UNITED STATES SHIP LSM 115

LSM 115 was built by the Brown Shipbuilding Company of Houston, Texas. The keel was laid 21 October 1944; launched 11 November 1944; and commissioned 2 December 1944. Lieutenant Lewis J. Loveland, USNR Commanding.

On 7 December 1944, LSM 115 departed Texas for a shakedown cruise, arriving at the Naval Operating Base, Coco Solo, Panama Canal Zone on 2 January 1945. The ship sailed from Coco Solo and four days later passed through the Panama Canal and arrived in San Diego, California 10 February 1945. LSM 115 departed San Francisco, CA 20 February and sailed for Pearl Harbor, Hawaii arriving 28 February. On 6 March 1945, LSM 115 sailed from Pearl Harbor for Eniwetok, with two Officers and fifteen enlisted men of the 898th Medical Hospital Ship Platten, destination Leyte, Philippine Islands. On 11 March, the ship crossed the International Date Line and arrived at Eniwetok Atoll, Marshall Islands on 16 March. LSM 115 departed three days later, arriving at Kossel Passage, Palau Islands on 26 March. LSM 115 sailed from Palau Island to San Pedro Bay, Leyte, arriving 5 April where U.S. Army Personnel disembarked. On 17 April, LSM 115 departed Leyte and steamed for Manila, arriving 20 April where LCMs' were unloaded. LSM 115 departed Manila 3 days later and arrived back at Leyte on the 26th. After two more trips between Manila Bay and Leyte, LSM 115 headed for Guadalcanal. The ship crossed the Equator 31, May and Neptune Rex held court and dealt out punishment to all "Pollywogs" on board. LSM 115 reported at Guadalcanal 8 June 1945. On 9 June the ship arrived at Banika Island, Russell Islands where it received 34 U.S. Marines, from the 32nd Marine Dep. Co. for transportation to Saipan. LSM 115 arrived in Saipan, Marianas on 27 June, then set sail for Guam. After a trip back to Saipan, the ship sailed for Leyte where U.S. Army Personnel were embarked and 110 U.S. Navy enlisted personnel were taken on board for transportation to Okinawa. The ship arrived at Okinawa 1 September, where all passengers were disembarked and 33 U.S. Navy "Seabees" came on board for transportation to Guam. The "Seabees" disembarked on 19 September and the ship sailed for China, arriving Tku, China 30 September. LSM 115 departed China 11 October and sailed for San Francisco. LSM 115 was transferred to Mare Island for decommissioning 19 June 1946. LSM 115 was sold for scrap.

ROBERT WAYNE SCHWORM USNR S/1C

June 2, 1944, reported for active duty at the United States Naval Training Center, Great Lakes, Illinois. June 3, 1944, commenced "Boot Training" in Camp Greenbay, Company 1263-23 Regiment. I was also with classmates, from Newcomerstown, Ohio High School, class of 1944: Earl Egler, Leo Fenton, Archie Fletcher, Bayliss Guy, Harold Hannahs, Howard Rogers, John Ray Smith, Ray Cramlet, and Bob Alexander from Cambridge, Ohio. July 19, 1944: "Boot Training" ended and I proceeded to Newcomerstown for a 9 day leave. I reported, back from leave, to "Outgoing Unit" at Great Lakes on July 28th. August 2, 1944, departed Great Lakes by rail and traveled to Little Creek, Virginia along with a classmate John Ray Smith arriving on August 5th. I was then transferred to Portsmouth Navy Yards, Group "C" St Helena, Virginia. On September 5th I was transferred to Receiving Station at Little Creek, Virginia. I visited my brother Roland and his wife Alicia during that time. September 6th, I commenced Amphibious training: Unit 824-Crew 7296. I also went to Quartermaster and Signalman School. October 14th: completed Amphibious Training and received a 72 hour pass and went home to Newcomerstown. Reported back to Little Creek and went on board the USS LSM 209 for a training cruise in the Chesapeake Bay, Delaware River, and the Atlantic Ocean. The waters were very rough and most of the crew was sea sick. November 1, 1944: Completed training cruise and reported to Little Creek, Virginia. Departed Little Creek on November 3rd, by troop train, for Houston, Texas. When going through New Orleans, Louisiana the rail cars were put on barges to cross the Mississippi River. They would not allow the train to pass across the railroad bridge because of the threat of sabotage. November 6, 1944, I arrived at Houston, Texas Receiving Station for LSM Crews at Camp Wallace, Texas.

