THE BAKER SISTERS OF COSHOCTON COUNTY, OHIO

Sarah, Lavina J., and Susannah Baker were daughters of Charles Baker, 1807-1894, and Charity Taylor, 1810-1861*. In the fall of 1850 the three sisters with their husbands+ and four very young children (Elizabeth Penn, Andrew J. Penn, Charles W. Penn, and Sarah Jane Thomas*) moved from Coshocton County, Ohio, to Iowa County, Iowa, by covered wagon making a trip of some 650 miles+. They settled on land west of what came to be known as North English and they all lived together in a log house the first winter+. Later they settled near the rural town of White Pigeon, which was about four miles southwest of North English+. A deserted store is the only building that still stands+. The White Pigeon Cemetery is located one-half mile south of the store+.

Bakers' canning preserves age-old tradition

The canning of produce is a tradition which has evolved through necessity. Passed on from generation to generation, the canning art has become a way of life for rural families. Although the necessity for a safe way to preserve the summer's bounty through the long winter months has been the main reason canning has remained a working tradition, the anticipation of planning, planting, growing and eating becomes a "close second."

Ira and Loraine Baker, who reside in Wheeling Township, Guernsey County, are as much a part of the canning tradition as it is of them.

During the years the Bakers were raising their family of six boys and three girls, canning was a vital part of home life. Canning and storing enough produce to keep nine growing children 51-0278-53-00 through the year can be a monumental task. To facilitate the storage problem, a "cave" was built on the farm that was their home at that time.

Loraine Baker reminisced, "Ira never came home with a bushel basket of anything. Our family was so large, he always came home with several tubsful!"

She recalled that the least amount of green beans they would can when the children were home was 200 quarts. Most years they averaged 300 to 400 quarts each of produce such as green beans, tomatoes and peaches.

With the children grown, the Bakers have moved from the farm and the "cave" which held the finished products of months and years of tedious labor. After installing a furnace in the basement at their new residence, they found it wasn't a very desirable place to store their canned goods because of the heat. It was then that the Baker children decided to build another underground fruit "cave" for their parents. The new "cave" measures 14' x 10', and it is approximately seven feet high with a dirt floor.

A problem which was not anticipated while building the second "cave" was ventilation. The finished "cave" was so tight that the walls and ceiling sweat. Three vents had to be installed — one in the back area and two in the front. One of the front vents has a small electric fan. (Oh yes! "Cave No. 2" has electricity in it!)

Mrs. Baker laughed and commented, "I only canned 25 quarts of tomatoes in 1980 . . ."

There are many such "caves" or cellars in Southeastern Ohio, and, whether you're canning 400 quarts or 25 quarts, "cave" storage seems to be an effective alternative to the conventional fruit cellar.

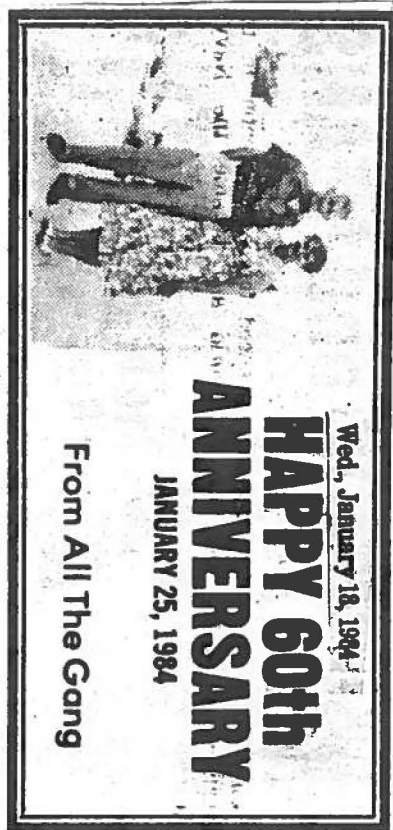

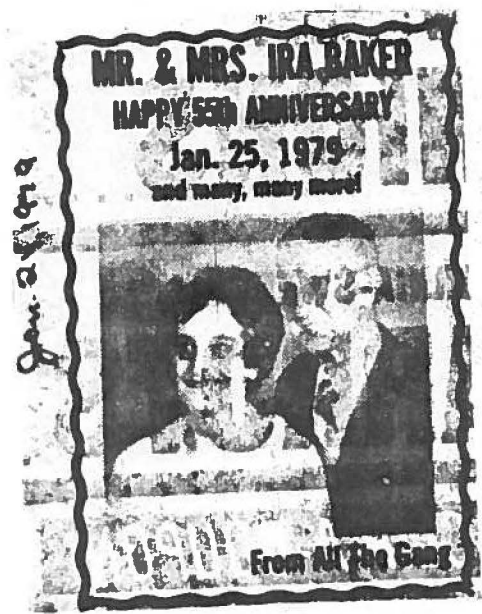

'Bakers Fore

The name Baker originates from the trade of that name centuries ago. In Germany, the name is Becker, in France, Boulanger, and in Italy, Piekarz. It is among the earliest of surnames, dating back beyond the Norman Conquest. The name is a known derivative of the ancient English word "Baccere," which means "baker."

Walter LeBaker of Devonshire, William LeBakere of Oxford, and Alan LeBaker of Sussex are all mentioned in the Hundred Rolls of the year 1273.

In the United States, it is one of the most common surnames. There is confirmation that an Edward Baker lived in Lynn, Massachusetts, in 1630, only 10 years after the Pilgrims founded Plymouth Rock. Family information holds that most of the early Bakers arrived in Virginia in the late 1600s, coming from England.

"Bakers Forever" is a well-documented book on this family lineage. It contains data from all areas of the country, but there is much about the Louisiana lines, especially those

around the Bienville and Claiborne Parish areas.

Warren L. Baker Jr., 10230 Lincoln Trail, Fairview Heights, Ill., 62208, compiled this book. It sells for \$21.75 and is available in a limited edition.

