# **Death ruled** 'drowning

#### NIKI WOLFE NEWCOMERSTOWN NEWS

The official autopsy report has been released in the death of a 17-year old Newcomerstown male who's body was recovered in the Tuscarawas River.

Coshocton County Coroner Dr. Robert Gwinn reported that the death of Bryan R. "Rusty" Grewell, 17, of Newcomerstown, was caused by drowning.

He, reportedly, went swimming or "floating" in the Tuscarawas River, and went under the water (near Beech Street, Newcomerstown) and did not resurface on Sunday, Aug. 10. Rescue personnel and dive tearn members were not been able to locate him in the river after days of searching due to the rain-swollen river and dangerous currents.

Finally, on the sixth day, his body was recovered in the river near State Route 751.

Rusty is the son of Bryan T. Grewell of Newcomerstown and Kelly (Rodgers) Johnson and husband Steve of Fredricktown.

He was a sophomore Newcomerstown at High School. He played "Romeo" in "Ladies Sigh No More" presented by the NHS Thespians in 2013.


