FIFTY-ONE YEARS AGO FROM THE "VISITOR"

The News is indebted to Geo. A. Beers for access to the files of "The Newcomerstown Visitor" the first issue of which was published June 7, 1871, by Johns, Beach & Beers. It was largely through the efforts of one of the owners, Dr. A. M. Beers, deceased, that the paper was established.

The first and succeeding issues of the Visitor carry a large number of advertisements for that day, but most of the paper is devoted to editorials, local news and selected short stories, all prepared in excellent style.

Following were the village officers fifty-one years ago: C. F. Davis mayor, H. G. Little clerk, F. M. Swan marshal. Councilmen-Hon. G. B. Smith, Hon. A. J. Wilkin, I. B. Vogenitz, Wm. Marlatt, Wm. Neighbor, C. F. Hicks.

The churches were represented as follows: Lutheran church, U. J. Knisely pastor; Methodist Episcopal church, S. A. Thompson pastor; Methodist Protestant church, H. B. Knight pastor.

HOW WE'VE GROWN.

Newcomerstown as it Was in 1872. Nearly 30 Years Ago.

From the Newcomerstown In-DEPENDENT, published by Johns & Beers, a copy of which was left at this office by Mrs. Hannah Wilgus in competition for our street-fair prizes, we glean a few items which will interest many of our readers. The paper is dated March 20, 1872. and contains a well-written article on the business enterprises of the town, its superb location, and fu-ture prospects. The town had its public-spirited citizens then, as it now has. Citizens who were ever ready to speak a good word for the town, advance its interests and

push it to the front.

At that time Newcomerstown had but one railroad, the Pan Handle. Its population was about 1000. It contained one bank, the "Tuscarawas Valley Bank," two hotels, one wholesale and retail hardware store, one boot and shoe store, five dry goods stores, four groceries, two drug stores, two provisions stores, three boot and shoe shops, one cigar factory, one saddle and harness shop, ane millinery store, two dressmakers, one broom factory, two tanneries, three blacksmith shops, two wagon and carriage factories, two stove and hollowware stores, three tin shops, two merchant tailor stores, two cooper shops, one barber shop, two planing mills, one flouring mill, three cabinet shops and undertakers, one dentist, one photograph gallery, one jewelry store, one bakery, two silversmiths, one gunsmith, one pottery, one woolen factory, one saw mill, one livery, one cornet band, three lawyers, five physicians, three ministers, churches, one college, one graded union school, three secret societies, one newspaper and job office, and other branches of industry. canal traffic was an important The town factor at that time. possessed then, as it does now, "many peculiar advantages of which the passing traveler and capitalist would do well to take notice."

Newcomerstown Visitor FROM 1871

Excerpts from the July 5, 1871, Volume 2, Number 28, edition of The Newcomerstown Visitor reveal interesting life in the village almost a hundred and fifty years ago. The newspaper which was Newcomerstown's very first newspaper was owned by Johns, Beech, and Beers at that time, and was published in a building that was once located where Dick's Place is now, at the corner of Bridge & Canal Street.

Nugen, was rescued from a watery grave in the canal by Mrs. Wm. Neighbor. Appleasant social function was given at the home of Philip Sheets, sr., where a nice supper was served and the guests entertained with music on the organ by their daughter

Concerning the editor Mr. Johns, while publishing the Eye, also acted in the capacity of Notary Public and Conveyancer, and invited parties interested to call atthe printing office. A few years later in the eighties, he disposed of his printing office and formed a partnership in the drug business with Dr. C. W. Wilkin, and later conducted the drug business himself, occupying a portion of Dr. Beer's office building which then stood on the northeast corner of Main and Bridge streets. Without going further into details, it may be added that Mr. Johns is sur-vived by his widow, Mrs. Margaret Johns, and daughter, Mrs. W. C. Schott, both of whom reside in New Philadelphia, also Mrs. Winifred Johns Miskimen of Newcomerstown.







The Ritz a Modern Theatre

Beauty, safety and substantial comfort—these were the governing principals in the building of the new Ritz Theatre by the Twin City Theatre Company. How well these important factors have been incorporated into this playhouse is attested by the fact that the Ritz stands as the finest theatre in Tuscarawas or surrounding counties.

The Ritz theatre is located on Bridge street near the corner of Canal and Bridge sts., and on the old Ohio Canal bed that was abandoned several years ago.

The building is of steel and brick construction, with a frontage of fifty feet and one hundred and seventy feet in length. The front of the building is constructed of brown matt face brick in mingled shades, presenting an impressive picture to the passerby. Over the entrance there is a marquise extending over the sidewalk to the street. Underneath, electric lights blaze away at night. At each side of the entrance are store rooms. The second floor of the building is occupied by living apartments which are the last word in convenience.

Upon entering the vestibule of the theatre the spectator is immediately impressed with the fact that the ticket office, lighting fixtures, ornamental plastering, theatrical frames and the most minute details, all comprise a harmonious effect.

Leaving the vestibule, one enters the lobby, oramented in the same style as the vestibule and from which the main auditorium is reached. On the right as you enter the foyer is a door leading to the projection room and manager's office. At the extreme right of the foyer is the men's smoking room. On this side directly above is the manager's office. This room is so situated as to enable him to have immediate access to any part of the building through a buzzer system, and so give him an opportunty to

get in touch with any situation that might arise without disturbing the audience. All lights in the theatre are controlled from this office, particularly the exit lights and all side wall lights being on an independent wiring system.

On the left is the ladies' retiring room with toilets in connection which are of the latest type of modern construction, equipped in a thoroughly sanitary fashion. Drinking fountains will be found in the foyer, with cold running water.