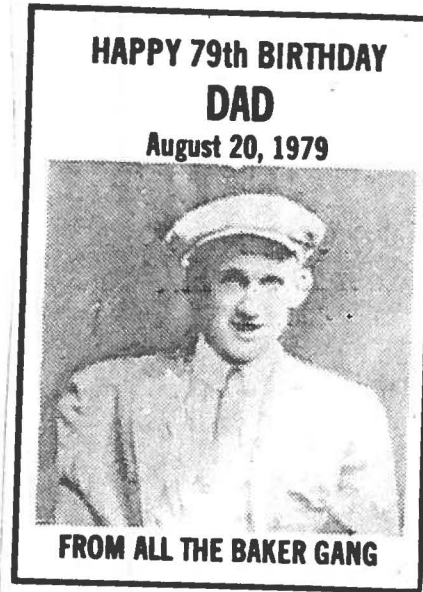

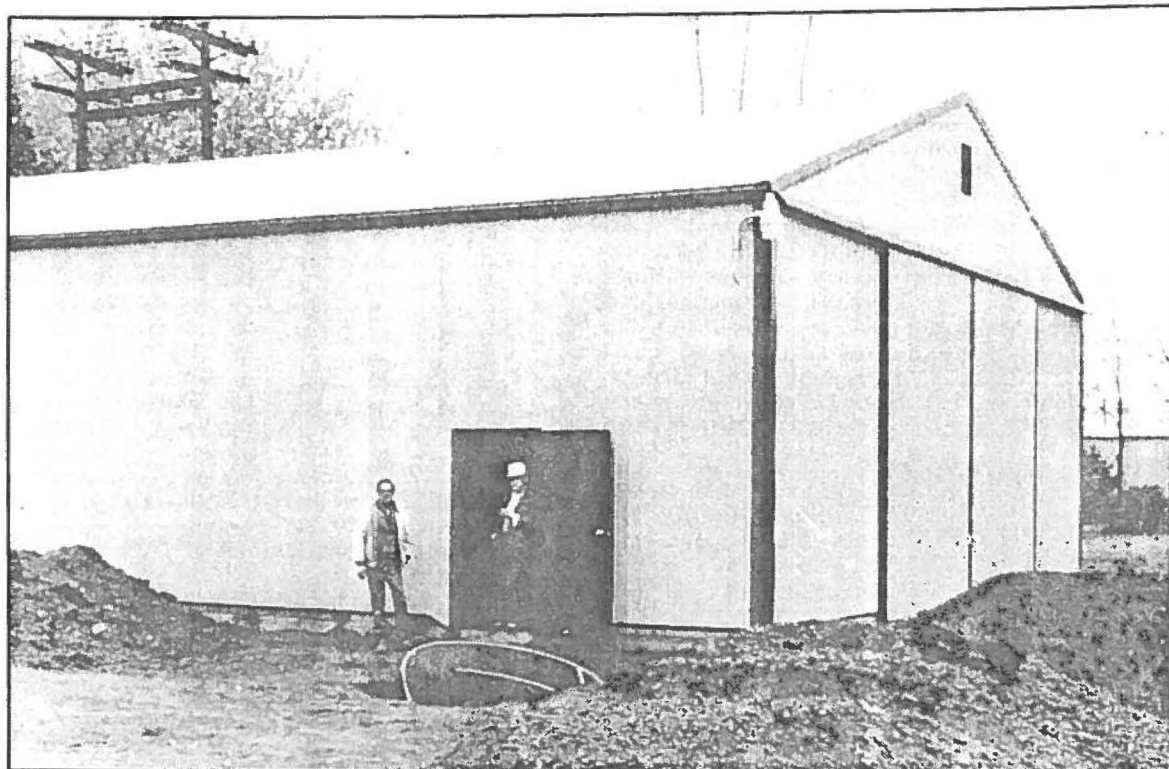

Baker said the company hopes to be open within 10-14 days and was planned because of continuing environmental concerns about waste management. The company uses the logo "SAM R. FAT" on its business card, with the letters standing for: "Save All Materials — Recycle For America Tomorrow."

Recycling plant will close doors

Newcomerstown Mayor Kelly Ault announced a curbside recycling program will continue despite the closing of 21st Century Recycling, when Newcomerstown council met Monday night.

Virgil Bliss, co-owner of 21st Century Recycling, said there are no markets for the recycled materials, with manufacturers still finding it cheaper to use raw materials rather than recycled materials. He said sale of the building, 530 S. College St., to Tri-County Ambulance Service is pending. 21st Century will close on June 1.

Mayor Ault said the Tuscarawas County Office of Litter Control will continue to subsidize the curbside recycling program with pickup for registered households continuing on the third Wednesday of each month. The pickup will now be done by Skip Refuse of Warsaw, which is reportedly going to build a recycling facility in Coshocton.

There are 182 households registered for the recycling program and Mayor Ault said registration can be done at the mayor's office.

Council also approved plans for a clean-up/trash pick-up week June 1-4. Residents within the corporation limits will be able to put trash curbside in front of their homes for the village street department to pick up.

Only trash which has been bagged or boxed will be accepted; no tires, tree limbs, twigs, brush or grass clippings. Anything recyclable will not be accepted. Recyclable items should be put out for the curbside recycling program.

Appliances will also be picked up one day during the week. There will be a \$5 charge per appliance to be paid in advance to the village clerk by Friday, May 28. The street de-

partment will have a list of all residents who paid in advance for the appliance pick-up and no others will be picked up. Appliances should be set out on Tuesday, June 1, and will be picked up as the street department has time.

The pick-up schedule is:

Tuesday, June 1 — West end of town to River Street.

Wednesday, June 2 — River Street to Pilling Street, State Street side.

Thursday, June 3 — Pilling Street to College Street, Canal Street side.

Friday, June 4 — Cross Street, Park Hill Drive, Crestview Manor, College Street, Scott Addition and the remainder of College Street.

Council approved a request by Carolyn Lehman of Bank One to create a parking space in front of Bank One to provide limited parking for access to an Automatic Teller Machine to be installed there this summer.

Council members also held a 26-minute executive session to discuss potential litigation.

In other action, council:

— Heard council member Jack Welsch report that the Newcomerstown Emergency Rescue Squad, Inc., paid for the repair of a timer for the village siren.

— Reminded area residents about ordinances prohibiting dogs running loose and about dogs parking.

