Christmas Day murder parallelec

W.W. Scott, editor of the shiftless Iron Valley Reporter at Dover, drunk by was spending Christmas Day 1890 with his family when word reached him of a murder in southern Tuscarawas Coun-

Scott, a zealous newsman. immediately went to the train station to see if the telegrapher had definite word of what had happened. When he found out that a murder had indeed occurred near the town of Post Boy, south of Newcomerstown, Scott boarded the next train leaving Dover and arrived at Post Boy around 5 o'clock.

Scott secured a cart and a driver, and then drove through a blinding snow and sleet storm to the scene of the murder, the old John Booth homestead, about a mile and a half east of Post Boy.

Scott went inside and found the body of the murder victim. James Booth, 33, lying on a "cooling board" in the front parlor. The newspaper editor questioned the residents of the home and found out what had happened.

room with a man named Henry Wherli. 31, an iron ore miner who boarded with the family. Wherli was a Swiss immigrant whose father edited a Germanlanguage newspaper at New Philadelphia.

Booth and Wherli soon began trading insults. Wherli went across the hall to his room and got a gun. They traded more insults through Booth's locked bedroom door before Wherli finally went to

Booth sat up all night drinking. The next morning, he walked across the hall to Wherli's room, kicked the bed-

come down to breakfast. Wher- it from him to kill him with it: a li told Booth to go away or he and that in the scuffle it acciwould shoot Booth. Booth kicked the door again and then ran down the stairs and out of the house.

Wherli came out of his room with the loaded gun. Wherli opened the hall window and fired a shot at Booth, who was standing outside in front of the house. Wherli missed Booth.

Booth then ran around back and into the kitchen, where he met his aunt, Mary Hart, who kept house for the family. Booth went into the downstairs hall, and shouted more threats up at Wherli. His aunt persuaded Booth to go into the dining room and eat breakfast. and then leave before Wherli came downstairs. Booth did as his aunt asked him.

But Wherli soon came downstairs with the loaded gun and went into the dining room. Wherli later testified "that Booth stood facing him before the fireplace (some 12 feet away and with a table between them), that Booth dashed at him and grabbed the gun by James Booth, described as a room door and told Wherli to the muzzle and tried to wrench ing at the Booth Tayern, oper-v

dentally went off, and that e Booth just sank down." There \ were no witnesses to the shooting.

Immediately after the killing. Wherli went back to his c room, got some money and a c quart of whiskey from his r trunk, and then started off t with his gun.

Wherli was captured at e Cambridge on Dec. 30 and i. brought to the Tuscarawas c County Jail the following day.

Wherli's trial, the 16th murder trial in Tuscarawas County v history, began May 19, 1891.

The local newspapers gave a detailed coverage of the trial. They were fond of pointing out fi the numerous parallels be- t tween the Wherli trial and that n of John Funston, who was convicted of murdering a mail car- v rier in southern Tuscarawas County in 1825.

parents. And James Edie, an elderly man who served on the Wherli jury, was the son of a man who had served on the Funston jury.

'Wherli's trial lasted eight days. Among the witnesses called was W.W. Scott, the newspaper editor. Wherli's attorneys called Scott in an effort to prove that Scott's coverage of the case had made it impossible for Wherli to receive a fair trial. They were unsuccessful.

The jury retired to render a verdict around 4 o'clock on May 27, and reached a verdict at 5 o'clock the next morning. The jury found Wherli guilty of first-degree murder. Among the members of the jury was my great-great-grandfather, William D. Logan of Uhrichs-

After the verdict had been rendered, James Edie sat down and cried like a child. Wherli was the first person convicted of first-degree murder in Tuscarawas County in 66 years. The last person convicted was John Funston.

In June, Judge John S. Pearce sentenced Wherli to be hanged in the Ohio Penitentiary at Columbus.

Wherli appealed the verdict, but the Ohio Supreme Court refused to interfere. Then, in October 1892, the Ohio Board of Pardons commuted Wherli's sentence to life in prison. The board recommended the pardon on the grounds that there was great provocation, a doubt whether there was premeditation and a doubt whether there was a fair trial, because one of the jurors said before he went on the jury that he would hang Wherli.

After Wherli received word that his life had been spared. he told the prison chaplain, "I never took much stock in religion until I was brought within the shadow of the gallows, but I believe my prayer was answered."

A few years later, the governor pardoned Wherli and he was a free man again.

The James Booth home

A fine example of a mid-19th century farmhouse is the James Booth home on Church Hill Road in Wheeling Township.

Deed records show that James Booth purchased 80 acres of land in 1849 from Abraham Foster for \$1,000. The money used to purchase the land came from a \$1,600 dowry received from his marriage to Elizabeth Harris on March 4, 1847. The remaining \$600 was used to construct the brick farmhouse around 1850.

The farmhouse was built along traditional lines incorporating into its character various ornamental details of the Greek Revival period. The house was L-shaped in its original plan.

James and his wife had four children: Samantha, wife of Anderson Gibb; Eliza, wife of William Porter; John; and Amanda, wife of Zachariah McDonald.

