Challia, Francis, Kenneth, John Lowell, Dorothy
and Doris - twins. John & Bessie were divorced about
1931. Bessie died Aug. 2, 1979 and is buried in Plainfield
Cemetery. Samuel, Charles and Bessie's parents
~~were~~ John and Amanda Wiggins Mc Cune who
owned a farm at Plainfield and brought farm produce
by horse and wagon into Coshocton weekly.

McCune School began circa 1846 when the enumeration was 24. It may have originally been in Linton Township, and was moved north across Wills Creek into Oxford Township on McCune land at the time that the North Bend School began. -from the Age, Mar. 21, 1885. Letter from C.B. Porter, Hanfield, Grant County, Indiana: "I attended school at the McCune schoolhouse northeast of Jacobsport during the winter of 1853-4, 2 1/2 to 3 miles from where I lived. One, James Stearman, I think, taught at that place. At the time I was making my home with Hugh Porter who lived in the John Miskimen farm. The schoolhouse was located on the farm. A few weeks ago in the Age I saw the names of some of my schoolmates, Reagan Banks and John Turney. I have often thought of some of these boys, but had no idea they were still living around there."

Charles Johnson conveyed lot 9, E 1/2 3d quarter, 1/2 acre, Township 5, Range 4 on July 13, 1877 to Frank Henderson, James Cole, William A. Poland, Robert Doherty, Samuel Vansickle, John Mackey and George McCune, members of the Oxford Board of Education. Cost was \$16.50. (52-19) -first recorded deed for the McCune School site. A new schoolhouse was built soon after acquiring this new site that early became a center for the community.

1901 T. M. Calhoun

Jan 21, 1902 a literary was held at the McCune Schoolhouse. The teacher, Mr. Calhoun, was, of course, in charge. Howard Leighninger and some of his friends, were there "making it difficult for the teacher". There was a disturbance in the back of the room and some snuff was thrown on the floor, causing a lot of people to sneeze and add to the confusion. Mr. Leighninger and his friends were in the back of the schoolroom because all the seats had been taken. Mr. Calhoun thought some tobacco juice had been expectorated on the floor, and announced that there would be no more of that. Leighninger took offense. After the entertainment was over on the way home, Leighninger and some boys followed Calhoun and Leighninger shot Calhoun in the back - the bullet striking him in the small of the back near his spinal cord, which paralyzed the lower part of his body. Leighninger was tried and convicted and sentenced to three years in the penitentiary. Soon after his release, Leighninger died.

Calhoun was badly crippled but managed to go to Ohio State University and study law. He was admitted to the Bar, and opened a law office in Coshocton about 1908. In August 1910 while trying

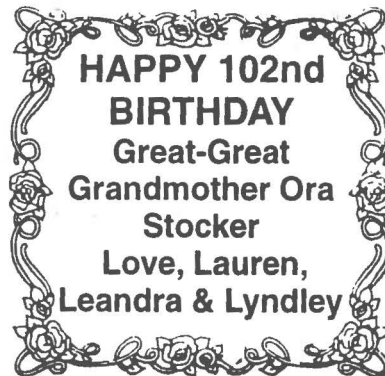

Former area resident loses legs in accident

Donnie McCune, 26, formerly from Newcomerstown and now from Dover, lost both legs after a one-car accident Saturday, January 6 and is a patient at Ohio State University Hospital in Columbus.

According to reports, Donald McCune III, 26, of Dover, formerly of Newcomerstown, was listed in fair condition at Ohio State University Hospital in Columbus after his vehicle went over an embankment and hit a tree, coming to rest on its top.

McCune was reportedly thrown from the vehicle. His brother, David, reported that McCune had lost one leg at the scene and the other had to be amputated at the hospital. A passenger, Stacey Bell of Newcomerstown, was not injured. Neither man was wearing a seat belt.

David McCune also reported that a passerby, Kenneth Napier of Newcomerstown, was the first on the scene and helped save his brother's life by keeping his leg in the snow to stop the bleeding and keeping him alert. Emergency personnel from the Newcomerstown Emergency Rescue Squad Inc. were also credited with helping save McCune's life.

Donnie, who was employed at Super K in New Philadelphia, asked to put something in "The Newcomertown News" to relay his thanks to everyone who helped at the

scene of the accident, the helicopter team, doctors and nurses and all the family and friends who've been at his side since the tragedy and also to all who remembered him in prayer. He said he doesn't have all the names; so a general but heartfelt thanks to all from him and from all who care about him.

Donnie's brother, Danny McCune, said the saddest part of the accident is his brother's amazement that anyone cared. "He didn't really know we loved him until this happened; I guess we all just assumed he understood that we did."

Donnie is already saying maybe this (the loss of his legs) is a blessing; that God has a new plan for his life. And he's putting others at ease with a courageous sense of humor, estimating the "savings he will enjoy not having to buy shoes."

But no matter what new dark-humored joke he comes up with, he mourns deeply the alteration of his body; after doctors fitted a sample artificial leg to one stump, he didn't want them to take it off.

Some of us will never know what opportunities we've missed because of our job security. When Rick McCune lost his job, he had no choice but to investigate different opportunities for employment. If he hadn't, he probably would not have discovered his desire to write and illustrate his own books.