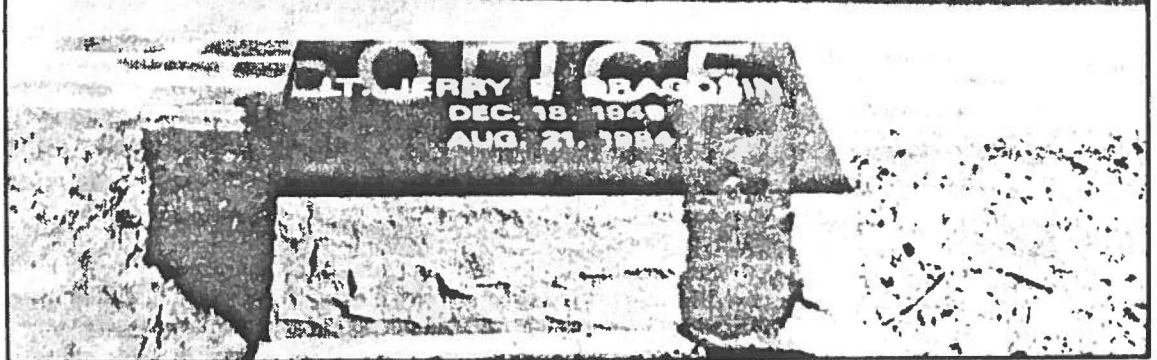
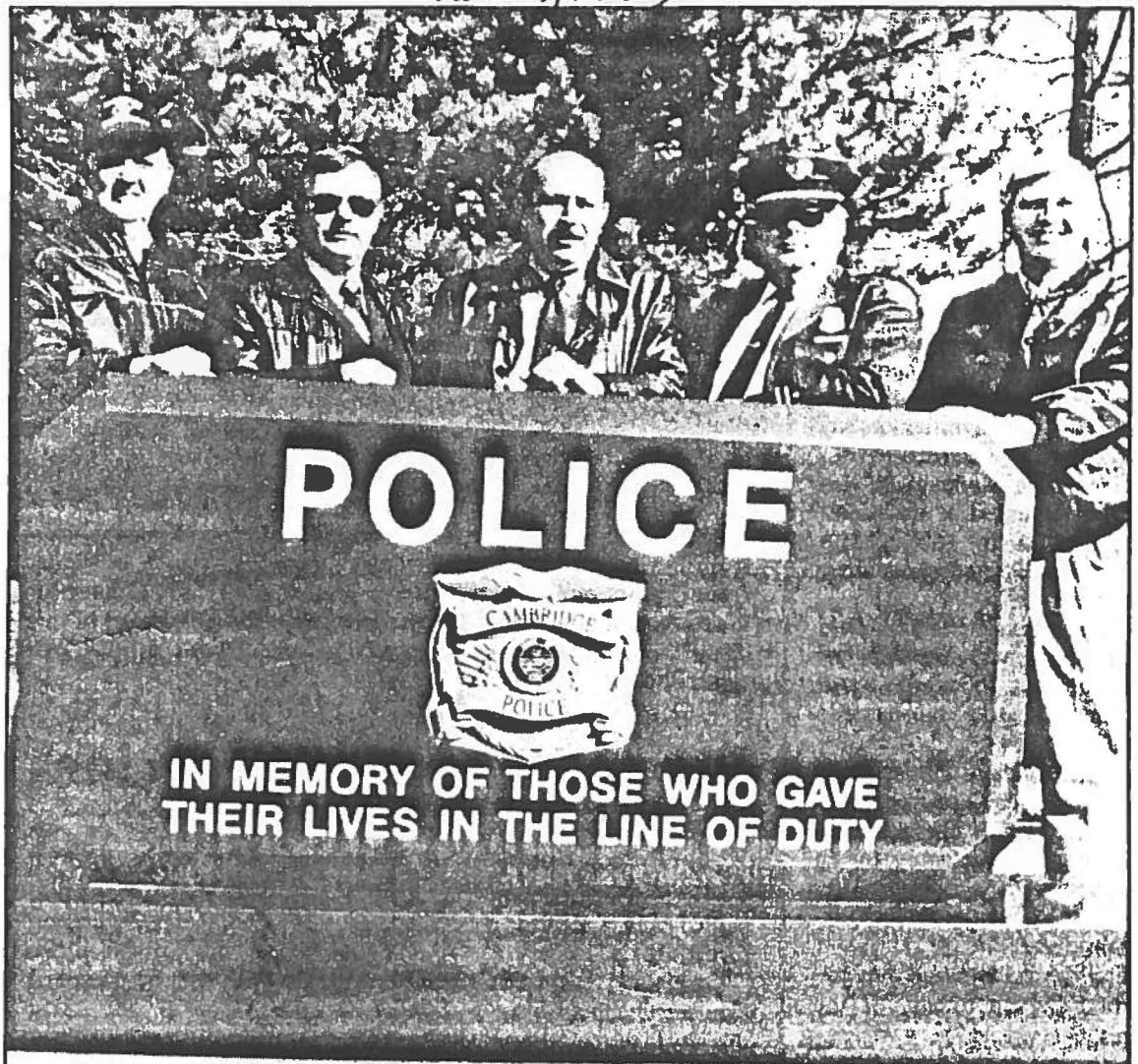

Police memorial unveiled at park

In the mid-1980s, a letter was received by Cambridge City Council requesting a monument be erected honoring Cambridge police who have died or may die in the line of duty.

On Monday, the "Cambridge Police Memorial" was unveiled at City Park.

A memorial stone is also fea-

tured at the site, in memory of Cambridge police Lt. Jerry E. Dragosin, who died in the line of duty on Aug. 21, 1984.

The front center of the black granite monument features a design replica of the Cambridge Police Department's hat badge, which is chiseled into the stone using a process called "in relief," said Terry Myers of Cambridge Monuments, where the stone was purchased.

Beveled edges accentuate the smooth finish of the massive stone.

It reads: "In memory of those who gave their lives in the line of duty."

The backside, from 2nd Corinthians 1:3-4 in the Bible, says, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our

