

Our ancestor, Anthony Cunard, was a Hessian soldier in the American Revolution. For a fascinating account of the Hessian's part in the war, read "The Baroness and the General" by Louise Hall Tharp. Prepared from the diary of their commanding general's wife.

Anthony Cunard settled in Philadelphia, later sending for his sister who married an Episcopalian minister. Anthony had acquired some property in central Philadelphia, leaving it to his sister to look after when he moved to Brownsville, Pa. In ~~1819~~ 1819, since his health was failing, he walked back to Philadelphia to see about his interest in this property. He found both his sister and her husband had died, and the church had taken over the property. Walking home he became ill, living until February, 1819. He is buried in Red Stone Cemetery, near Brownsville, Pa. ⁷ Born, Aug. 27, 1743.

His wife was Anne Wheatly, daughter of William Wheatley, Aug. 24, 1737 - Jan. 8, 1817 and Anne Warren, June 15, 1739-May 29, 1814. They were married in ~~1759, in Fayette Co., Pa.~~ *Nov. 5, 1760 Darlington County, N.C.*

Anne Wheatly and Anthony Cunard were married in 1791. He was still wearing his red British uniform when he first saw her going to the spring for water at Elizabeth N. J.

Their children were Elizabeth, 7-13-'792; John, 9 10, '94; William, 10-16-'96; Nancy, 11-3-1798; Joseph, 4-20-1801; Jonathan, 4-3-'04; Jane, 6-29-'06; Sarah, 12-5-'08; Rebecca, 12-5-'11.

Sarah Cunard and James Pilling were married Oct. 20, 1831. *Redstone, Pa*

May 8-1803 - May 10, 1879
Lord James Pilling was the son of Richard Pilling 1782-1858 and Anne Pilling 1782-1859, and was born in Lancashire, England. He went to school until old enough to work in a mill and then began working, and attended night school. He came to the U.S. in 1827 with his loom-mate, James Hamer, landing in Philadelphia, where, according to one of the stories handed down they saw their first tomatoes, then called "love apples." They finally settled in Fayette Co., Pa., both working in a woolen factory, first Cook's factory at Red Stone, later at Amity Mills. James Pilling came to Ohio in 1840 to see the farm he'd seen advertised. Bought it from an agent at Steubenville, and moved the family here ~~##~~ Feb. 29, 1841. *Moved to Newcom - Feb 28, 1841*

Children of Richard Pilling in England in addition to James were Joseph, Lord, Ephraim; Anne (Ashworth), Mary Anne (Nuttall), Naomi (Sutcliff) shipped to Australia from debtor's prison, Ellen (Spencer) and Edward.

James and Sarah Cunard Pilling's children were Anne, 5-10-1833; Rebecca, 8-22-35; Ellen, 9-22-37; Sabine, 6-7-40; twins Margaret and Edward 1-14-43; Edwin, 5-15-46; Mariah, 6-24-47 and Thomas Benton, 9-29-50.

James Pilling's second marriage was to Zelinda E. Thompson, July 3, 1866 Her husband had been killed in the Civil War. They had one son, Richard Lord Pilling, born 1868. He finally lived in Louisville, Ky., and had two daughters, Alice and Mildred.

Dear Mrs. Gosnell:

The name Cunard is so seldom seen that recently when I read of the death of your brother at Barnesville, I saved the obituary, hoping to establish contact with some member of the Cunard family.

I too, am a Cunard descendant and for a number of years our branch of the family has been trying to trace back some of the very interesting history that has been handed down to us. In writing to you I am hoping to learn whether some of these stories may have come down through your father's family also. Perhaps he would have been told facts not known in our family.

My great-grandmother was Sarah Cunard Pilling and her parents were Anthony Cunard and Anne Wheatley who were married in 1791 probably in New Jersey. We have always been told that Anthony Cunard was a Hessian soldier who remained in America after the Revolutionary War. He died in 1819 at Redstone, Pa. shortly after returning from Philadelphia to inquire about some property he had owned there along with his sister who was married to an Episcopalian minister. He left the property in her care when he and his family started west. On the trip back to Philadelphia he learned that his sister had died and the church had taken over the property.

Since I have been trying to trace this story recently I have been told by expert genealogists that in all probability Anthony Cunard was a Tory, rather than a Hessian and so I'm very curious to see if I can learn more about him.

Other members of Anthony and Anne's family #### in addition to my great-grandmother Sarah who was born in 1808 were Elizabeth, 1792; John, 1794; William, 1796; Nancy, 1798; Joseph, 1801; Jonathan, 1804; Jane, 1806 and Rebecca, 1811. In some of the early records the name is spelled Cunnard. The three youngest girls settled in this area, with Jane marrying James Nargney at Port Washington and Rebecca marrying Thomas Benton who was a partner with my great-grandfather, James Pilling in operating a woolen mill.

Surely your father was descended from one of Anthony Cunard's sons and I'm hoping that you have some of this family history to share with me. I hope you will forgive me for intruding on you at this time, but I shall look forward to hearing from you, or if not, perhaps from some one of your Cunard relatives who might find this information interesting. Incidentally, Anthony Cunard's widow, Anne, died here at Newcomerstown and was buried in the pioneer cemetery.

Dear Miss Abbott:

Thank you so very much for your interesting letter which came on a dreary day, bringing fresh impetus to a very amateur genealogist. I have decided that one of the nicest things about Yankee Magazine is the way in which queries keep on working years after they've been published. So far, these have been much more productive than queries I've also had published in the Genealogical Helper to which I subscribe.

First I shall tell you the story as handed down in my maternal grandmother's family, and then share with you the information I've recently acquired.

My great-great-grandfather's name was Anthony Cunard and he was said to have been a Hessian soldier. 27, Aug. 1748--7 Feb., 1819. He and Anne Wheatly 10-Sept. 1768--27 Nov. 1850 were married in 1791. The story goes that he was still ##### wearing his British uniform when he first saw her going to the spring for water at Elizabeth N. J.

Their children were Elizabeth 13 July, 1792; John 10 Sept. 1794; William 16 Oct. 1796; Nancy 3 Nov., 17 98; Joseph 20 April 1801; Jonathan 3 April 1804; Jane 29 June 1806; Sarah my great grandmother 5 Dec. 1808 and Rebecca 5 Dec. 1811.

Anthony Cunard and his ##### sister owned property in central Philadelphia. She was married to a minister (my records say Episcopalian tho I never heard her name.) When Anthony Cunard moved on west she was left in charge of their property. Anthony was living at Redstone, Pa., where he died in 1819. Realizing that his health was failing he had made a trip back to Philadelphia to inquire about this property, and learned that both his sister and her husband had died and the church had taken over their holdings. He died shortly after returning home and was buried in Redstone Cemetery near Uniontown.

I won't bore you with my family history further than to say that his widow came with my great-grandparents, James and Sarah Cunard Pilling, to Ohio in 1841, as did Thomas and Rebecca Cunard Benton. Their sister Jane Cunard was married to ~~Walter~~ Nargney and had come to this same area in 1834. I remember hearing my grandmother, Maria Pilling Moore, refer to numerous other Cunard relatives who settled in western Pennsylvania or Ohio.

As a result of seeing a Cunard query in the Gen. Helper back in 1975, I had correspondence with Mrs. Richard H. Stoller, 1811 Preston Dr Columbus, Ga. 31906, who sent me information similar to that you have, and first began questioning our Anthony's identity as a Hessian soldier. And I seem to have been growing more confused about it, ever since. Now I haven't heard from Mrs. Stoller for a couple of years, due not to lack of interest but just to the fact that both of us were too busy with other things. She is an experienced genealogist and was both patient and generous with me, such a beginner. Her ancestor was Henry Cunard who fought in the Revolution in the Philadelphia County Militia.