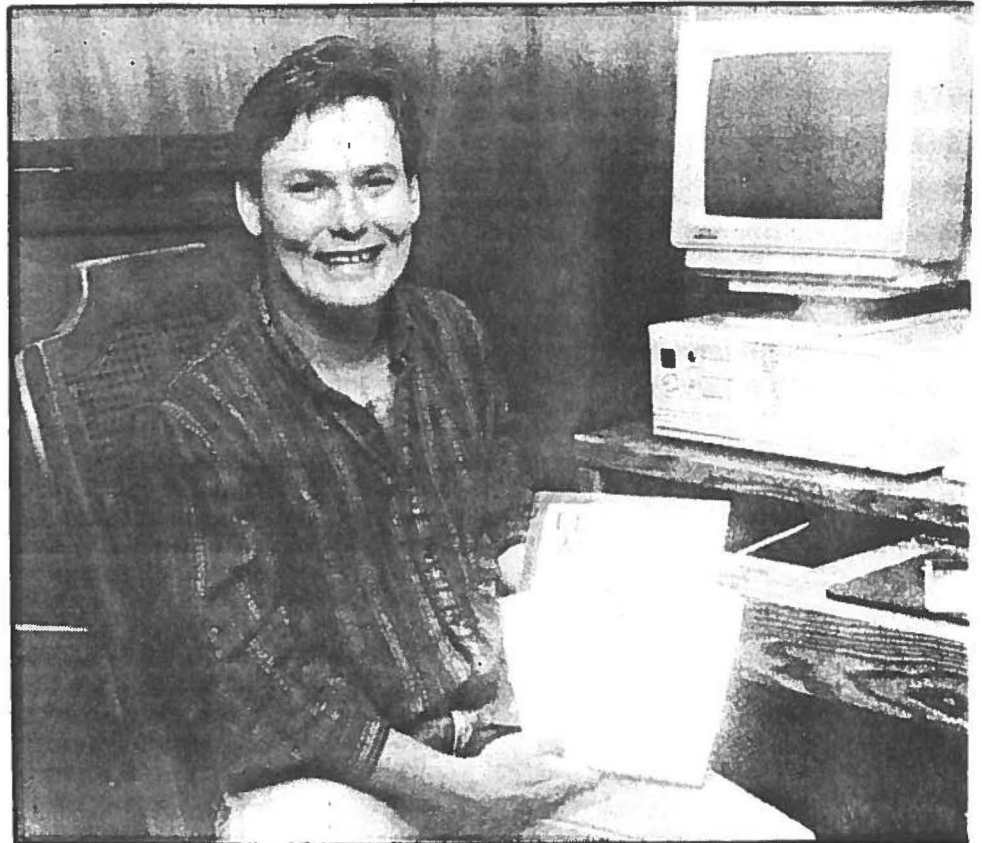
With factory layoffs and cutbacks, there are many men and women in this area looking for employment. Some people are too inhibited to start their business, often because of the risks and expenses.

This didn't stop McCune, who attended the Pittsburgh Art Institute and does freelance artwork and freelance writing on occasion, in his spare time.

"I was a factory worker for 14 years and all of a sudden I didn't have a job...it really hurts," said McCune. "So, I made up my mind that I'd go into a business where I can work on my own and serve the public."

He investigated the various job opportunities and discovered Computer Business Services Inc. (CBSI), an agency that offers unique types of services through specialized software. Personalized Children's Books is one of many specialized software services offered through CBSI and now McCune is offering that service to the public.

The personalized books have about 20 story lines installed into the computer and McCune personalizes each story by incorporating the child's name and other personal information into it. The child is the main character in the finished story.

For example, one story has the personal account of your child's birth...another is a mystery that your child is involved in and solves.

After McCune writes the story, he prints and binds the colorful, illustrated books. All the story books are hardcover with a plastic coating. The book can be personally dedicated and each book comes with a photo sticker to place the child's picture inside the book.

McCune is enthusiastic about his stories. Even though CBSI sets up

the story line, he has found ways to be creative and said he has a great time implementing changes to make the story more interesting and personal for the reader. He has been in business just a few months and said he has gained enough confidence to one day step out and start writing and illustrating his own books. Eventually, he will have that capability, but for now, he's satisfied to use the story lines available through CBSI.

McCune has three children of his own: Michael, 6; Tiffany, 9; and Ka-

sandra, 11. "I love children and I've always based everything I've done around them," McCune said. He said a child will pick up a book written about themselves quicker than any other book.

"It may be the inspiration that starts them to read, when they can read about themselves," said McCune.

CBSI has a variety of specialized software and McCune is already starting to make plans for the other services. His future plan is to set up the software to teach children ages 5-11 how to use a computer properly.

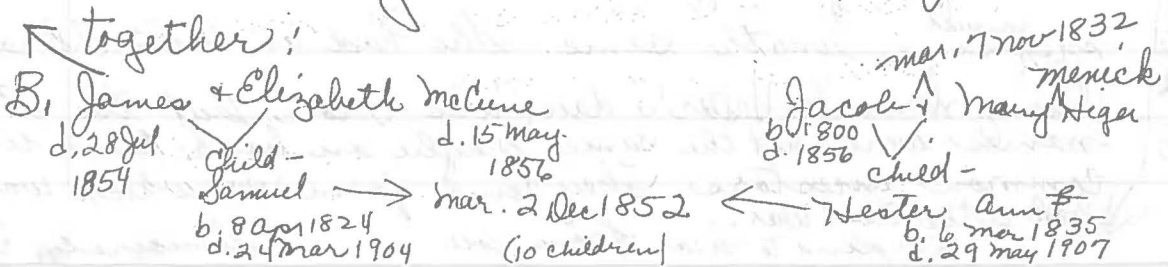
