Hans George Gerster, a Swiss Emigrant, who came to Germantown in 1736 related the story about the passengers on the "Friendship" & their rough voyage.

Because of the raging storms at sea, the loss of provisions and their cooking kettles, they were without proper food & water, and were soon subject to all sorts of diseases. Children were attacked first and died in large numbers. According to Gerster "nearly 60 people from the Canton of Basle died mostly from hunger" and perhaps disease. Gerster also relates the sad story of the Wagner family

The dumb man of Rumberg has arrived safely, a Swiss woman of the Canton of Berne has received him, one child, a little boy is still living with him. The other child, with the father & mother (brother & brother's wife) have died on the sea.

This account seems to coincide perfectly with our family records which have been handed down from generation to generation, namely that Jacob Wagner came to Philadelphia from Switzerland in 1770 - born in 1732 (June 1st) was orphaned on the passage across the sea by the much dreaded Black Plague and his parents consigned to an ocean burial.

In the Publication "Pennsylvania German Pioneers" we find that Hiney Wagner was listed among the passengers of the Ship "Friendship" (List T5A). Only male members over 16 years old listed.

Apparently Martin Wagner had a reasonable amount of money when he left Switzerland but our family records reveal that young Jacob in order to pay his passage was bound out to a farmer with whom he remained until he was 19 yrs of age. He was cruelly treated and during the ^{severe} winter, his feet were frozen from the lack of proper shoes.

It is said one could track him in the snow to school by the bloodstains. His feet never fully recovered from this tragic experience.

There was one child of whose birth no record was preserved, mention has been made that George had a twin brother Benjamin.

Very little data is available in tracing the movements of Jacob Waggoner from the time he finished his service with the farmer until he went to Rock Hill, Bucks Co. to learn the blacksmith trade. Here he met and married Maria Catharina Bauer or Bauerin.

9 of their 12 children were born in Bucks Co.

The origin and History of the Waggoner.

The name Wagner - Wagoner - Waggoner is said to have two distinct derivations, being chiefly of German origin and having reference to the occupation of its first forebears as wheelwrights or cartwrights.

Wagner is one of the most popular German names but it is said an English family had the name Wagoner or Waggoner which derived its title from the occupation as a Wagoner or carter. We sometimes see the old English spelling of wagon as Waggon

In the early part of the 18th Century, British subjects outnumbered all other immigrants in Pa.

All other subjects were classed as "foreigners" and some were compelled to spell their names in conformity with the English language. This may explain in part the spelling of our name Waggoner

Jacob .. was a boy of seven or eight when he arrived in Pa. When he started to school, his teacher may have been an English or Irish schoolmaster who spelled the name Waggoner. Jacobs sons kept this spelling altho in later generations we find all three spellings.

German and Swiss Migration

In the 18th Century, a great exodus from the southern part of Germany along the Rhine River, better known as the Palatinate, took place.

The .. described as a most beautiful country, highly cultivated fields, vineclad hills, and enchanting scenery ceased to exist in 1801.

About 30,000 Germans and Switzers landed in Philadelphia between the years 1727 and 1776. Their towns & churches, villages had been burned, their property confiscated or destroyed, their Churches & Schools ruined, and finding no peace or security in their own land, they fled from this tyranny & religious persecution to make a home in the New World.

In 1681, the British Crown owed Admiral Penn, W^m Penn's father, a debt of 16,000 pounds, to liquidate this debt King Charles II granted W^m Penn 40,000 sq miles of territory in America, This province was later known as Pennsylvania. Penn also a victim of religious intolerance and persecution, sympathized with the Rhinelanders, and invited them to come to Pa. where he assured them the right to worship God according to the dictates of their conscience.