I certainly shall follow your suggestion about writing Miss Collins for more information, and shall look forward to hearing from you again when you find time to write. I am enclosing a copy of the computer print-out I received from Salt Lake City and hope you will find it of more value than I have. The search I requested was for early colonial records which they said were incompletely indexed, and federal census records, also incomplete, through 1819. I hope you have better luck

Dear Miss Collins:

Recently I received a letter from Miss Charlotte Abbott of Dover, Del. in reply to a query of mine which had been published in Yankee Magazine. In it I was seeking information about the ancestry of my great-great-grandfather, Anthony Cunard.

She wrote me about the Thones Kunders line, suggesting that probably this was the information I needed. But she also said that you had done extensive research and might have answers to some of my questions. A correspondent in Columbus, Ga., also has suggested this may be the proper connection and it was she who first began casting doubt on the story handed down through my maternal grandmother's family that Anthony Cunard had been a Hessian soldier.

The story is that Anthony Cunard first saw Anne Wheatly as she was going to a spring for water near the family home at Elizabeth, N. J. At that time he was still in uniform.

Anthony had a sister who was the wife of an Episcopalian minister and he and the sister owned property in downtown Philadelphia. When he and his family moved west, he left his sister in charge of the property.

He died in February 1819 and is buried in Redstone Cemetery near Uniontown, Pa., his death resulting from a difficult trip he had made back to Philadelphia to inquire about that property. There he had learned that both the sister and her husband had died and the church had taken over their property. It is this tale about the property which lends support to my Georgia correspondent's suggestion that Anthony probably was a Tory, rather than a Hessian. She is a descendant of Henry Cunard's line which traces back to Thones Kunders, and her address is Mrs. Richard H. Stoller, 1811 Preston Dr., Columbus, Ga. 31906.

Recently I subscribed to services of Accelerated Indexing Systems of Salt Lake City, hoping their computers might help me to find Anthony's whereabouts. But the only one listed on the print-out I received was Anthony Conard in Philadelphia County, Pa., in 1800, and as I have been able to ~~###~~ decipher the key to the Federal Census for that period, neither he nor the family he listed would have fit our ancestor.

I am enclosing a copy of my early lineage, in the hope that some names on it may match some of those in your records. And if you have the time and it's not too much trouble, I shall be so very happy to hear from you.

Dear Joan:

Your response to my "Roots Cellar" listing came as a very pleasant surprise, and one I should have liked to answer by the next mail. But since I was involved in too many other things just then, I had to delay until I could give this all my attention. I hope you have not left for your visit to Pennsylvania, for I believe the material I'm sending you will be helpful. Surely we are related.

My Cunard information was "absorbed" from my grandmother whose grandparents were Anthony and Anne Wheatley Cunard. I'm enclosing a chart for you, rather than to repeat all that data in a letter. When I was a child my grandmother frequently went for summer visits with her Cunard relatives around Belle Vernon and Masontown, Pa. The only cousin whose name I remember was Jake Shawman. I have no idea whether that is the correct spelling as I only heard it, rather than seeing it written.

It was only after my mother died eight years ago that I became seriously interested in genealogy and began trying to verify the story handed down through her family that Anthony Cunard had been a Hessian soldier. The story was that he had first seen Anne Wheatley while he was still in uniform and she was going to the spring for water at the family home near Red Bank, N. J.

The end of the story is that he died at Redstone, Pa. in 1819 after having made a trip back to Philadelphia to inquire about property which he and a sister had jointly owned in downtown Philadelphia. She was said to be the wife of a minister and he learned that both had died and the church had taken over their property.

My inquiries, published in Yankee Magazine and the Genealogical Helper brought me much interesting information, but to date yours is the only indication I have established a contact with "my" Cunards. They began at once to point out that Cunard is an English, rather than a German name, and questioned whether Anthony might have been a Tory during the Revolution, rather than a Hessian. And some credence is lent to this theory because of that jointly owned property in Philadelphia, as a Cunard family whose pioneer ancestor Thones Kunders (translated to Anthony Cunard) had founded Germantown, Pa. in 1683.

Last winter I spent a modest amount to hire a genealogist in Philadelphia to see if she could establish any connection between our family and this one, but she was unable to do so. The photocopy I'm sending you came from a man in Colorado from whom I never heard again after writing to thank him for the information he had sent. So I can only assume he is dead.

Thank you so much for writing, and do let me hear from you again.

Many thanks to your April 12 response to my "Roots Cellar" notice. I am deeply interested in the references you have made to Fayette County, Pa., records and should be interested in having you do research if you can establish for me that we are referring to my ancestor, Anthony Cunard whose name might easily have an alternative spelling. He was my g-g-grandfather.

His wife was Anne Wheatley, the daughter of William Wheatley and Anne Warren who were married in 1760 in a Quaker Meeting at Burlington County, N. J.

Since I am not trying to establish a claim to anything, but rather to satisfy a long-held curiosity about Anthony Cunard's origins, I do not feel justified in spending too much on research. I am doubtful, however, that he had any war record, since family tradition always held that he was a Hessian soldier. But the fact that casts doubt on this is that he died at Redstone in 1819 after having made a trip back to Philadelphia to inquire about property in downtown Philadelphia which he owned jointly with a sister. She was the wife of a minister and he learned that both had died and the church had taken over the property.

I have had correspondence with a number of experienced genealogists who suggested that more likely he was a Tory, since Thones Kunders (Tunis or Anthony Cunard) was a founder of Germantown back in the 1600's. I employed a Philadelphia genealogist briefly, but she found nothing about him.

On the basis of what I have written, if you believe we may be talking about the same family, I am willing to spend a modest amount with you for research, perhaps 30 or 40 dollars. But I shall wait to hear from you further.

Dear Mrs. Hunsberger:

Thank you so very much for your interesting letter of Jan. 8. I have decided that one of the nicest things about Yankee is the way in which queries keep on working years after they've been published, for it's a magazine people value and keep passing around.

My Cunard queries in Yankee and in the Genealogical Helper have brought me a number of replies which I suspect may prove to be of more help to you than they have been to me, and I'll gladly share them.

My great-great-grandfather's name was Anthony Cunard and he was said to have been a Hessian soldier; 27, Aug., 1748--7 Feb. 1819. He and Anne Wheatly 10, Sept. 1768 - 27, Nov. 1850 were married in 1791. The story goes that he was still wearing his army uniform when he first saw her going to the spring for water at Elizabeth, N. J.

Their children were Elizabeth 13, July, 1792; John 10, Sept. 1794; William 16 Oct. 1796; Nancy 3 Nov. 1798; Joseph 20, April 1801; Jonathan 3 April 1804; Jane 29 June 1806; Sarah my great grandmother 5 Dec. 1808 and Rebecca 5 Dec. 1811.

Anthony Cunard and his sister owned property in central Philadelphia. She was married to a minister (my records say Episcopalia tho I can't remember ever having heard her name.) When Anthony moved on west she was left in charge of their property. Anthony was living at Redstone, Pa. when he realized that his health was failing and he made a trip back to Philadelphia to inquire about this property. He learned that both his sister and her husband had died and the church had taken over their holdings. He died shortly after returning home and was buried in Redstone Cemetery near Uniontown.

I won't bore you with my family history further than to say that his widow came with my great-grandparents -- James and Sarah Cunard Pilling -- to Ohio in 1841, as did Thomas and Rebecca Cunard Benton. Their sister Jane Cunard was married to Milton Margney and had come to this area in 1834. I remember hearing my grandmother, Maria Pilling Moore, refer to numerous other Cunard relatives who settled in western Pennsylvania and Ohio.

As the result of my Cunard query in the Genealogical Helper I have had some interesting correspondence with Mrs. Richard H. Stoller, 1811 Preston Dr., Columbus, Ga. 31906 who first began questioning whether our Anthony might not have been a Tory rather than a Hessian. Her line traces back to Henry Cunard who fought in the Revolution in the Philadelphia County Militia.