Elizabeth died around 1855 and James remarried on Jan. 31, 1856, to Mary Ann Ray.

James and his second wife were the parents of the following children: George; Albert R.; Thomas; James Milton; Jasper; Martha, wife of Mr. Little; and Mary Jane. Two of their children, James Milton and Jasper, were twins.

As time went on James added to his estate, eventually controlling upwards of 700 acres.

Despite his lack of schooling, he was a prominent stock farmer shipping cattle on a regular basis to markets in Pittsburgh. The size of James Booth's holdings are exemplified by the fact that he gave each of his six sons 120 acres and each of his five daughters a sum of approximately \$2,200 and livestock.

After James' death in 1901 the farm passed to his son Milton, who died at an early age in 1907. Next, the farm was run by his sister, Mary Jane, and Jasper Little. Later the home passed to Frank Booth, a grand-son of James Booth, who lived in the house until his death in the 1970s.

The farm is now owned by Earl Weinzimmer.

Over the years the house has been minimally altered.


This home is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

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
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

Methodist Comp Meeting conducted in 1829 by Rev. Thomas

CHAPTER FOUR

In a Methodist Camp Meeting conducted in 1829, by Rev. Thomas M. Hudson, and held in a grove on the farm of Thomas Dickerson, Short Creek, Harrison County, there were many conversions witnessed. Five young men converts of that harvest later became ministers, one of whom was Matthew Simpson. This tall, lean young man, native of Cadiz, was to become known far and wide as the "Patrick Henry of American Methodism." Matthew Simpson was self-educated, and began preaching as a circuit rider when he was scarcely past twenty years of age. After years of such itinerancy, he became president of what is now De Pauw University, Greencastle, Indiana, and later editor of "The Christian Advocate," the leading Methodist periodical of that time. In the General Conference of 1852, held in Boston, he was elected a Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and in that position served during the period of the Civil War, and until his death in 1884.

It is traditional that, during the awful war years, President Abraham Lincoln called Bishop Simpson to Washington many times that he might have conference and prayer with this holy man from the hills of Ohio. It is said that Lincoln's decision to issue the famous Emancipation Proclamation came immediately following one of these long and deeply devotional meetings with the Bishop.

When at last Lincoln's martyr life had issued in his martyr death, the one called upon to deliver the funeral oration and eulogy, on May 4, 1865, in Oak Ridge Cemetery, Springfield, Illinois, was that same true friend from Cadiz, Ohio, — Bishop Matthew Simpson.

* * *

A "Voice in the Wilderness," a Voice by the wayside of all the crooked and steep roads and trails, lanes, paths and by-paths of the Buckeye hills, this Voice has long continued to issue the command, "Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight."

Tragedy Under a Hillside Oak

The post boy murder which gave a little town its name.

A quiet little place on the hillside, two homes and a tiny frame schoolhouse on the sharp turn in the gravel road four miles south-east of Newcomerstown is all a casual passerby would note today, but this hamlet in the hills has an odd name, and upon that name, Post-Boy, hangs a tale which is famous in the lore of the Ohio hills. The present population may be about a half-dozen souls, but it had better days, for there was a time within the last fifty-five or sixty years when the place had a big lumber trade. In those years there was a store there, and several comfortable homes, with a busy little station house along side the C. & M. (Cleveland and Marietta) single-track railroad. All that prosperity has vanished long ago, with the denuding of the hillsides and the silence of the sawmills which had produced its boom.

During the gory years of World War II hundreds of G.I.'s, their bodies swathed in bandages or locked in casts, finished out the last lap of their long trek from Guadalcanal or Luxembourg, from Normandy or Iwo, on the little railroad that runs by way of Post-Boy from Newcomerstown to Cambridge and the Fletcher General Military Hospital. But trains do not stop at Post-Boy and automobiles hardly dare to, since the grade through the town is so steep and mighty treacherous on icy days.

A little more than a mile from Post-Boy on the narrow country road leading toward Freeport and Cadiz stands the sturdy old Booth Tavern, a brick two-story building whose old fireplaces and high ceilings speak of the architectural fancies of more than a century ago, for the present building was erected in 1857 by John Booth, uncle of Mrs. Elva Booth Little, who with her aged husband occupied the home until the time of Mrs. Little's death in the early 1940's. Tradition has it that a man named Wehrle murdered one of the Booth family in a room of the present building sometime in the late 1800's. Just a little east of where the present structure stands was the site of the original Booth Tavern.

In the early years of the nineteenth century live stock had to be floated to market on the rivers or taken overland on foot by drovers. A drover, having completed his journey with his stock, would ride on horseback the long way home over the lonely hills carry in his saddle-



This cemetery was located approximately 1/2 mile north of Birds Run. Wheeling Twp., Guernsey County. Ohio, and was destroyed in one of the fouds that took place back in the hills in an early day. The headstones were carried across the street and used for stepping stones around the house and well. This site is now in the flood plain of the Wills Creek water district. Just to the south of the location is a ditch which runs at right angles to the road. Some stones are to be found in the ditch.