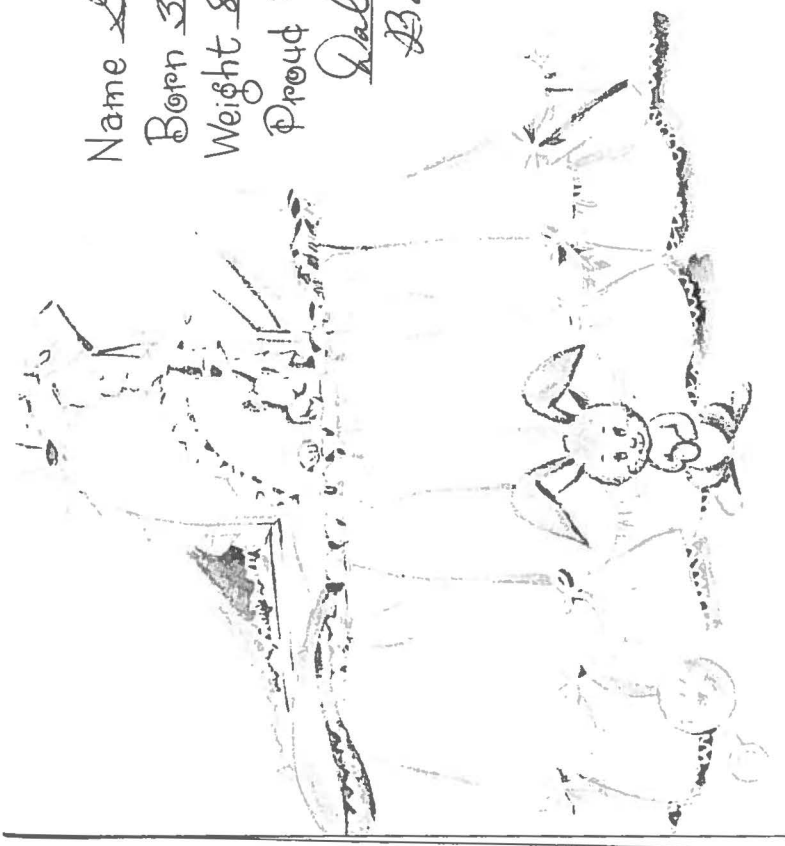

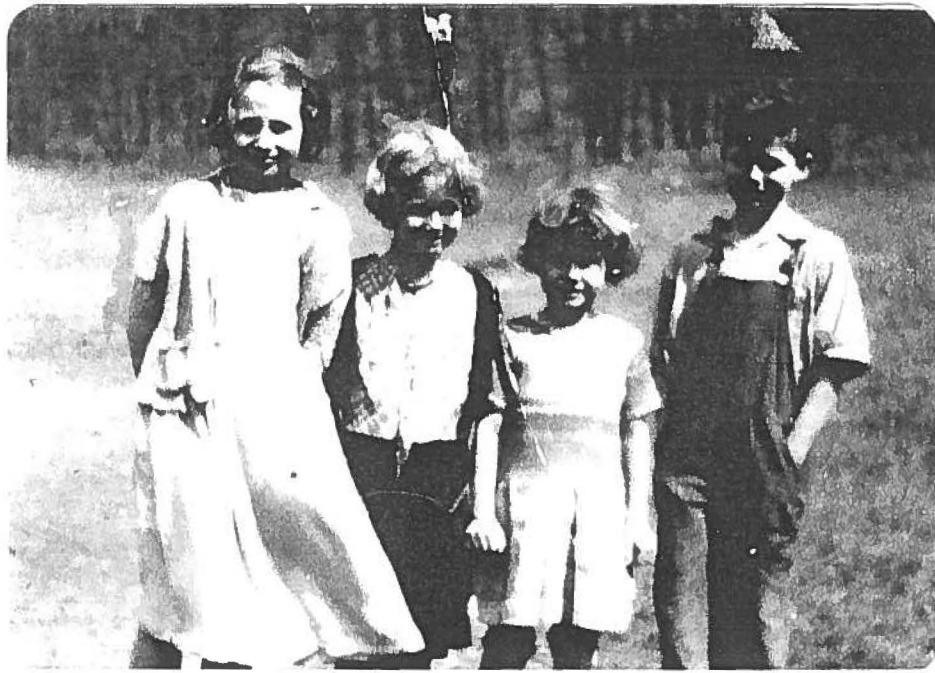

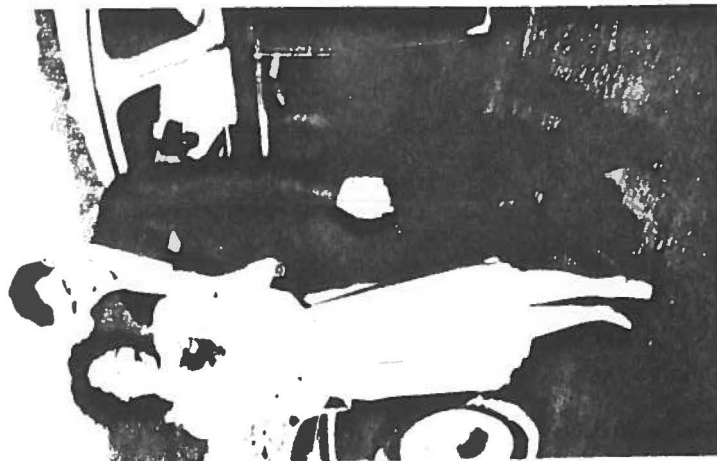

Learning about nature

Science classroom moves outdoors

Boys and girls rushed to gather around a classmate holding a small plastic sack.

Cries of "look at that" and "I'm claiming it - it was in my plot" drew the attention of others.

The object of their fascination?

A brown spider the size of a quarter being attacked by a carpenter ant just a tenth its size.

Such a prize would only be coveted by the Newcomerstown High students in Richard Wright's biology class, who have spent this week probing rotting logs, looking

under tree bark and collecting plants for their ecology report.

Their report culminates months of book study on the plants, animals and insects in their environment.

Wright assigns students to prepare the report as their final examination because he believes that if you tell a child something, he might remember it for a day or so, but if you show him - he'll remember it forever.

Operating on that theory, he has taken each of his biology classes of the past 20 years to the Tuscarawas River flowing only a few hundred yards behind the school - the perfect "classroom" in which to show

students what exists in the world around them, demonstrate how all is dependent on everything else and the impact of man on the environment.

"All year long we study the groups of plants, animals and insects. At the end of the year, rather than giving a written exam where they just review what they've learned, we come out here where they can actually see what they've studied and how everything interacts," Wright explained.

"Then they write their ecology report. Even if these kids never do anything with science again, it provides them with some-

thing to help them appreciate nature.

"Although some people feel knowing about nature isn't important, I feel that everyone needs to know basic ecology in order to help appreciate global problems like the greenhouse effect," he said.

A new appreciation for the environment was quite evident among the students as they charted the prominent features of their plots and tried to identify the plants, animals and insects collected within it.

Even into the fourth day of their project, students were excited by the wriggling mosquito larvae found in a puddle of water.

Lee Fish expressed the feelings of many when he said "I didn't know things like this existed."

Julie Mizer, a sophomore who hopes to major in behavioral primatology when she enters college, said the ecology report was one of the most fun things she had done in the class all year.

"You actually get to do something, not just learn from a book. You can literally see the impact of pollution and people on the environment," she said.

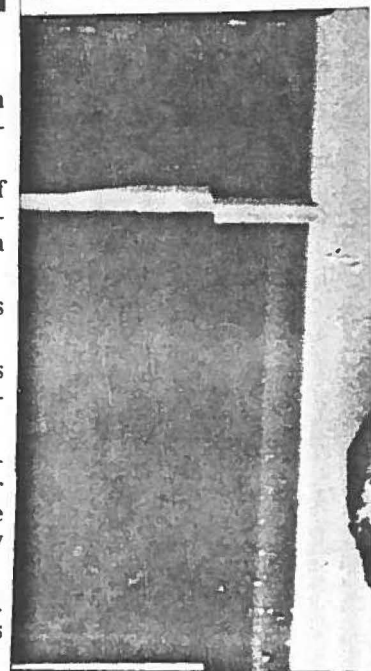
As Ebony Barker searched through a piece of rotting wood for more sow bugs to add to her collection, she explained that she hopes to become a fashion designer.

"But I like learning about plants and animals too," Barker said.

"I also want to dabble in chemistry and physics - I'm curious, I just want to know about everything," she added.