I have had correspondence with several others, all of whom trace back to Thones Kunders who helped found Germantown, Pa. in 1683, but so far nobody has been able to connect our Anthony with that line. One of the most exciting prospects developed last summer when one day I suddenly got a lengthy phone call from Erik P. Conard out in Colorado who had seen my Gen. Helper query. He then wrote me, saying he was increasingly convinced my Anthony was descended from the same line as his own. After that he phoned me again and I sent him the

information he requested. And I haven't heard a word from him since!
But I keep hoping.

However I am going to copy for you the chart he sent me which I found extremely interesting. He told me in one of our phone conversations that family history included a story about the son and daughter of Henry having inherited property from an uncle and this, he assumed, might be the Philadelphia property to which I referred. Several of my correspondents have pointed out that some of the family which by then were using lots of different spellings, remained loyal to the king and so were identified as Tories.

I feel if I were only a skilled novelist, there is the basis for a good historical novel in my puzzle about Anthony. I shall always regret that I didn't begin uncovering all this interesting speculation until after my 97-year-old mother died seven years ago. Whenever she felt she needed to apologize for a contentious attitude she'd invariably conclude with, "But you know my great-grandfather was a Hessian!"

Please let me hear from you again.

A story handed down in the Pilling family and reported by me in a letter to Erik P. Conard of Arvada, Colorado, provides the missing link to establish our identity as descendants of Thones (translates to Anthony or Dennis) Kunders.

He was head of one of the 13 Quaker families in Krefeld, Germany who responded to William Penn's invitation, emigrated on the Sailing Ship Concord and arrived in October 1683 to found Germantown, Pa.

Thones Kunders and his wife Elin Tison (or Streypers) had four sons. To date the Colorado researchers have located 1,716 male descendants. Of these, 1,289 spell the name CONARD; 296 spell it CUNARD; 66, CONRAD; 60, CONNARD and 6, CUNNARD. There are thousands of female descendants, one of whom was our great-grandmother, SARAH CUNARD PILLING.

This is our line of descent: Thones Kunders had a son, Cunraed Cunraeds; he had a son, Henry; he had a son, Anthony who married Anne (Nancy) Wheatley, and their daughter, Sarah, married James Pilling and became the great-grandmother of my generation.

The family story was that Anthony Cunard died in February 1819 at Redstone, Pa., after walking back to Philadelphia, Pa. to inquire about property which he and his sister jointly owned in the downtown area. He had left his share in her care when he and his family moved to western Pennsylvania. She was the wife of a minister. He learned that both his sister and her husband had died and the church had taken over their property.

The connecting link uncovered by Athlyn Luzier of Colorado Springs, Co., is in the will of Joseph Conard, an unmarried of Henry Cunders. It was signed March 12, 1798 and probated in Chester County, Pa. May 28, 1800. In it he left L40 to the two children of Henry, with L15 to be paid to Anthony and L25 to Elizabeth, further providing that on her death her share should be equally divided between her three daughters, Hannah, Anne and Rachel Bell.

It had always been said that "our" Anthony was a Hessian soldier, but the genealogists suggest he may have been a Tory, or that, as a Quaker, he was a non-combatant. However an account in a history of (as I remember) Fayette County, Pa., tells that Sarah Cunard Pilling's grandfather was a captain of light cavalry who enlisted in New Jersey and served throughout the Revolutionary War. It continues "Anthony Cummard, an early settler in Franklin, married one of Capt. Wheatley's daughters. She used to tell how, during the battle of Trenton, she sat in the Wheatley mansion when a cannon ball tore its way through the house. Anthony Cummard himself fought through the Revolution and shared in the victory at Yorktown."

All this information is contained in THE CONARD ANCESTRY compiled by Athlyn Luzier in cooperation with Erik Conard. She is devoting all her time, energy and apparently her finances to tracing down ALL the descendants of all four of Thones Kunders' sons, and she doesn't use a computer!

While I was able to provide her with much information about the families of Sarah Cunard Pilling and her sisters, Jane Nargney and Rebecca Benton, she is now busily tracking down the families of their siblings: Elizabeth, John, William, Nancy, Joseph and Jonathan. So far she has found a number of the descendants of John and Jonathan, and paid her second visit to us about a month ago.

I first put a price on the head of one of my great-great-grandfathers about 40 years ago when I was a Sunday columnist for the Canton Repository and a report came out of Germany regarding a find made by American Occupation forces. This is what I wrote:

"That unpleasantness involving American Army personnel and the jewels belonging to the House of Hesse has been interesting far beyond mere legal aspects of the case. For the thought of uncovering a lead casket of jewels in an old wine cellar carries with ^{it} a decided tinge of Arabian Nights or Grimm's Fairy Tales.

"My interest in the case was entirely impersonal until a few days ago when I read that the fortune in precious stones had had its foundation in those troops sold by the Hessians to the British to help them fight the American Revolutionary War.

"Since then, due to the fact I missed by some 100 years the privilege of knowing my great-great-grandfather personally, I have without too great a feeling of irreverance, been able to visualize him as one of the finer stones in the collection.

"His name was Anthony Cunard and family history indicates that aside from having been a Hessian soldier with fiery red hair, he was not too much of a diamond in the rough. When the war ended he stayed in America and married a pretty girl in New Jersey whom he had first seen, one day, as she went to a spring for water.

"The Encyclopedia Britannica says that the Hessians collected around 3,191,000 pounds sterling for the 22,000 mercenary troops they sent to America. That would have made each one worth 145 pounds or, at par, \$704.

"Considering the time that has elapsed and figuring Great-Great-Grandfather Cunard at only a nominal rate of interest, it soon becomes apparent that today in cold dollars and cents, he's probably worth much more than his average descendant."

Unfortunately, most of us don't get really interested in genealogy until we're too old to do much about it and those who could have answered our questions are long gone. About 15 years ago I began trying to trace Anthony Cunard's roots. It's been frustrating!

A query in Yankee Magazine brought astonishing results and still has me wondering: Was Anthony ~~#####~~ of a "First Family" a Tory, or just a plain soldier?

Most of the replies came from persons directly descended from Thones (translated to Tunis, Dennis or Anthony) Kunders (Cunard) who came from Germany and was one of 13 heads of families who founded Germantown, Pa. in 1683. The Cunards were Quakers and when the Revolutionary War began many remained neutral while others fled to Canada or England. The line which descended from Thones Kunders' son Henry founded the Cunard Steamship Line. Today there are Kunders descendants all over America whose names vary from Cunard to Conard, Cunnard and Conrad.

Our family's Anthony Cunard was born 27 Aug. 1748 and saw his future wife, Anne Wheatley 1768-1850, ~~#####~~ ~~#####~~ ~~#####~~ somewhere in the vicinity of Redbank, N. J. They were married in 1791 and by the early 1800's were living at Redstone, Pa/

The story goes that when Anthony and his family moved west, he had left property in downtown Philadelphia which he owned jointly with his sister, in her care. I don't recall ever hearing her name, but she was the wife of an Episcopalian minister. Having grown concerned at not hearing from her, Anthony made a difficult trip back to Philadelphia, only to learn that both his sister and her husband had died, and the church had taken over the property. Soon after his return to Redstone he died 7 Feb. 1819.

Most of the family history came from Anne Wheatley Cunard, his widow, who moved with one of her younger daughters, Sarah, 1808-1853

and her husband, James Pilling, to Newcomerstown in 1841, ^{They} ~~and~~ were my great-grandparents. Others of the Cunard children were Elizabeth, 1792; John, 1794; William, 1796; Nancy, 1798; Joseph, 1801; Jonathan, 2 April 1804 who married Sinah McGrew 23 April 1829 in Guernsey County; Jane 29 June 1806 who married James Nargney and some of whose descendants are the Evans family in Newcomerstown; and Rebecca, 1811, whose husband Thomas Benton became a partner of James Pilling in the woolen mill which was built here on the property where I reside. One Mulvane family were Benton descendants.

