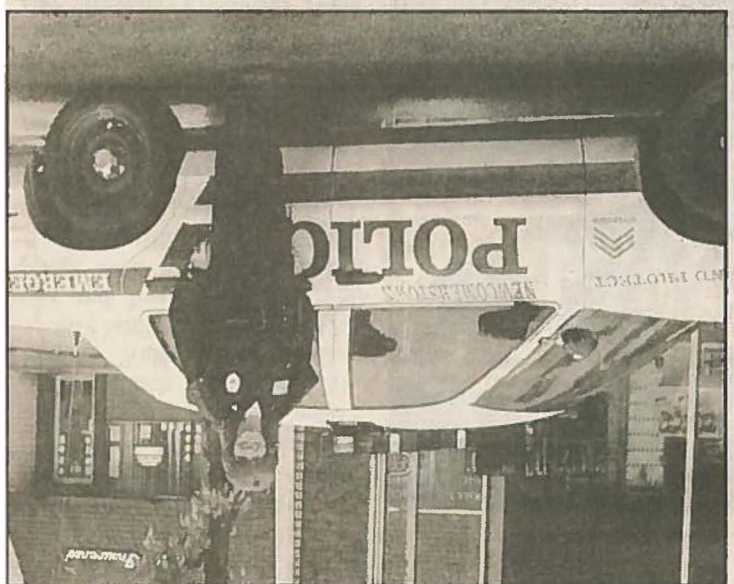

For the past seven years, Police Sgt. Shannon Gribble has been patrolling the streets of Newcomerstown but as of May 22 her duty in the community will change as she leaves her post.

"I really, really enjoyed it," Gribble said. "I like helping people. I have no regrets at all." Gribble submitted her resignation letter May 8 and her resignation is effective May 22. She will leave her post on the police department but will become a social service aide for the Tuscarawas County Job and Family Services.

Gribble began her tenure on the Newcomerstown Police Department in June 1996 as a part-time dispatcher. Then, after taking police officers training from the Ohio Police Officers Training Academy, she became a reserve officer and dispatcher. In 1999, she became a full-time road officer and in 2000 she was promoted to Sergeant.

"This was just something I wanted to do," Gribble said. "I wanted to help people." She said in her seven years of service to Newcomerstown, there were many scary moments but she said anytime when she sent an officer out on a call she was scared for them.

"It's scary anytime you send an officer somewhere," she said. "I don't want anything to happen to anyone." Recently, Gribble has been welcoming the next shift of officers when she leaves by saying "be careful."

She said she normally arrives at the police station about 6:45 in the morning and, normally, leaves at 3 p.m. But, there are times when she may work until 8 or 9 in the evening. She said that is part of the job, always being on-call.

As far as going to another police department, she said she could never do it. She said she knows everyone in this community and that is part of the reason why she became a police officer was to help those people. She said she's not sure if she'll return to her post in Newcomerstown because she lives by the idea of "never say never" and "nothing in life is guaranteed."

She said she's going to focus on her family.

"They're ready for it," Gribble said about her leaving the police department. "They're happy."