Allen Fish said he had never paid much attention to the insects and plants around him or thought much about throwing litter onto the ground, but because of the ecology report, he now feels differently.

"See that trash out there in the river?" he asked. "I didn't care before, but now I know how it affects everything and when I see that, it bothers me."

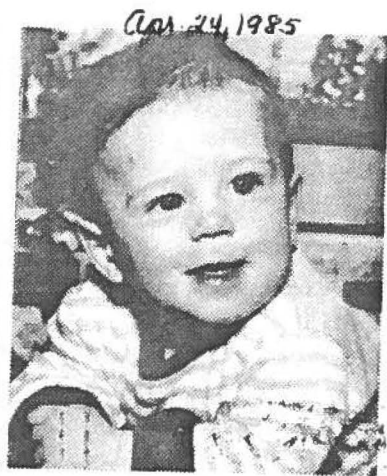

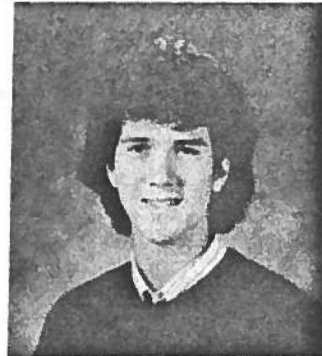

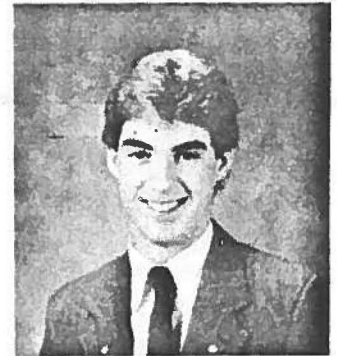

Trojan boys claim district track

ZANESVILLE - It's become a familiar scene, almost to the point of looking more like an instant replay.

The 1600 relay has just been completed, and fans are beginning to file out of the stadium.

But before they do, the final team scores are announced and members of the Tusky Valley boys' team return to the track to hold their trophy aloft.

It happened at the Tornado Relays. It happened at the Principals' Athletic Conference meet. And it happened again Saturday at the Division II district meet here.

The Trojans won their first district championship since 1984 by scoring 101 points to outdistance second-place Dover by 19 points. Sandy Valley was third in the 11-team district with 70 points, while Claymont ended up fourth with 50.

The girls' competition ended in a tie between St. Clairsville and Martins Ferry, both of which had 65 points. Tusky Valley was third with 45 points.

"In the past, we always just wanted to get kids to advance," said Tusky Valley coach John Hurst. "This year we left more kids in more events because we have more depth. Winning a district title ranks right up there.

"We won a district title when I was the girls' basketball coach and that was great, but this ranks right up there with it. The kids performed as well as I thought they could... It's a good feeling."

J.P. Ragon, Jason Addington and Jed Emley were the primary reasons for that.

Ward qualified for regional action at North Canton - the top four individuals advanced - in four different events to lead the way.

He finished fourth in the 100 at 11.5, second in the 200 at 23.5, and ran on the first-place 1600 relay team and second-place 400 relay team.

"I had a bad start in the 100, but I was able to make up a lot of ground at the end," said Ward. "In the 200, I was first around the turn, but ran out of gas. It really feels good to win the team title. If we ran our best, we thought we could win it."

They thought right. Jason Addington was his usual strong self, winning the 1600 in 4:25.5 and the 3200 in 9:37.8.

"It gets tougher and tougher each week," said Addington, who makes it look just the opposite. "That heat was killing me in the 3200. By the second lap of the 1600 I had the lead and I thought my time was OK. But the heat was more intense during the 3200 and I felt terrible.

"It's good to see the whole team pulling together. Winning the team title is the first step towards where we all want to be."

Addington won the 1600, as Indian Valley's John Fivecoat finished right behind him. Tusky Valley's Chris Cave ran a 4:30 to grab the final regional berth, while Claymont's Brock Scott finished fifth with a strong time of 4:31.5.

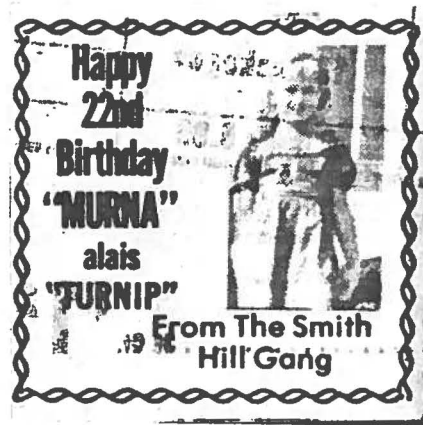

Mayor's Court eliminated

his first meeting as mayor, the "Packy" McFarland put his name to a new era by eliminating the Mayor's Court in Newcomerstown.

Mayor McFarland said all citations will now be sent to Southern District Court in Uhrichsville. Police Chief James Friel is checking with officials there to see if waivers will be paid locally.

Atty. Thomas Little, village solicitor, said the decision really won't make that much of a difference, noting that any domestic violence

cases, contested cases and any second charge of driving while intoxicated were already being sent to Southern District Court.

Atty. Little also said Mayor McFarland's decision wouldn't mean any loss of revenue, saying that when village police cite violators under village ordinances, the fines will come back to the village anyway. If violators are charged under state statutes, the money will stay in Southern District Court.

Chief Friel said he was satisfied with the decision, because of the liability

of the village mayor in deciding cases without adequate legal training. Former mayor Kelly Ault had taken some training for mayor's court through the state.

In other action, council came out of a 45-minute executive session with a split decision on new committee assignments appointed by Mayor McFarland. Committee chairmen include: Earl McCormick, water and sewage; Sue Simmons, safety and recreation; Jan Alles, finance and long range planning; Weldon Little, buildings and community develop-

ment; Virgil Bliss, streets, sidewalks and grounds; and Chet Sharrock, legislation and personnel. Bliss and McCormick voted against the committee assignments.

Simmons was approved as president of council and was also approved to be clerk when Clerk Treasurer Don Porcher was absent. Simmons was sworn in to her council term prior to the council meeting. Other council members beginning their terms were sworn in on Jan. 30.

Council also:

— Heard a complaint from Starns of Newcomerstown, saying vehicles parked in front of K&K Kasch Inc. made it difficult to see at the intersection of State Street and Martin Luther King Drive. The comment was to be turned over to street committee.

— Passed an emergency ordinance for a two percent pay increase for employees, effective Jan. 1.

— Approved Mayor McFarland's appointment of former mayor Ault to a three-year term to the Tuscarawas County Regional Planning Commission.

— Asked Atty. Little to draw an ordinance for hiring him as solicitor for the next year.