An intriguing angle of the chart sent me by a Cunard descendant living in Denver, Co. shows that the eldest of Thones Kunders' sons had a grandson named Henry who had only two children, Anthony and Elizabeth. Henry's brother John never married and was said to have left his estate to his brother's two children. Was that our Anthony? The time frame seems right.

Several years ago I engaged a certified genealogist in Philadelphia --for a limited time since such services are expensive-- to look into any such records. But she found nothing.

On the other hand, maybe there were other Thones Kunders over there in Hesse when King George III went shopping for hired soldiers and our Anthony was just one of the many who deserted and decided to stay when the war ended. After all, names are not exclusive, as I'd always thought mine was with that Z for a middle initial. Then also through genealogy, I recently learned there is another Lois Zimmer Craig. And she is no relation!

Perhaps your Cambridge correspondent will be sending you this article which was published in last Saturday's Cambridge Jeffersonian. But just in case that person doesn't, I'm sending you an extra one I bought.

I so deeply appreciated your phoning me recently about my Cunard query in the "Jeff," and hoped to write before now, but a great many things have intervened and as I'd been invited by my Cambridge friend, Marllys Victor, to be her guest columnists, felt I had to do that first. I hope its publication will uncover some more Cunards, Conards or Cunnards.

I am confused with some of the notes I hastily wrote the night you phoned me. I understood you to say that you were trying to find the burial place of your great-grandparents, James C. Cunard and Rachel Walker McGrew. At the same time I thought you told me that Rachel McGrew was Sinah McGrew's sister who had moved west. Would James Cunard perhaps have been a cousin of Jonathan, for there is no James listed among the children of Anthony Cunard. Will you take time to untangle this for me, please?

I know that Jonathan was my great-grandmother Sarah ~~#####~~
~~#####~~ Cunard Pilling's brother for I remember hearing my grandmother, Maria Pilling Moore refer to "Aunt Sinah." I also feel confident that the list of Cunard children I'm sending you is correct for this reason. I copied it from a document I borrowed from one of the descendants of the Cunard's youngest daughter, who had married Thomas Benton. The list was hand written, and in addition to giving the year of birth for each child, also contained the day of the week and time of day. I made that copy probably 40 years ago, and how I wish I had realized the importance of the rest of that data.

My reason for trying to locate other Cunard descendants was to learn if there might be others who had stories handed down about Anthony Cunard. As I mention in the newspaper article, Anne Wheatley Cunard, his widow, moved to Newcomerstown with her younger daughters. She was blind but liked to sew, and my grandmother's eldest sister, Ann was accustomed to sit beside her to thread her needles. And it was during this time that some of these stories about the family's history were told.

One was her recollection of barrels of flour being emptied in the street of the town where the Wheatley's lived, somewhere in New Jersey, and British soldiers riding horses through it to destroy it. That led to the supposition that William Wheatley may have been a baker.

If you are a descendant of both the Cunards and McGrews, this story also will interest you. I always accepted it with a grain of salt, but now that I've looked up some other dates, I wonder. The story was that Anne Warren Wheatley--my Gr-Gr-Gr-Grandmother, had as her most precious possession a jewel from the sword of Gen. Joseph Warren. As a child I always visualized the jewel as something at least the size of a small egg. But as I studied history, I learned that Gen. Warren who fell at the battle of Bunker Hill was a physician who never married and lived in Massachusetts. Today I looked it up and he was born in 1741--two years after our Anne Warren. And now ~~####~~ there's a recollection going around in my head that he was our Anne's brother, two years younger. I MUST pursue that further.

The chart of the Kunders family which I'm enclosing was sent me several years ago by Erik Conard of Wheat Ridge, Colo. At the time he wrote me, he was confident that our Anthony was descended from the eldest son of the original Thones Kunders and he greeted me as a "potential cousin," since he is descended from the same line. But I haven't heard from him for a number of years, so evidently he changed his mind!

I'll be anxious to hear from you and learn your reaction to the information I've sent. If your Cambridge correspondent happens to send you a duplicate of the "Off the Tombstone" column, I'd appreciate having you return this one. And I'd love to have a copy of those letters from Sinah McGrew Cunard, if they're available.

You have been so very generous in sending me the material about your own family and what ~~#####~~ connection is with my own. And I am apologetic that I have nothing of value to send you in return.

We kept delaying to make the trip to hunt the cemetery between Birmingham and Peoli to get a picture as you had requested and now something has developed which makes that expedition seem unnecessary.

I don't remember whether in our telephone conversations I told you about the genealogist from Colorado Springs who has been researching the entire Cunard, Cunnard, Conard, Connard descendants of Thones Kunders who was wone of the founders of Germantown, Pa. in 1683. Last week she paid her third visit to me, bringing along many pages of records which she added to the big book she'd already given me.

When I showed her the material you had sent concerning the McGrews and Cunards she was delighted, and I hope you won't mind that I gave her much of it to aid in her own research. She and two Cunard relatives--one from Barnesville and the other from Utica, Oh.--had hunted up the location of the cemetery and found there was nothing there. They said it involved a walk of some distance up a hill and there was nothing to be gained by going. She is especially interested in getting pictures of people and places and was disappointed that there was nothing to photograph.

She is Athlyn Luzier, 730 E. Boulder, Colorado Springs, Col. 80903 and I am sure if you have not yet heard from her you will, one of these days. She is a very remarkable person and I have no ~~####~~ idea how she has the time, energy or even the funds for the project she has undertaken. And she does NOT use a computer! Our Anthony Cunard was a great-grandson of Thones Kunders, and descended from his eldest son and ~~#####t~~
~~#####~~ in the book she brought me a year ago, she reported that 1,716 male descendants of Thones Kunders and his wife Elin Tyson(or Streypers) now had been identified.

Along with the letter you had asked me to return, I am sending some of the other material you had sent, thinking perhaps in your correspondence with others, these records may relieve you of having to make more copies. I am truly grateful for your kindness in writing.

Dear Mrs. Howland:

Over a year ago I wrote the Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania requesting names of genealogists, one of whom might be able to do research for me. I realize you may not be available now, as you apparently were then. However I shall describe my problem in the hope that if you find it worth pursuing, you might give me some idea of the cost involved since my funds are somewhat limited.

My great-great-grandfather was ANTHONY CUNARD, said to have been a Hessian soldier. While researching his wife's -- ANNE WHEATLY** background, I fortunately attracted the interest of a descendant of THONES KUNDERS, one of the founders of Germantown, Pa. She pointed out that CUNARD is not a German name, that the name ANTHONY CUNARD was its translation appearing in her own family's genealogy, and suggested that my ancestor was more likely a Tory or a Quaker.

I am enclosing all the record I have of ANTHONY CUNARD'S family. The fact lending credence to her suggestion is that Anthony and a sister whose husband was an Episcopalian (?) minister owned property in downtown Philadelphia. When he and his family moved westward, she was left in charge of it. Realizing that his health was failing and concerned about the property, he made a trip back to Philadelphia from his home at Redstone, Pa. in early 1819 and died there shortly after his return. He had learned that both the sister and her husband had died and the church had taken over the property. I have no record of her name.

I have been unable to find any census showing his whereabouts from 1791 to 1819, or even the place of his marriage. The family story is that he first saw ANNE WHEATLY when she was going to the spring near the family home at Elizabeth or Red Bank, N.J. Her parents had been married in Quaker Meeting in Burlington County.