December 1, 1944: I went aboard the ship T.C.I. LSM 115 at Houston, Texas. The USS LSM 115 was built by Brown Ship Building Company of Houston, Texas. Its keel was laid on 21 October 1944, launched 11 November 1944 and commissioned 2 December 1944. Lieutenant Lewis J. Loveland USNR Commanding. December 7, 1944, LSM 115 departed Texas for a

shakedown cruise in the Gulf of Mexico, the cruise was over on the 24th and I spent Christmas at a private home in Houston sponsored by the U.S.O. December 27th the ship sailed for Panama and arrived at Coco Solo, Canal Zone on January 2, 1945. On January 6th the ship passed through the Panama Canal arriving at San Diego, California on January 18th and I went on liberty to Tijuana, Mexico. February 2nd, LSM 115 sailed for San Francisco arriving on February 4th. The ship then went to Oakland, CA and I went to visit Alicia Schworm and her family. February 20, the ship sailed for Pearl Harbor, Hawaii and arrived on the 28th. March 5, 1945 LSM 115 sailed from Pearl Harbor for Eniwetok, Marshall Islands with two officers and fifteen enlisted men of the 898th Medical Hospital Ship Platoon; destination Leyte, Philippine Islands. March 11, 1945 the ship crossed the International Date Line and arrived at Eniwetok on 16 March. On the 22nd the ship sailed for Palau Islands, Caroline Chain and arrived at Kassel Passage, Palau Islands on the 26th. April 2, 1945 LSM 115 sailed from Palau Islands to San Pedro Bay in the Philippines arriving on 5 April and disembarked U.S. Army Personnel. During this time, my brother, Lorin Schworm, who was stationed there saw the ship beached, and came on board and we had a good visit. April 17th, the ship sailed for Manila and arrived on the 20th and unloaded LCMs, then back to Leyte on the 26th and again to Manila on 12 May. Again, back to Leyte on the 20th.

27 May 1945: LSM 115 sailed for Guadalcanal, Russell Islands. The ship crossed the Equator on May 31 and Neptune Rex held court and all "Pollywogs" were initiated, as custom, to become "Shellbacks." June 3rd the ship received an "S.O.S." from a Merchant ship that went down off Admiralty Islands and the ship changed course to pick up survivors, but they were picked up by LSTs that were in the vicinity. The ship arrived at Guadalcanal on 8 June 1945. The ship moved to Florida Islands, Banika Islands fro refueling and picked up 34 Marines from the 32nd Marine Depot Company for transportation to Saipan. It was then to Eniwetok and on 23 June the ship sailed to Guam, while underway the destination was altered and the ship sailed to Saipan. June 18th ship sailed for Guam and arrived on the 19th. July 30 ship sailed for Saipan arriving on the 31st.

11 August 1945: The ship sailed for Leyte and received word, while at sea, the war was over. The ocean, that day, was as smooth as glass, not a ripple, on the surface, as far as one could see, it was the only time that I ever saw it like that. The ship arrived at Leyte on 16 August where U.S. Army Personnel were disembarked and 110 U.S. Navy enlisted men came on board for transportation to Okinawa. 1 September 1945, the ship sailed for Okinawa and arrived on the 6th where personnel were disembarked and 33 U.S. Navy Seabees came on board for transportation to Guam. September 12, 1945 the ship sailed for Guam and rode out a Hurricane, that damaged Hiroshima and Okinawa, for 4 days. The ship was badly damaged, split seam in aft steering. Arrived at Guam on the 19th and disembarked the Seabees. On the 20th the ship sailed for Okinawa and arrived on the 25th. During one of the trips I visited with John Ray Smith on the LSM 213 that had been damaged by a Kamikaze plane. September 26th the ship sailed for Taku, China and exploded six mines in Yellow Sea and arrived on the 30th. October 9th sailed for Tsingtao, China and then Tangku, China arriving on 2 November 1945. On the 10th the ship sailed up the Har Ho River to Tientsin, China carrying 800 bags of mail. 24 November the ship sailed for Jinsen, Korea and arrived on the 26th. Then it was back to Guam and arriving on 8 December 1945. 10 December 1945: I was transferred from "Super Mouse," LSM 115 to the LST 653. The LSM 115 sailed for the United States on 11 December. I was a Bakers and a Cooks Helper on the LSM 115.