— Did not take action on a request to approve payment of \$6,416.82 for work on a sewer line to Express Packaging in the Newcomerstown Industrial Park, because the work has not been approved by the engineering firm of W.E. Quicksall Associates.

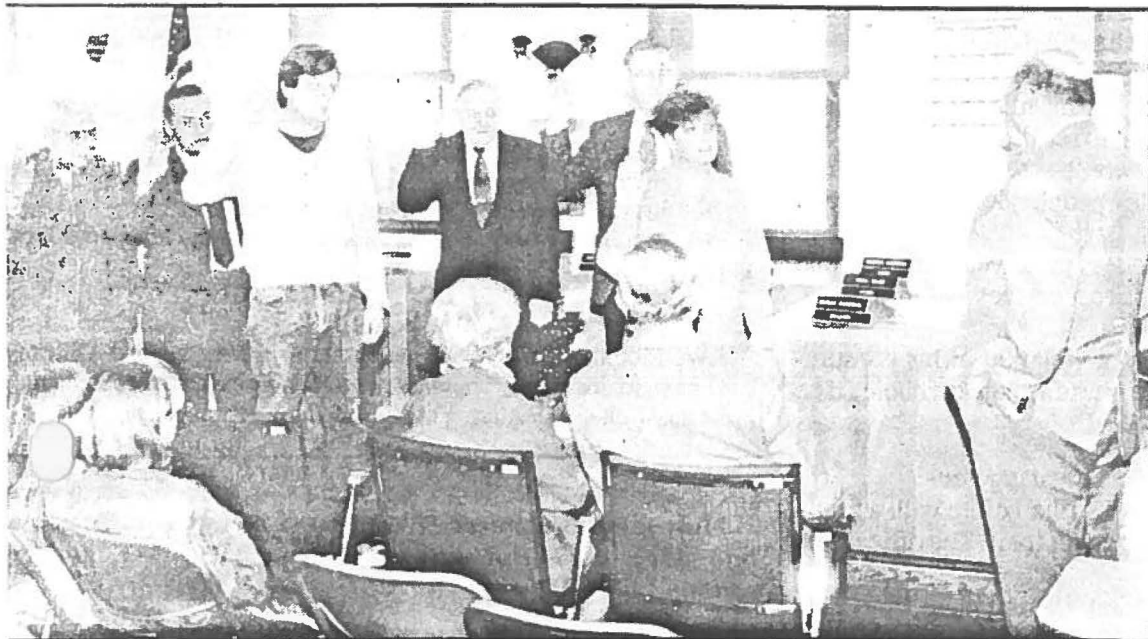
— Waived residency requirements of the street commission and approved the appointment of Paul Davis in that position for 1993.

— Changed the next meeting from Jan. 17, Martin Luther King Day, to Jan. 24.

— Heard Mayor McFarland thank former mayor Ault for his help during the transition period.

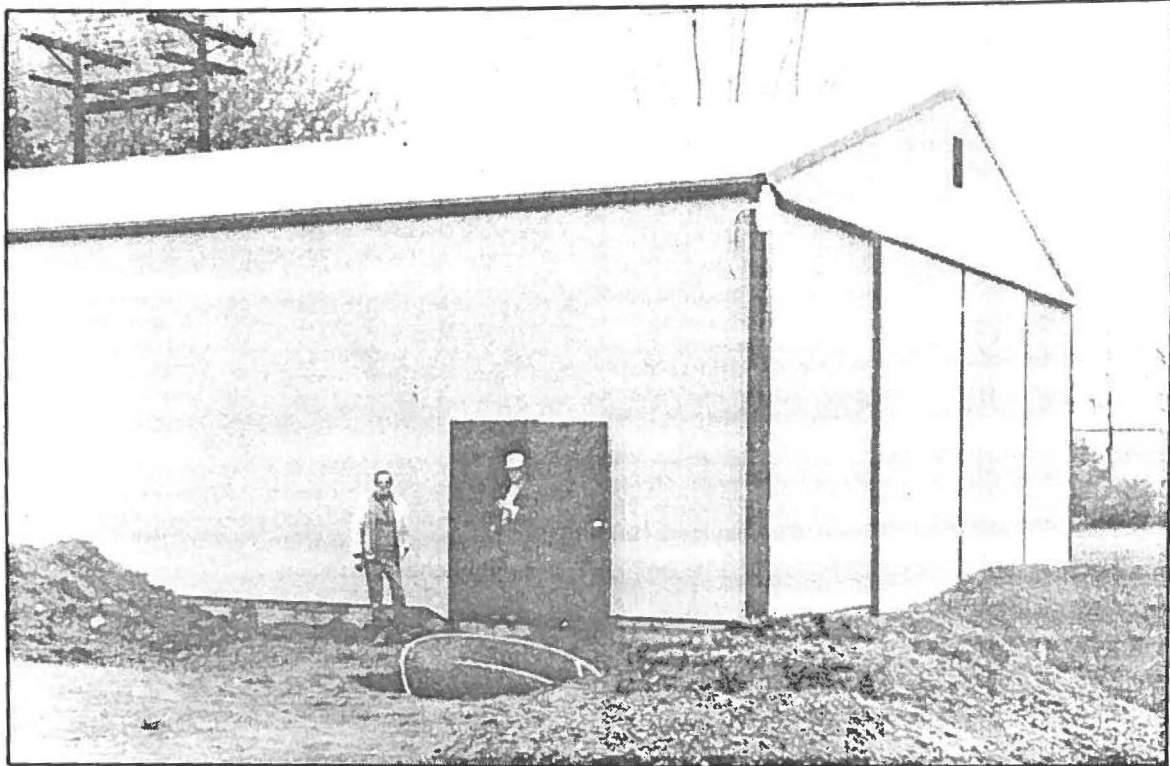
— Heard a report from the clerk treasurer that income tax collections for 1993 were down \$62,137 from 1992; however, that is because the village collected one-half percent less than the year before. Much of 1993.

— Heard Chief Friel report that seven of nine recent car break-ins have been solved and three more were to be charged.