If from this information you find the project of sufficient interest and can give me some idea of the probable cost that might be involved to verify any of this material, I shall be most grateful.

Dear Joan:

It was so nice to receive your letter earlier this month with the query about John Cunard, who would have been a brother of my great-grandmother, Sarah Cunard Pilling. Actually I have no further information than that I sent you five years ago, but I have hopes I may have something more constructive soon.

First, allow me to explain why I haven't made any progress. About four years ago I came down with a case of shingles which robbed me of energy that I've never regained. And after that a broken wrist further interfered. So now at 82, I sometimes have the feeling that I'm beginning to fall apart!

But recently I've had two things which jogged me into action. One was your query, and the other is that a skilled genealogist whom I've known for a number of years has recently moved here, right in my own neighborhood. So her presence is going to give me added incentive.

I intend to place a query in one of our area newspapers which carries a genealogy column, seeking information on the descendants of Jonathan Cunard. Somewhere recently I chanced on the record of his marriage to Sinah McGrew, which occurred 20 October, 1830. I remember that during my newspaper days in response to a column I'd written in which I referred to my Hessian gr-gr-grandfather Anthony Cunard, I received a letter from a Mrs. McGrew who lived, I think in Belmont County, Oh. How I wish I'd saved that 40-years-ago letter! At any rate I'm hoping this may bring a response from someone of her family.

Then this past January while stopping in Granville for lunch, I spied the name Cunard on a jewelry store next door. I stopped in and talked to a woman there, learned that her husband was George Cunard, and came on home intending to write him at once, sending him the Cunard information I had. But that very night my brother-in-law had a fatal hemorrhage from lung cancer which wiped such plans completely from my mind. Luckily after your letter arrived, I hunted and found the business card I'd brought home. So I wrote him today and if I learn anything more about the family, I'll write you.

In May my sister and I went ahead with plans for a Panama Canal cruise in which my brother-in-law had been so interested, thinking he'd want us to go with the reservations we'd made before Christmas. It was an 18-day cruise from Tampa, Fla. to San Francisco and was wonderful therapy for Marian, my sister. So you see we've really been busy. I'm so glad you wrote and reawakened my lagging interest. I promise to write again whenever I learn anything.

P.S.- In the interim since our earlier correspondence, my sister and brother-in-law, having discovered he had cancer, had sold their farm and bought a modular to attach to the family home in which I live. It was a wonderful arrangement for all of us and they moved into their little new home in November, 1984 and then had only a little more than a year to enjoy it. But Marian and I still have our own homes, and share our meals and practically everything else we do, and are a great comfort and help to each other. She is 10 years younger than I.

Dear Joan:

I am assuming that you will have discovered my Cunard story in the Saturday Jeffersonian. I am well acquainted with Marllys Victor who writes the Appie Taft column, and recently when I had sent her the inquiry about Anthony Cunard, I had offered to tell her the story, thinking it would make a good contribution to her column. But she wrote back, inviting me to be her guest columnist. It was fun to do, but since right then we were not only getting ready for company, but having new carpet installed in our living room, my sister and I were busy.

Now I have managed to pull all these ends together, had them copied, and am enclosing the ones in which I hope you will find some of your ancestors. My guess is that your great-grandfather might have been a son of Jonathan and Sinah McGrew Cunard. I know this couple belonged with our family, for I remember my grandmother, Maria Pilling Moore, making mention of Aunt Sinah.

Beside your own response to my query, I had another surprising one from East Helena, Mont. He telephoned one evening to say that some friend or relative in Cambridge had sent him my query and while he was not related to the Cunards, he was to the McGrews, and his great-grandmother had been Sinah's sister; that his branch of the family had moved on West, and he still had letters which Sinah had written to her sister. He promised to send me copies but has not yet done so, as I had delayed until now also writing to him. I don't remember now where I found the date for Jonathan and Sinah's marriage (20 Oct. 1830) but the date he gave me was 23 April, 1829. He said they were married in Guernsey County and that Jonathan had been postmaster at Birmingham for a number of years.

This man's name was Jim Gite, P. O. Box 800, East Helena, Mont. 59635. He had done research in Guernsey County, evidently fairly recently, and told me he was searching for the burial place of his great-grandparents--James C. Cunard and Rachel Walker McGrew. There's confusion here, I realize, so I must have misunderstood some of what he told me. He said he had tried to find a cemetery off the road, somewhere between Birmingham and Peoli, and urged me to look for it, as it contained several Cunard burials.

My reason for trying to locate other Cunard descentants was to learn if there might be others who had stories handed down about Anthony Cunard. As I mention in the Jeff article, Anne Wheatley Cunard, his widow, moved to Newcomerstown with her younger daughters. She was blind but liked to sew, and my grandmother's eldest sister, Anne, was accustomed to sit beside her to thread her needles, and it was during this time that some of these stories about the family's beginnings were told.

Thank you so very much for taking the time to reply to my Yankee query. The information you have sent, and the suggestions for pursuing it further opens all kinds of intriguing possibilities and I am eager to write Mr. Platt at the Phila. Genealogical Society. However, since I am presently making final preparations for my first trip abroad-- a cathedral tour of England-- I shall delay writing until after my return in August.

I have been lucky in having two of my queries published in Yankee-- the first a couple of years ago producing several replies. But I was beginning to despair of any results from my most recent one when two letters arrived the same day: your own, and one from a gentlemen in Trenton, N. J., who wrote that he couldn't help me but "I only wish to enlighten you on history, on the anme Hessian" with three pages sollowing! So of course that's helpful too, and I shall write to thank him.

I so frequently regret that my mother who died five years abo at 97, couldn't have been here to learn of these interesting developments in my Cunard search. She loved to say in fun, whenever she wishe d to excuse something contentious, "Well, you know my great-grandfather was a Hessian soldier!" It is only recently, as the result of correspondence with another generous genealogist who descends from another line of Cunards, that I have begun to question the family history as preserved by my grandmother.

That ~~####~~ story was that Anthon Cunard, a Hessian Sldier still wearing his uniform, first saw Anne Wheatley when she was going to the spring for water near the family home at Eli, abeth, N.J. They were married ther (?) in 1791. By 1819 they were living at Redstone, Pa., where he died in Feb. It resulted from illness he developed following a trip he made back to Phila. to inquire into property he and a sister had owned in the central part of the city. I'm writing you all this not becuae I'm seekig youg ehlp in untangling it, but simply because I have discovered that nearly everybody has interesting family history and I hope you'll enjoy hearing some of mine. There's material for a novel in practically everybody's background, I've decided.

Dear Mrs. Stoller:

Thank you so much for your prompt and very interesting reply to my letter about the Cunards.

The information about the much earlier arrival of this family in America-- and especially the frequency of the use of Anthony as a given name-- rouses fascinating possibilities. And yet I believe my information is authentic enough to rule out much chance of a connection between our families.

I regret not having kept a copy of my earlier letter to you, for possibly I'll be boring you with repetitious material. My parents and we four Zimmer children (Frederic, Lois, David and Marian) lived with my maternal grandmother, Maria Pilling Moore, in the house which her father, James Pilling had built until her death. As a result we grew up having an intimate knowledge of her family and almost thought of her contemporaries as our own. This is the house in which I still love.

Until I began following up clues within the last few months by writing to people like yourself I had never done any genealogical research and simply had been coasting along on all the material handed down by my grandmother. But now I'm corresponding also with other descendants(?) of the Wheatleys and Pillings, some of whom are definitely related to us. And it's all so fascinating I'd like to give it all my time.

I'm enclosing a chart showing my maternal line, but unfortunately there's not a Henry or Dennis in the whole relationship. I so regret that I didn't start pursuing all this sooner for my mother lived beyond her 97th birthday and until her final illness was mentally very alert and could no doubt have supplied some of the information I lack.