USS LST 653

11 December 1945: LST 653 sailed for Truk, Caroline Islands and arrived on the 14th, it then moved to Dublin to pick up 500 Japanese POWs for transportation to Japan, sailing for Yokohoma, Japan soon after and arriving on 26 December. February 3, 1946; Ist 653 decommissioned in Yokosuka Japan. I was transferred to the LST 1055 for further orders. 7 February 1946; I received orders to go to China and I went on board the USS Lubbock, APA 197, that was anchored in Yokohoma, for transportation to China. While on liberty, in Yokohoma, I ran into Bayliss Guy, a Newcomerstown High School mate, and we had a good time. 8 March, sailed for Shanghai, China, but changed course and proceeded to Tsingtao arriving on the 12th and went on board the LST 774. 13 March 1946 sailed for Taku, China on the LST 774 to pick up ship LCI 630. March 16, 1946, I departed LST 774 and went on board ARG 4 to await the LCI 630, it was very cold and the Yellow sea was rough. When I climbed up the side of the ARG 4, Gene Hootman from Newcomerstown helped me aboard. We had a good visit and we both soon picked up LCI 630 in Taku.

December 7, 1944 - I left Texas for a Shakedown Cruise in the Gulf of Mexico.

December 27, 1944 - I sailed for Panama and arrived at Coco Solo, Canal Zone on January 2, 1945.

WHEN I WAS IN THE NAVY SERVING IN THE AMPHIBIOUS GROUP ON A LSM-115 (LAND SHIP MEDIUM) MY MOTHER SENT ME A CLIPPING FROM THE NEWCOMERSTOWN NEWS TELLING ME THAT MY BROTHER, **LORIN SCHWORM**, HAD BEEN TO SEE THE GRAVE OF **CHARLES OLSON**, ALSO A NEWCOMERSTOWN NATIVE WHO HAD BEEN KILLED IN ACTION. THIS TOLD ME LORIN WAS IN THE PHILIPPINE AREA.

IN APRIL, 1945, WE BEACHED ON LEYTE ISLAND IN THE PHILIPPINES. I WAS A SHIP BAKER AND BAKED AT NIGHT. THEY AWAKENED ME EARLY IN THE MORNING AND TOLD ME MY BROTHER WAS THERE TO SEE ME. OF COURSE, I DID NOT BELIEVE THEM. **LORIN** RECOGNIZED MY SHIP NUMBER FROM CORRESPONDING WITH OUR MOTHER AND HAD SEEN THE SHIP BEACH AND CAME ABOARD. WE HAD A GOOD VISIT, AND LATER I WENT ASHORE AND STAYED A COUPLE OF DAYS AT HIS ARMY CAMP.

IN SEPTEMBER, 1945, WE WERE AT OKINAWA AFTER THE WAR WHEN I SAW **JOHN RAY SMITH** WHO WAS SERVING ON A LSM-213. JOHN AND I AND SEVEN OTHER CLASS MATES FROM THE CLASS OF 1944 HAD ALL BEEN AT GREAT LAKES NAVAL TRAINING CENTER TOGETHER. WE HAD A NICE, LONG VISIT.

IN DECEMBER, 1945, I WAS TRANSFERRED TO A LST (LANDING SHIP TANK). I WAS ON THIS SHIP UNTIL FEBRUARY, 1946, AND IT WAS THEN DECOMMISSIONED AND GIVEN TO THE JAPANESE NAVY.

WHILE WAITING TO BE TRANSFERRED AGAIN, I WAS ON LIBERTY IN YOKOHONA, JAPAN. WHEN I WAS WALKING DOWN THE STREET THERE, I MET **BAYLISS GUY** WHO HAD BEEN IN OUR CLASS AND OUTFIT AT GREEN BAY. WE HAD A GOOD TIME TOGETHER.

I WAS TRANSFERRED TO A LCI-630 (LANDING CRAFT INFANTRY). WE WERE THEN TAKEN ABOARD AN ARG-4 IN THE CHINA SEA TO WAIT FOR THE SHIP.

WHEN I CLIMBED UP THE LADDER AND GOT ON THE SHIP I MET **GENE HOOTMAN**, ALSO A NEWCOMERSTOWN NATIVE. WE ALSO HAD A GOOD VISIT.

IT IS A COINCIDENCE TO MEET ANYONE FROM HOME HALF A WORLD AWAY, AND I HAD MET MY **BROTHER**, **TWO FELLOW CLASSMATES**, AND ANOTHER **NEWCOMERSTOWN RESIDENT**.