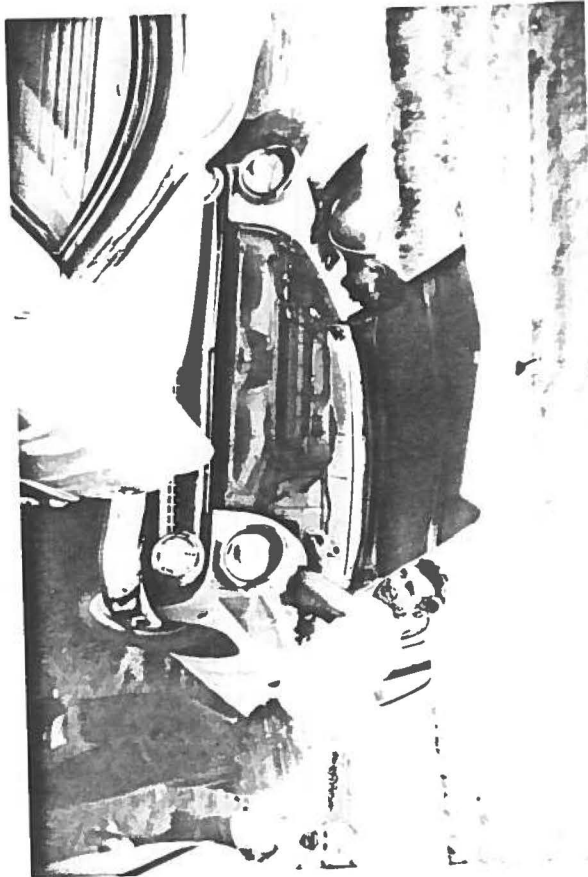
Open house marks 25th anniversary

5-Mill Additional Levy Set for Vote at Nc'town

NEWCOMERSTOWN — The board of education, at a special unannounced meeting Tuesday night passed a resolution placing an additional 5-mill levy for operation on the November ballot. The district anticipates a \$79,000 deficit by June 30, 1970.

In a news release concerning the session, the board also stated the present bond levy will be reduced a half mill due to an increase in reappraisal of local property. Combined with last year's one-mill reduction, it means an increase of 3.5 mills in 1970 over the 1968 rate for schools if the levy passes.

Supt. Harold Shingler stated the increase is "necessary to maintain present educational programs" and points out the local schools have progressed tremendously the past few years, both in facilities and curriculum and that the administration and board wishes to maintain the present level of education.

In other board action, Lawrence Groff, 63, of Walnut st. was employed as a regular bus driver, Mrs. Evelyn Ahle was named head cook at West school and Mrs. Dorothy Baker was employed as library aide for middle and elementary schools. Mrs. Clara Beal was approved as a substitute teacher for the school year. Shingler was also given permission to employ a cashier at West school for 2 hours per day.



Genuine love works two ways.

In a country of plenty that has worked so hard to share with others, it is a comfort to talk to those who have been in a foreign country for 4½ years and hear them say that Americans are loved there.

That is one of the messages brought back to Newcomerstown by Gene and Sherrie (Baker) Foltz from a 4½ year stay in Thailand with the New Tribes Missions. Mr. and Mrs. Foltz and their two children are on leave and will return to Thailand in September.

The Foltz's entered the New Tribes Mission in February of 1978 after completion of Bible College in Florida. The teacher of the World Missions Class was director of the New Tribes Mission "boot camp" in Oviedo, Fla., and Mr. and Mrs. Foltz said he challenged them to enter the mission.

Sherrie, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Baker of Newcomerstown, said, "After much consideration, we felt this was what we should do so we filled out our applications and were accepted that week. We packed and joined the boot camp training within five days."

The boot camp is one year of studying the culture of the country, more Bible study, and then a period of practical experience.

"We learned to live in the jungle," Sherrie said. "This part of the training was spent in the Everglades of Florida, building our homes and living off the land. This six-week period helped to prepare us for living with tribal people."

In January of 1979, Gene and Sherrie moved to Camdendon, Mo., to take language training for 18-months.

Gene said, "We learned to write language phonetically, write alphabets for language that has never been recorded, and then also how to teach tribal people how to read and write their own language.

We also had to take medical training specifically for topical living. This was quite an enjoyable part of our training."

During the training at Camdendon, Gene and Sherrie were preparing to go to Paupa, New Guinea. They were approached by the executive committee to leave within six months for Thailand to open a school for missionary children.

On Nov. 27, 1979, Gene and Sherrie left for Thailand.

Missionaries with the New Tribes Missions live in Bangkok for one year after arrival for an extensive eight-hour a day study of Central Thailand. Once the proficiency test is passed, the next move is into a village. There, the missionary begins to study and learn the tribal language.

The objective of New Tribes Mission is to teach all the tribes in Thailand.

Gene said, "For the next six months, we studied Thai, and in June of 1980, we began to prepare to move to Northern Thailand to open our school for all of the missionary children. At this time, 10 sets of bunk beds were built and we purchased food in bulk, because we would 'dorm parents' for 15 children.

"We moved to Chiang Mai on Sept. 1 and the school opened Sept. 22. It was great! The parents were so glad to have a place to send their children and we were happy to serve in this way."

For their four years there, Gene was school administrator, principal, bookkeeper, maintenance man, and dorm dad. Sherrie taught advanced swimming, girls physical education, and home economics, besides being a mother for 15 children. This included cooking, sewing, driving and all the other odd jobs which mothers have.

When Gene and Sherrie arrived in Thailand in 1979, their daughter, Jana, was two-years-old, and their son, Jonathan, was five-months-old. To Jan and Jonathan, Thailand is

home. Jana spoke the Thai language fluently within one year and Jonathan has grown up bilingual.

Because they were so small when they went to Thailand, there was no adjustment problem to the Thai culture, but there has been an adjustment to the culture they faced on their return to the United States.

Some of their initial impressions included: Delight over Saturday morning cartoons, surprise that one store could have so much candy, a toy store, snow and sledding, shooting guns with their grandpa and riding tractors, carpeting, not eating rice everyday and why everyone speaks English.

"We believe our time in Thailand is priceless," Sherrie said, "as it really strengthened us as a family. When you experience rabies, floods, being robbed 10 times within two months, and numerous other experiences, you look to each other and to the Lord. We really appreciate our friends and neighbors; they were always there when we were in trouble."

Gene added, "They looked out for Sherrie and the kids when I had to travel to the other villages or to Bangkok.

Sherrie said the people are very friendly and always interested in "farangs" (any white person).

"They love the white skin and hair and a day never went by that someone didn't rub our faces or arms to see how we felt," she said. "We really miss our friends but it is great to be home."

The climate in Thailand is very warm and the natives dress to suit that climate. The men wear bright colored loin cloths and the women wear a loose wrap-around garment. Their very colorful handmade clothes are works of art. The very smallest of cross-stitching is the chief decor. Should a woman develop eye problems from this close work, they stop at a roadside market and purchase a magnifying glass or a second-hand pair of glasses (shipped in from another country). Much of their time, effort, and money is spent making a fancy head covering.