However I'm inclined to believe that our Anthony Cunard was a Hessian soldier since my grandmother's oldest sister, Anne, born in 1833 passed along many stories about her blind grandmother Anne Wheatley Cunard who is buried here in the pioneer cemetery. As a child she sat beside her grandmother to thread needles for her as she sewed and I can well imagine that this could have been a favorite story-telling time. It seems Anthony Cunard, as a Hessian soldier first saw the Wheatley children at Elizabeth, N. J., where barrels of flour had been rolled into the street and destroyed by the British riding horses through the flour. This has led to family speculation that William Wheatley was a miller, tho I don't know whether there is any truth in it. After the end of the war Anthony returned to that area and first encountered Anne when she was going to the spring for water and he was still wearing his uniform.

Before World War I my mother wrote to the German embassy in Washington to inquire whether there was a way to secure ##

names of troops hired by the British to fight in the Revolution but received a reply that such records would be only in the hands of the separate duchies which had provided them. And nothing else was ever done about it. Now I wonder if by searching out the origins of those troops I could still get that information. Are you familiar with the book by Louise Hall Tharp, "The Countess and the General?" Since I don't have my copy here just now, I can't check on the exact title, but I believe that is it. And it's several years since I've read it, so I'm not sure how much background information about origins is given. But at any rate it's a fascinating book.

Perhaps I told you this in my earlier letter: That Anthony Cunard died at Redstone, Pa., after becoming ill following a trip on foot to inquire about property he had owned along with a sister in Philadelphia. His widow came to Newcomerstown in 1841 along with her two daughters, Sarah and Rebecca and their families.

It was so nice to hear from you and I hope we can keep in touch. If and when I am able to learn anything else about my own branch of Cunards, I shall certainly write you.

Forgive the long delay in answering your letter. I seem to stay behind and despair of ever catching up.

Are you absolutely sure your Anthony Cunard was a Russian soldier? The name and area makes me wonder. My Cunard line goes back to THOMAS HUNDERS, one of the 13 heads of families who founded Germantown ¹⁶⁸³. In America he called himself Dennis Cunard - Conrad or Conders but Thomas or Junis (both forms appear) is short for Anthony or Antonis. His descendants adapted the names Cunard, Conard or Conrad. Some settled in New Jersey, Maryland, Del. and Va. and spread out from there. I do wonder if it is possible that the Russian soldier is, like other traditions often are, erroneous. If it is true then I cannot be of help to you

Am afraid. I know Kunders and his fellow immigrants were mostly from Crefeld, Germany near the Holland border and were all Quakers or Mennonites.

However after a few generations went by many are to be found as members of other churches. My Rebecca Cunnard and Isaac Pretner were married in St. Pauls Episcopal Church, Curkiemen, Pa. 1803 and were later members of St. Pauls Episcopal Church in Pittanning, Armstrong Co., Pa. She was a daughter of Henry Cunnard and Elizabeth Streper. Henry fought in the Rev. War so he had undoubtedly left the Quakers. Henry Cunnard was son of Dennis Cunnard & Lydia Patts - a grandson of Old Iones Kunders. They lived Parriton Twp. Montgomery Co. Pa.

The eldest son of Iones Kunders was Cunrad Cunrads, born 17th of 5th mo. 1678 in Crefeld Germany. He married 15th 1704 to Ann Kleiken and 2nd Anne Burson of Curkiemen (1721) Cunrad died in Warchester Twp, Philadelphia Co. (now Montgomery Co.) in 1747. He left a will naming

his sons Anthony, Henry, James, John, Joseph and Dennis. Henry and Dennis are particularly common names and if you have them in your family it might be indicative. Many of the descendants of this family settled in Loudoun County, Va. and some possibly went Westward.

The second son of Thomas Kunders was Matthias Cunders (Matthias Currade) - He died in Germantown 1726 leaving 7 children, all minors. His sons were Anthony, Cornelius, (named for his maternal grandfather), William, John and Matthias. His descendants settled in Chester, Bucks, Lancaster and Montgomery Counties, Pa. and in Phila-
delphia and New Jersey.

No other Anthonies in the 2nd generation - tho that doesn't necessarily mean anything. I have lots more on this family if you can connect up to it.

I doubt that this is much help. You might see if there is a deed in Philadelphia Co. records that fits. I suppose you have checked census records. If not you should.

Let me know of your progress. If you find this is your family (as I suspect) I ^{can} give you lots more.

Dear Helen:

My conscience has been giving me fits for weeks and weeks at not having answered both of your December letters long before now. But I simply don't know where the time goes and guess it's because I'm too involved in too many things. I'm of a creative temperament and 13 years ago was one of the founders of the Ohio Arts and Crafts Guild which currently has around 500 members in all parts of the state. As a former newspaperwoman, I've always handled all its publicity and that too takes my time.

I can't seem to just join things; I have to get involved! So now I'm secretary of our county genealogy society, taking my turn at staffing our modest library, visiting cemeteries to copy names off tombstones, etc, etc. Consequently my own research is not as extensive as it should be. I'm sure I could learn a very great deal from you and I wish we didn't live so many miles apart. You've been so generous in sharing so much of your information, and to me the supreme sacrifice is writing it all in longhand. I'm so accustomed to typing all my thoughts that my writing is rapidly becoming illegible.

One of my cousins--also a descendant of Anthony Cunard--is a former president of the Moravian Church organization and lives in the Bethlehem, Pa., area. I'm hoping to be able to get him to check into the old Philadelphia land records and see if we can pick up our Anthony's trail. I'd like to do it myself, but am convinced this bicentennial year is a good time to stay away from all that.

Most recently I've been lucky in securing the proper address in West Germany to request my Zimmer family records and received xeroxed copies of marriage and baptismal documents going back to 1807. But unfortunately they're partly in French and the rest in German, neither of which I can read beyond a few familiar words. Do you have anyone named Fisher or Levan in your family tree? Those are some of my paternal ancestors from eastern Pennsylvania and maybe Virginia.

So far in all my inquiry I haven't discovered any skeletons in family closets, nor have I found anyone too exalted; they were all just the nice ordinary people putting in long days of hard work without all our wonderful modern conveniences which make our lives so easy by comparison. I notice in re-reading your letter that both Isaac and Rebecca are among the given names. No. I'm wrong. Just now when I checked, I found that Isaac goes back to the Wheatley's; that Isaac was a brother of Anne^{our} wife of Anthony Cunard. Anthony's and Anne's children were Elizabeth, John, William, Nancy, Joseph, Jonathan, Jane, Sarah (my great-grandmother Pilling) and Rebecca.

Because I believe you'll enjoy reading some of our family history, I'm enclosing a copy of the little book which my uncle published in 1963 to celebrate his 80th birthday. He died a year later. Unfortunately I did not proofread it for him, so some minor errors were printed and I've corrected the most obvious. A number of the family members he mentions are now, of course, gone. The name of the town which he used for the title, was the Delaware Indian name. I shall look forward to hearing from you, but won't blame you if you take six months to reply. Sincerely,

Dear Lois -

You see you are not the only one who gets behind! If I could ever catch up I believe I could keep up. I should take a week off from everything else and get my correspondence attended to, but there never seems to be a week that I can give up. Like everyone else, I spread myself too thin!

I did enjoy the booklet you enclosed. In fact I was very entertained! I was struck by the fact that life is really much the same wherever one goes. You did not say whether you wanted the booklet returned. I would like to keep it for our library, as it has so much about early families in your area. However, I will hold it back till I hear from you that you don't want it returned.