Family awarded flag for service during World War

A flag hung for years in the window of the late Elmer and Helen Schworm who lived at Park Hill Drive, Newcomerstown. The flag was unique—it was a small flag and had six stars—but the Schworms were one of the rare families to be presented such a flag; each star represented one of their sons who had served his country in World War II.



SIX SONS SERVED IN WAR



-- IT IS A SMALL WORLD --

WHEN I WAS IN THE NAVY SERVING IN THE AMPHIBIOUS GROUP ON A LSM-115 (LAND SHIP MEDIUM) MY MOTHER SENT ME A CLIPPING FROM THE NEWCOMERSTOWN NEWS TELLING ME THAT MY BROTHER, **LORIN SCHWORM**, HAD BEEN TO SEE THE GRAVE OF **CHARLES OLSON**, ALSO A NEWCOMERSTOWN NATIVE WHO HAD BEEN KILLED IN ACTION. THIS TOLD ME LORIN WAS IN THE PHILIPPINE AREA.

IN APRIL, 1945, WE BEACHED ON LEYTE ISLAND IN THE PHILIPPINES. I WAS A SHIP BAKER AND BAKED AT NIGHT. THEY AWAKENED ME EARLY IN THE MORNING AND TOLD ME MY BROTHER WAS THERE TO SEE ME. OF COURSE, I DID NOT BELIEVE THEM. **LORIN** RECOGNIZED MY SHIP NUMBER FROM CORRESPONDING WITH OUR MOTHER AND HAD SEEN THE SHIP BEACH AND CAME ABOARD. WE HAD A GOOD VISIT, AND LATER I WENT ASHORE AND STAYED A COUPLE OF DAYS AT HIS ARMY CAMP.

IN SEPTEMBER, 1945, WE WERE AT OKINAWA AFTER THE WAR WHEN I SAW **JOHN RAY SMITH** WHO WAS SERVING ON A LSM-213. JOHN AND I AND SEVEN OTHER CLASS MATES FROM THE CLASS OF 1944 HAD ALL BEEN AT GREAT LAKES NAVAL TRAINING CENTER TOGETHER. WE HAD A NICE, LONG VISIT.

IN DECEMBER, 1945, I WAS TRANSFERRED TO A LST (LANDING SHIP TANK). I WAS ON THIS SHIP UNTIL FEBRUARY, 1946, AND IT WAS THEN DECOMMISSIONED AND GIVEN TO THE JAPANESE NAVY.

WHILE WAITING TO BE TRANSFERRED AGAIN, I WAS ON LIBERTY IN YOKOHONA, JAPAN. WHEN I WAS WALKING DOWN THE STREET THERE, I MET **BAYLISS GUY** WHO HAD BEEN IN OUR CLASS AND OUTFIT AT GREEN BAY. WE HAD A GOOD TIME TOGETHER.

I WAS TRANSFERRED TO A LCI-630 (LANDING CRAFT INFANTRY). WE WERE THEN TAKEN ABOARD AN ARG-4 IN THE CHINA SEA TO WAIT FOR THE SHIP.

WHEN I CLIMBED UP THE LADDER AND GOT ON THE SHIP I MET **GENE HOOTMAN**, ALSO A NEWCOMERSTOWN NATIVE. WE ALSO HAD A GOOD VISIT.

IT IS A COINCIDENCE TO MEET ANYONE FROM HOME HALF A WORLD AWAY, AND I HAD MET MY **BROTHER**, **TWO FELLOW CLASSMATES**, AND ANOTHER **NEWCOMERSTOWN RESIDENT**.

When Wayne took his brother Lorin to the hospital


They tried to keep him instead

At the beginning of her ghth grade year she came to ewcomerstown Junior High. graduated ewcomerstown in May 1952. She worked for a local attorey for a short while. While opping one day she ran into old schoolmate, Marjorie arding Stahl, who told her mes B. Clow & Sons ompany was looking for a sectary - one who knew shorthand. She applied on Wednesday and on Thursday morning she recieved a call from their personnel manager telling her the job was hers providing she passed the physical by their company doctor (who at that time was Dr. Agricola) on Friday. She started to work the following Monday, Oct. 6, 1952.

Mary Ann Schworm, Flange Sales Secretary, is retiring effective February 1, 2004. Due to vacation earned, her last day will be December 16, 2003.