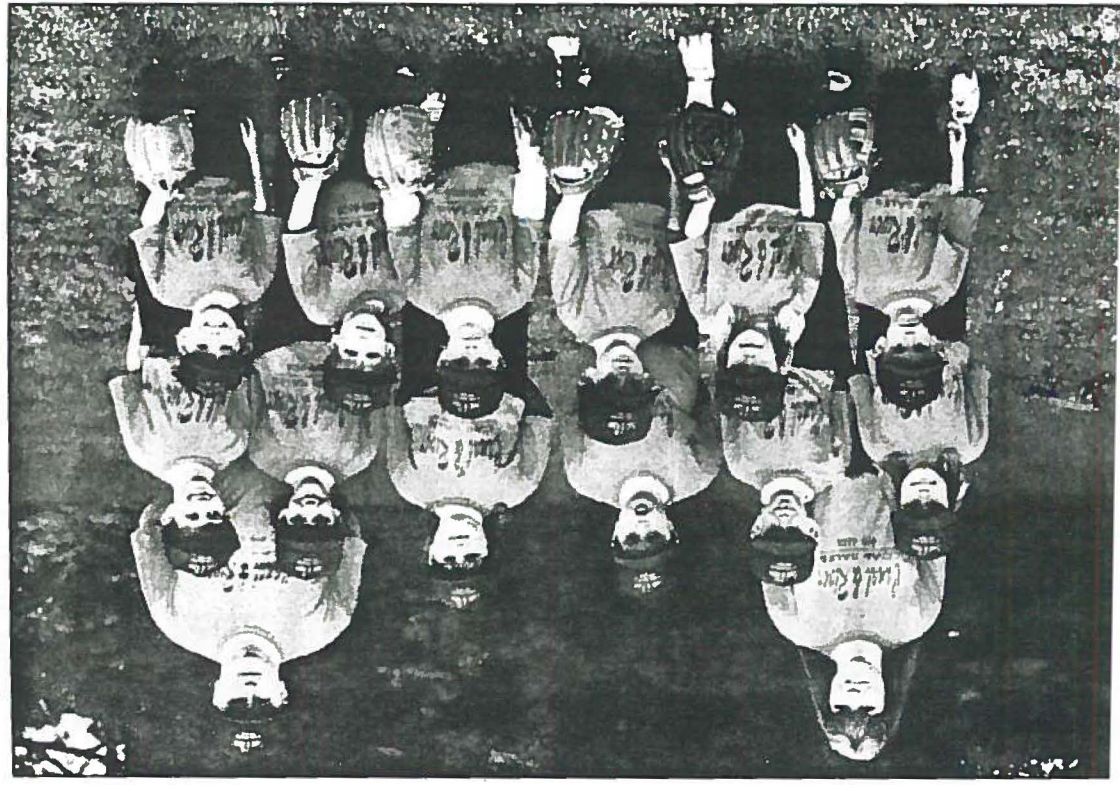

Times a'changing

Grandchildren following footsteps

seem to have inherited their caring and involvement with helping people from their grandfather, Dane Hursey. This common characteristic has led the two grandchildren to follow closely in his footsteps - including a career in law enforcement. Dane served as a dispatcher on the Newcomerstown Police Department from 1967 to 1973. At that time, other dispatchers included Bill Moore and Hursey. Things were a little different then because the Fire Department was still housed in the municipal build-

ing and dispatched through the police department. "This led to some amusing incidents," said Hursey. "One night we received a call and Everett McElhaney answered the call, jumped in the fire truck and left," said Hursey. When the other firefighters arrived at the station and asked where the fire was, Hursey had no idea what the location of the fire was because McElhaney just jumped in and responded.

Today Shannon is a part-time dispatcher for the department and a reserve officer following her completion of training at the Buckeye Career Center. Although the 911 emergency response system handles fire and emergency dispatching, many of the requirements of the job remain the same. "This is something I've always wanted to do," said Gibson. "I love it. I like helping people." She also plans to take EMT classes. Another difference between the department now and in Dane's employment is the housing of prisoners. The jail formerly had five cells and could hold prisoners indefinitely. Today the jail has one holding cell and a dormitory which can hold three people, but they are only held until transfer to the county jail.

Tom (Shannon's twin brother) is employed with the Coshoccon County Sheriff's Department as a full-time deputy working in the corrections division. He is continuing the family tradition of wanting to help people, although he says they don't always appreciate his help. "Probably the worst part of the job is that I could go out tonight and save someone's life and they'll be the first to criticize my actions," said Couls.

Dane echoes the sentiment that the police department always seems to be heard about in a negative manner. "The guys have always done a lot of good for the community, but that's not what people hear," he said. Along with size of the departments, Shannon and Tom have seen some other obvious differences between the two departments including pay and fringe benefits such as clothing allowances. According to the pair, there is at least a \$5 per hour difference in pay. Coshoccon also gives its officers \$400 more a year for clothing allowance. "Obviously, we don't do this for the money," said Gibson. All three seem to possess the characteristics that enable them to perform their duties effectively including an ability to handle multiple activities at one time when the phone is ringing, an officer is on the radio and you might have a person at the window along with a fire or emergency call. Maybe it's the sense of excitement but more likely the sense of involvement which attracts them to the position. "You keep track of what's happening and where your officers are," said Gibson. "The paperwork can always wait."

The Newcomerstown Department is currently installing and receiving training for a computerized system of operations following the receipt of a grant. "We may actually be one of the first in this area to have this equipment," said Gibson. If you were going to look for an inheritance to leave your family, perhaps the contributions of their grandfather to encourage caring and involvement in the community are his greatest legacy.