Beginning about two years ago a group of about 15 of us (about 5 of whom actually work!) formed a committee to improve the genealogical collection at our library. The library was anti-cipating a large addition and planned to set

aside a large room to contain what was already there plus what we could add. We raised about \$10,000⁰⁰ and have bought about \$5000⁰⁰ worth of books so far (Most of them are still waiting to be catalogued, unfortunately.) When the room opened to the public last Jan. we divided our selves up to work in the room (with a librarian) as volunteers. The Committee then decided a Genealogical Society was needed - so we have gotten that organized. You can see ^{how} all of this might put into my time!

I still do ^{not} think that your Anthony Cunard was a Mission Soldier - tho I don't absolutely deny it. One thing that is a good rule of thumb, though not infallible, was the custom almost universally followed during the 18th & 19th century of naming the eldest children for their grandparents. I notice that Anthony & Anne Wheatley Cunard had these (4 oldest)

Elizabeth, b 1792

John b 1794

William b. 1796 - named for Anne's father William

Nancy b 1798 - named for Anne's mother Anne
(or Agnes)

This leads me to believe that Anthony Cunard

followed this custom and therefore it is a
good bet Anthony's parents were John and
Elizabeth.

There was a John Conrad who died ca 1794
in Lancaster Co. Pa. and another John CONRAD
who died there 1801. Administration records
exist in Lancaster Co. Conrad was another
name adopted by the descendants of Thomas
Kunders.

Have you found Anthony Conrad in the 1790
Census of Pa.?

The reason it may have been assumed that Anthony
Conard was a Hessian soldier is that many of these
early Philadelphia families, originally Quakers, were
Lories, some fought for the British. My ancestor
Henry Conard fought in the Revolution in the Phila-
delphia Co. Militia. His uncle was a Tory and
fled Philadelphia county for Nova Scotia. His
descendants fared better in the long run. One of
his sons, Sir Samuel Conard, was the founder of
the Conard Steamship Lines.

Please keep me informed of your progress.
If you ever trace your line back to Thomas
Kunders, I'll be able to send you some
data about him.

Dear Helen:

Had I not had a request to bring along my genealogy materials to a cousin's dinner party this past Sunday at their home near Cleveland, I suspect I'd have continued to forget my promise to write you immediately after the conclusion of our arts and crafts festival, last August. Instead, I spent Saturday evening re-organizing my big thick loose-leaf notebook in which I've now succeeded in filing my correspondence. It's now classified under family branches-- WARREN, WHEATLEY, CUNARD, PILLING, MARTIN, MOORE, FISHER, ZIMMER. ~~etc~~ I seem to allow myself to get carried away in eight different directions. So I hope you'll forgive my apparent negligence.

Incidentally, only the last two family names involve my father's side of the house and they lead back to KLEIN in Bavaria, WINK or WINCH, REED, SEIGFRIED ~~and~~ LEVAN. The Levans came in the early 1700's and originally were French Huguenots.

I shared your letters with my cousins and all of us are intrigued at the possibilities you suggest and one of them has offered to drive, so she and I can make a leisurely trip to eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey next spring to do some research there. Her brother who lives near Philadelphia is the Moravian minister I mentioned in an earlier letter to you.

Surely you are much younger than my approaching 73, for you have accomplished so much more through research than I have, and in addition have devoted so much time to organizing your city's genealogical library. And to do all your writing in longhand!!

Our county society is just now trying to find larger quarters for their library and meeting room. Not only is our membership growing too large for the space (but probably that's been taken care of, for at the last meeting they voted to double the dues from \$2 to \$4) but also the landlord has announced he's going to put in meters so we'll have to pay our own gas and electric bills. Since I live 18 miles away, I'm not involved in hunting a new location.

We are gradually accumulating a library tho to date all the funds they've had for buying books have come from profits made in reprinting and selling old county histories and other documents. We also have a microfilm reader and are investing in census records of areas in which members are most interested.

Recently, while serving as the volunteer librarian, I had time to study a book recently donated: "Early New Jersey Marriages" and suspect I uncovered my own first family skeleton. All the family records handed down listed the marriage of Anne Warren and William Wheatley (Anne Wheatley Cunard's parents) as Nov. 5, 1759 in eastern Pa. But I found them in Burlington County, N. J., Nov. 5, 1760, with their first child, according to my family records, Mary, born May 23, 1761. So, for the sake of family pride, did William and Anne just conveniently drop back a year when they moved west?

I'd live to see those volumes about the Hession troops, published by the man in St. Louis, but I don't feel I can afford the investment. Instead I'm going to inquire of some of the libraries in the state recognized for their genealogical collections in the hope of locating them. Dear Lois -

I, too, am behind. Just too many irons in the fire. I hope you can get to the Philadelphia and New Jersey area and that you will find there a link to my Cunard / Conard family. Then I can give you some solid help! Somehow, I cannot believe that Cunard was a Hessian name. So often these family traditions become so distorted that it's hard to find the grain of truth in them. The Kunders family (who later called themselves Cunard / Conard / Condors / Conrad) were German but came to Penn. almost 100 years before the Rev. They were Quakers when they arrived and many descendants are still Quakers. At the time of the Revolution the Quakers around Philadelphia (for the most part) were at least, non-combatants and neutral - at worst, Loyalist. It is entirely possible that a man of German descent who was a Loyalist after several generations became a Hessian. Just as in my family a man whose father-in-law was appointed collector of customs for Charleston, S.C. in 1770 and died there in 1772 - became a French Huguenot from Charleston (The son-in-law, that is). Actually the family was a Montgomery County, Pa. family!

The "Gene" room at our library is coming along nicely, with new materials being added almost daily. I'm sending you a couple of items for your library - perhaps someone will find them useful. If you will find Muscogee County on the map and ~~see~~ ^{Ga.} place Columbus right on the Ala./Ga. boundary (Chattahoochee River), then you will see exactly where I live. The Columbus map is mostly just an interesting civility.

Dear Miss Abbott:

Thank you so very much for your interesting letter which came on a dreary day, bringing fresh impetus to a very amateur genealogist. I have decided that one of the nicest things about Yankee Magazine is the way in which queries keep on working years after they've been published. So far, these have been much more productive than queries I've also had published in the Genealogical Helper to which I subscribe.

First I shall tell you the story as handed down in my maternal grandmother's family, and then share with you the information I've recently acquired.

My great-great-grandfather's name was Anthony Cunard and he was said to have been a Hessian soldier. 27, Aug. 1748--7 Feb., 1819. He and Anne Wheatly 10-Sept. 1768--27 Nov. 1850 were married in 1791. The story goes that he was still ##### wearing his British uniform when he first saw her going to the spring for water at Elizabeth N. J.

Their children were Elizabeth 13 July, 1792; John 10 Sept. 1794; William 16 Oct. 1796; Nancy 3 Nov., 1798; Joseph 20 April 1801; Jonathan 3 April 1804; Jane 29 June 1806; Sarah my great grandmother 5 Dec. 1808 and Rebecca 5 Dec. 1811.

Anthony Cunard and his ##### sister owned property in central Philadelphia. She was married to a minister (my records say Episcopalian tho I never heard her name.) When Anthony Cunard moved on west she was left in charge of their property. Anthony was living at Redstone, Pa., where he died in 1819. Realizing that his health was failing he had made a trip back to Philadelphia to inquire about this property, and learned that both his sister and her husband had died and the church had taken over their holdings. He died shortly after returning home and was buried in Redstone Cemetery near Uniontown.

I won't bore you with my family history further than to say that his widow came with my great-grandparents, James and Sarah Cunard Pilling, to Ohio in 1841, as did Thomas and Rebecca Cunard Benton. Their sister Jane Cunard was married to ~~Walter~~ Nargney and had come to this same area in 1834. I remember hearing my grandmother, Maria Pilling Moore, refer to numerous other Cunard relatives who settled in western Pennsylvania or Ohio.