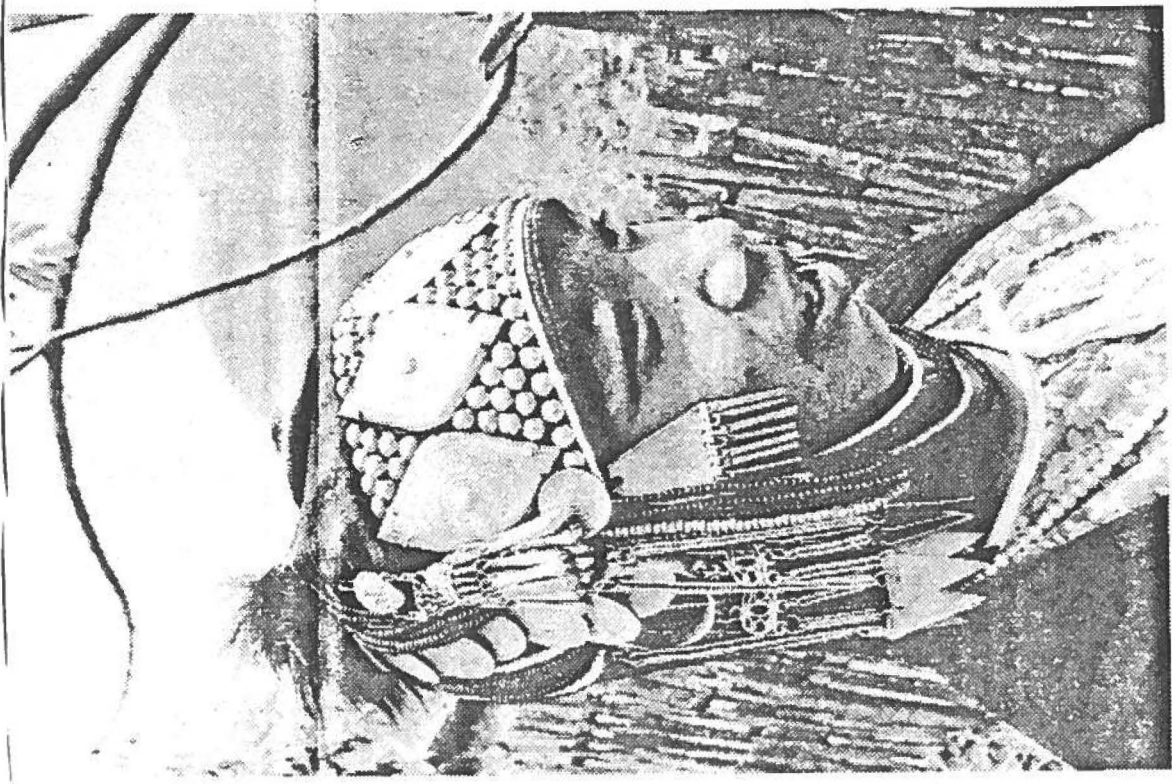
Sherrie and Gene are currently giving presentations about their work in Thailand and will be speaking to members of the Together

The Business Technology Department at the Tuscarawas

Campus of Kent State University offers associate of applied business degrees in accounting technology, business management technology and office technology.

Office technology program became available at the campus in 1972 and accounting and business were added in 1976.

A consistent growth pattern characterizes the student enrollment in these programs.

The department has maintained an annual average of 160 students since 1983, but in the fall of 1987 the number peaked at 196.

The number of adult students in the department also continues to grow creating a stimulating student mix in the classroom.

Success of these programs is attributed to an excellent curriculum, a well-qualified and caring faculty, state-of-the-art equipment, an active placement program and support of the business community.

Additional support comes from the Business Technology Advisory Committee, formed in 1977.

Accounting technology features a core of general accounting courses encompassing financial and managerial accounting. Specialty courses in cost and tax accounting also are required.

Graduates of this program find employment in local manufacturing, banks, public accounting firms and civil service. Most of the credits in TusCampus' accounting and business management programs are applicable toward a four-year business degree.

Office technology offers a choice of five curricular options, three of them secretarial oriented and geared to a student's previous skill development, work experience and career goals.

Students in office management or office information specialist options take courses that give them the competitive edge in today's electronic office of word processing, electronic spreadsheets and computer data bases.

Equipped with such a wide variety of skills, office technology graduates are in great demand by employers. In addition, many of the courses in this degree are applicable toward a bachelor degree in business and vocational education.

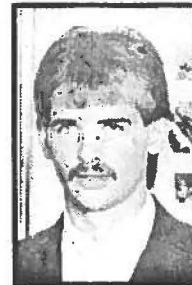

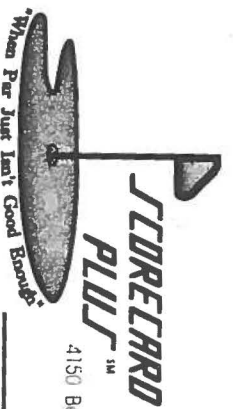

Arrowhead Clinic has 10th anniversary here

Arrowhead Clinic in Newcomerstown is celebrating its 10th anniversary in 1989.

Started in 1979 by Dr. Terry Overholser, it has now grown to a two-physician practice. Dr. Overholser started practice here in September, 1974 and soon realized the need for a larger facility with a multi-physician concept. In 1985, Dr. Fred Shoff joined the practice. The clinic now has a visiting surgeon, Dr. Jose Sayat, and a podiatrist, Dr. John Vanko. audiology testing is available with Don Trizzino.

In the past 15 years, medicine has undergone a drastic transformation, according to Dr. Overholser, as more diagnostic workups can be done as an out-patient. Dr. Overholser and Dr. Shoff can now do 24-hour holter cardiac monitoring, EKG's and X-rays. There are over 30 laboratory tests that can be done in the office.

Recently, a blood chemistry analyzer was purchased which can predict coronary artery disease based on a patient's cardiac risk factors, such as age, sex, blood pressure and diabetic history. Cholesterol "frac-

tionation" can be performed to show a patient how to lower their personal heart risk. Also, liver, renal and thyroid function profiles can be done at the patient visit. X-ray and pulmonary function testing are also available.

Currently, the clinic has seven employees: a registered nurse, three medical assistants, two receptionists and a medical secretary.

Arrowhead Clinic is also the location for the Newcomerstown satellite of Community Professional Services, with Anne Snyder as director. Also housed in the clinic's basement are KMB Dance Studio and Norman's Photo Studio.

Dr. Overholser said future plans include trying to maintain a modern practice concept and that keeping up with new concepts and treatments in medicine is a full-time concern.

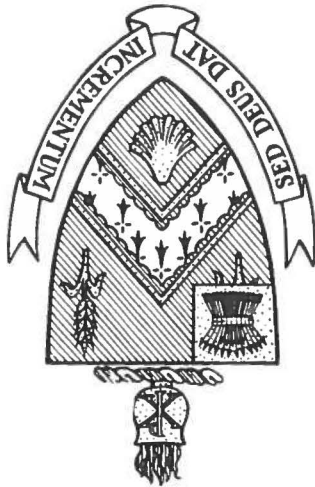