An innovation in the Ritz theatre is the Cry Room and Children's Play Room, where mothers with small children and infants may go and view the picture through sound-proof glass and feel assured that the crying infants will in no way disturb the patrons. The children can be amused with the numerous toys procry room is handsomely furnished vided in the room adjoining. The in wicker and the same decorations are carried out as throughout the theatre. This room is equipped in case a patron may need immediate relaxation or medical attention.

High over your heads as you enter the foyer is the projection room, a room of solid concrete and steel. Lined up in this room with their lens pointing through a space provided in the wall is a bottery of two projection machines and a color spot light. The walls are a maze of switches that at a touch, flood the theatre with different colors of light as desired. The operator by pressing a button automatically opens the front curtain as well as the second on the stage, the auditorium lights go out and the moving picture starts. There are also rewind tables for inspecting the film and rewinding. A fireproof film cabinet to store reels when not in use is one of the important features of this room. There are fireproof doors and automatic fire-proof shutters which isolate it from the remainder of the building. There are toilets, wash room, and room for advertising matter adjoining.

The auditorium is properly ranged in such a manner that every one of the six hundred seats have a per-



fect view of the screen. There are four convenient aisles and sufficient exists that the theatre when filled can be emptied within two minutes. The moving picture screen is of the finest obtainable. The front or main curtain is of velvet in taupe color. The second is of steel gray matching the stage settings. The stage is fully equipped with footlights, stage plugs and border lights capable of giving any desired lighting effects.

The magnificent organ is a Hilgren-Lane, three manual type, with pipes and other muscial instruments built in the lofts at right and left of the auditorium. The console is located at the right of the orchestra pit and has an electrically operated air machine housed in the rear of the building.

The heating arrangement is the last word in construction. The auditorium is heated with hot air being illuminated with chandeliers of the newest type, operated on a two-circuit system giving soft indirect light of various colors. Over every exit door there are provided separate emergency lights independent of the main house system.

One of the most important features of this theatre building, and filling a long needed improvement to our community is that of rest rooms which we will maintain for the public. Second, some two thousand theatre owners of the United States and Canada have perfected a system by which each submits to a trade publication a report of his experience with each picture exhibited. Each tells what his patrons thought of the picture and whether many or few came to see it. Thus the first few who show the picture inform the others of its entertainment value through this publication.

Taking this information with that which we already have at hand relative to the need of that type of picture, we then determine just what reception that particular picture will receive if exhibited at this theatre.

high smoke stacks. They not only made the bricks but erected the stacks. Some of the huge stacks at the smelters in Colorado were erected by this company.

J.D. Longshore operated a piano and organ factory for a time in a building where the Reeves Bank now

stands.

In 1901 and 1902, a company was organized here to erect a sheet mill to be erected west of Newcomerstown and adjacent to the Pennsylvania Railroad. This was done and the plant operated for a few years but competition from larger plants became so keen that this little plant was forced to close.

About 1900, a gentleman named White arrived here from New York. He announced that he intended to build a city called White City just east of Newcomerstown.

He opened an office with several imported draftsmen and a surveying crew. Then to proceeded to take options on about 600 acres of good level farming land. Soon the surveyors were at work, and in no time the draftsmen had it all projected on paper; several parks, hundreds of building lots, and the lot along the railroad reserved for manufacturing. With this all done, Mr. White went to New York to secure the necessary financial aid, which sorry to say, was not forthcoming. The bubble burst, the farmers went on plowing their fields and that was the end of White City.

The James B. Clow Company had a plant at New Phildelphia, Ohio, manufacturing cast iron pipe. This

plant burned and the company decided to build at Newcomerstown, after public spirited citizens subscribed sufficient funds to buy a location.

This plant started in 1895 and manufactured cast iron pipe in sizes varying from four inches to 48 inches. Later a gas steam radiator department was added.

In 1911, the pipe foundry was moved to Coshocton. The only reason assigned at that time was that Coshocton offered more money than Newcomerstown could afford. Later the radiator department was also moved, so today nothing but a few memories and a bunch of empty foundry buildings remain. (Today there are a number of industries sharing the building.)

The Kurz-Kasch Company, a branch of a Dayton firm located here a few years ago, providing employment for many. They manufactured molded plastic pieces.

Groovfold Fabricators started their plant here in 1963. They are located in what was once the Ford Garage.

The Globe Specialties, a commercial sewing company, started operations here several years ago.

The Simonds Saw and Steel Company now owns and operates the Heller Bros. Company, which the company had purchased the Rex File Company, a locally owned concern. Simonds acquired the plant in 1955 and changed the name to Heller Tool Co.

During the Heller Brothers' ownership, the plant was enlarged.

Heller Brothers Co. was founded in 1836 by Elias Heller in New Jersey. The firm came to Newcomerstown in 1917, taking over the old Rex File Co., which had been destroyed by fire.



The Seiberling Rubber Co., located its Plastic Division in Newcomerstown in 1954: It has been marked by steady growth. In 1959, an additional 20,000 square feet of floor space was added. In 1963 the plant was expanded again by the same amount. Employment and production have continued to rise steadily.

The new plant is the most completely automated laminating plant in the country. It was designed to laminate plywood for the Etling Building Products Division of Weather-Seal, which produces a complete line of cabinets.

The Alchrome Products Company manufactures bath room and lavatory fixtures. This plant was started in 1946 by Herbert Smith, the present owner.

The Hillside Egg Farm, operated by Kenneth and Gwendolyn Johns, is something new for Newcomerstown, Operated on their farm approximately three and a half miles south of this town, they have a completely modern place with 6,000 hens, and one rooster. Daily production is now between 4,500 and 5,000 eggs per day, all sold to a large chain of stores in Ohio. It takes about five tons of food per week for the old biddies.