As a result of seeing a Cunard query in the Gen. Helper back in 1975, I had correspondence with Mrs. Richard H. Stoller, 1811 Preston Columbus, Ga. 31906, who sent me information similar to that you have, and first began questioning our Anthony's identity as a Hessian soldier. And I seem to have been growing more confused about it, ever since. Now I haven't heard from Mrs. Stoller for a couple of years, due not to lack of interest but just to the fact that both of us were too busy with other things. She is an experienced genealogist and was both patient and generous with me, such a beginner. Her ancestor was Henry Cunard who fought in the Revolution in the Philadelphia County Militia.

I certainly shall follow your suggestion about writing Miss Collins for more information, and shall look forward to hearing from you again when you find time to write. I am enclosing a copy of the computer print-out I received from Salt Lake City and hope you will find it of more value than I have. The search I requested was for early colonial records which they said were incompletely indexed, and federal census records, also incomplete, through 1819. I hope you have better luck.

Dear Helen:

Remember me? According to my records the last time I wrote you was in October 1976 and I guess our correspondence lagged because we had no important information to trade with each other. But I have thought of you often and did so again today when I was writing to another recently acquired Cunard correspondent. Mostly I thought about you during that time a number of months ago when your city was so frequently in the news with those attacks on women living alone. I do hope you came through that trying time safely and are well and busy as usual.

Just now when I was washing my lunch dishes, I decided that when it comes to genealogy, I'm like a line from an old song that suddenly was going through my mind: "When I am not near to the girl that I fancy, I fancy the girl I'm near!" Most recently I've jumped clear outside my own family, and have been working on a little news story about my husband's ancestry. His family was directly descended from the same Cather ancestors in Virginia who produced the author, Willa Cather and she and my husband even resembled each other.

But to get back to the Cunards: Due to illness in her family, the cousin who had proposed we'd go to Philadelphia and New Jersey to do research, had to abandon the idea and I allowed myself to get involved in several dozen other things. Last July I even had a two-weeks trip to England to visit cathedrals.

A few days ago I received a response to a genealogical query I'd been lucky to have published last spring in Yankee Magazine. In it I had asked whether Anthony Cunard was a Hessian or a Tory. A month after publication I got two replies from New Jersey: one a mini-lecture on Hessians from a retired man who seemed to think I had a lot to learn about them, and probably I did, and the other from a woman who sent me information about contacting the Historical Society of Philadelphia. I did, and now have the list of professional genealogists I requested but I haven't done anything more about it.

Then last week came a letter from Miss Charlotte Abbott, 25 Lotus St., Dover, Del., 19901 who sent me some of the same information about Thones Kunders in Germantown which you had so generously shared with me. So obviously you two must be related there, somewhere. Now if I could only prove that I belong to the same nice group of people!

Recently I yielded to temptation and sent \$15 to Accelerated Indexing Systems out in Salt Lake City, requesting a search of their records for Cunard or Conard for their first group which included Colonial and Federal records up to 1819. And at the very top of the list I received in return was Anthony Conard. But when, using the key to the 1800 census which they included, I managed to figure out the family he had at that time, it didn't match my Anthony's. At any rate, I'm enclosing a copy of the print-out I got and I'll type the key on the bottom of it tho probably that's something which you as a genealogist already know.

I'd love to hear from you some of these days, if you have the time. Sincerely,

Indeed I do remember you and your Anthony Conard/Conrad, and was so glad to hear from you again. I have not forgotten your problem. Are you absolutely sure the Anthony who was in Philadelphia County in 1800 cannot be yours? If the number of children bothers you, let me remind you that about half the children born then died young - also people had apprentices and bound persons as well as younger brothers and sisters, etc, living with them. One of my ancestors is in the 1830 census with a male ~~5~~⁵⁻¹⁰ years. This man, by 1830, is a widower, aged 72 and had only 2 daughters; one was my ggg grandmother - the other never married. Who is this young boy? Well, this man was a shoemaker, and I think this boy was an apprentice.

If your Anthony turns out to be of my Conard family - as I suspect - then he was not really a Tory, but a Quaker. The Quakers had (and have) strong religious views about wars. During the Revolution most Quakers would not contribute in any way to the cause; even refused to pay taxes. Even non-combatant service was forbidden. They were con-

Dear Possible Cousin Erik:

Please don't conclude that my delay in responding, first to your very welcome telephone call and more recently to your interesting letter, was due in any way to lack of interest. This has been a very disruptive summer, sharing my home temporarily with some relatives. This is my first day alone and concentrating on my Cunard records has been the first thing on my program.

I've attempted to copy off the charts which I believe will be of most interest to you. One of the things I most deeply regret is that all these interesting speculations about our Anthony Cunard's origins couldn't have come while my mother was still alive. She died just six years ago, at 97 and whenever she wished to explain taking an opposite view about anything, she'd always say, "Well, just remember my great-grandfather was a Hessian soldier!"

Surprise: I just now had another phone call from you and have given you some of the dates I'd copied, to send you. So now I'll go ahead and tell you the fragmentary things that have been handed down through our family.

Anne Cunard--Anthony's widow, came to Ohio with her three youngest daughters and apparently lived with my great-grandparents, James and Sarah Pilling, for I have been told that she loved to sew although she was blind and my grandmother's eldest sister, Anne, was accustomed to sit beside her to thread her needles. Anne Cunard died here at Newcomerstown in 1850.

Anthony Cunard died at Redstone, Pa. in 1819 after he had returned from a trip to Philadelphia to inquire about the property he and his sister had jointly owned in downtown Philadelphia. She was the wife of an Episcopalian minister and he had left her in charge of the property when the Cunards started west. He learned that both his sister and her husband had died and the church had taken over the property. Apparently he wasn't very prosperous for I've always understood that he made the trip on foot with his health already failing and he died of "the flux" soon after returning.

Are you familiar with Yankee Magazine and its genealogy queries? I've had such good luck in receiving answers from them, and had published my Hessian or Tory query about Anthony there before it ran in the Genealogical Helper. One of the replies was from Miss Charlotte Abbott of 25 Lotus St., Dover, Del. She said she was descended from Henry and Katherine Strypen Cunard's son William. I note that in the chart you sent me the wife's name is spelled Streeper. She mentioned in her letter that Henry and Katherine were first cousins and had 7 children.

She suggested I write to Miss Margaret H. Collins, Arnecliffe Stable, Guelph Rd and Merion Ave., Bryn Mawr, P. 19010, as she had researched the Cunard line. I did so and received a reply, but now I seem to have lost it. I'm the most disorganized of genealogists and obviously you are not, so you'll just have to bear with me!

It was so nice to talk to you today, and I shall look forward to hearing from you again. Sincerely,

Dear Marian:

I guess the last time we saw each other was at Aunt Mary's funeral in 1981, what a shame that all of us who used to be just a couple of hours from each other are now spread far and wide across this country. When I was very young it seemed like the ride from Dennison to Newcomerstown would take hours and hours, just looked at a map and found that it is only a distance of twenty some miles. I still remember the barn out in back of your house, the fields beyond, and the railroad tracks with the wonderful sounds of the locomotive whistle. Aunt Annie and Uncle Albert are still in my memory, as are the old bridge down at the corner, and the tire and rope that were tied to a tree across the road along the river where we used to go swimming.

I am enclosing copies of the geneology of the Moores and Eckfelds for you to look at and to make any corrections or additions. What I am sending you does not have the last couple of generations, will add them later. If you can add any names, dates, places, etc. I will update my files. I do not have much on the history of the Zimmer side of the family, if you can add anything it will be a big help. One source that I have is the Mormon Church, also known as Latter Day Saints, or LDS. Their geneology library is fantastic, one of their churches here in Huntington Beach has a computer library with all of the geneology records available. Carol Clark, my niece from Texas, has been working on the family geneology for the last four or five years, I have been at it for about ten years. Between the two of us we have been able to gather many hundreds of names of relatives on all sides of our families.
