# Stewart Heating Business Sold to Clifford J. Ramsey

The long - established business of Clyde J. Stewart, River st., has been sold to Clifford J. Ramsey of Coshocton and Mr. Ramsey will take possession Nov. 12.

Mr. Stewart came here in 1927 and bought the business formerly conducted by William Edwards.

The sale includes the business building on River st, with modern apartment on the second floor and barber shop room and business room occupied by the Stewart Heating, Roofing and Tin Shop on the first floor.

Mr. Ramsey also acquires the equipment, tools and stock in trade of Mr. Stewart. Mr. Ramsey is the owner of the Ramsey Heating and Equipment Co. in Coshocton, having been in that business for the past 11 years. He served in the Army during World War II.

William Ankrum will be the local manager of the business and he and his wife will occupy the apartment on the second floor, now occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Stewart. Mr. Ankrum is also a World War II veteran.

Mr. and Mrs. Stewart will spend some time this winter in the South but their future plans are indefinite.

Mr. Ramsey plans to continue the same line of merchandise including the Wise furnace line, as handled by Mr. Stewart.

However he will continue to serve as vice president and director.

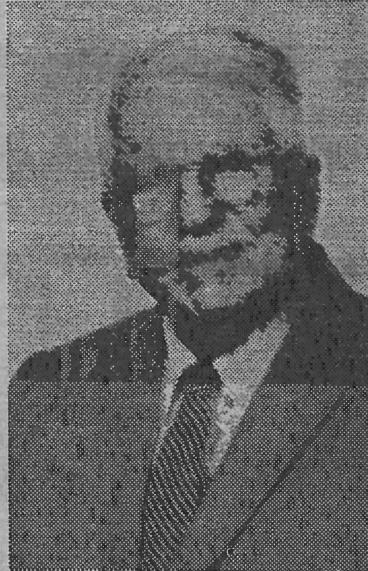

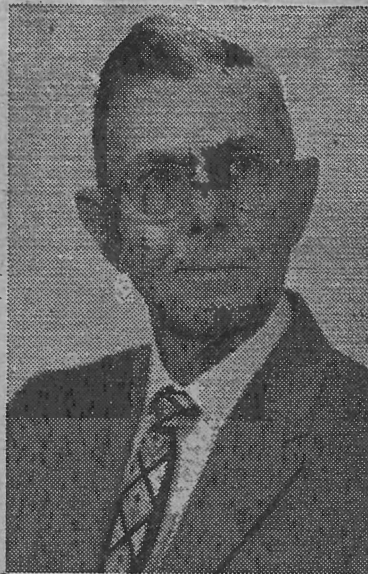
C. J. Stewart, newly elected president, has had many years experience in the field of home construction and repair. This knowledge has been beneficial to the company in making loans during the past.

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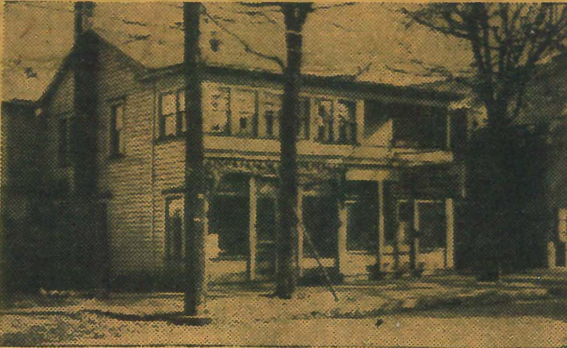

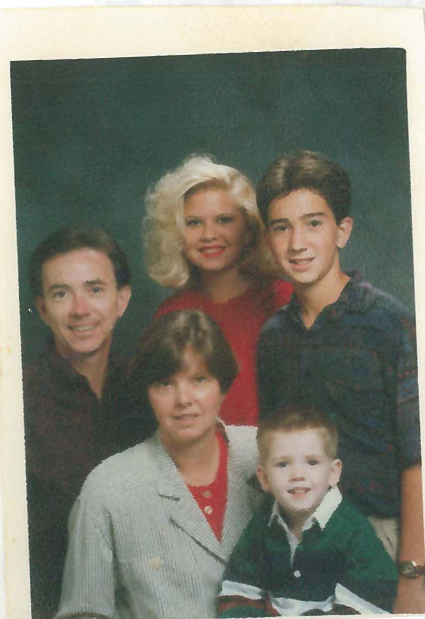

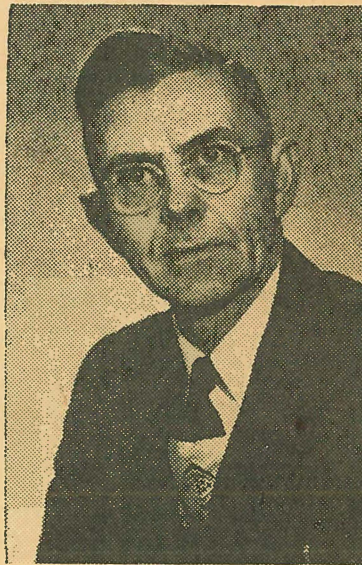
Mr. and Mrs. Stewart will spend some time this winter in the South but their future plans are indefinite.

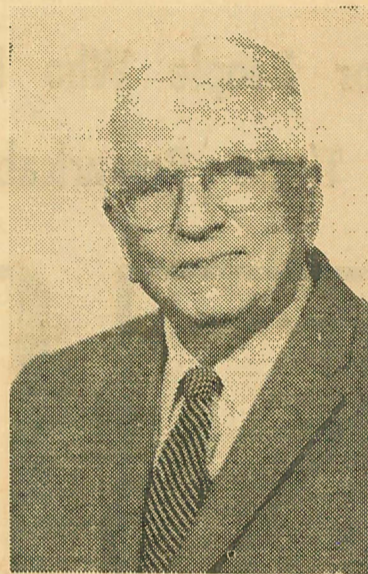

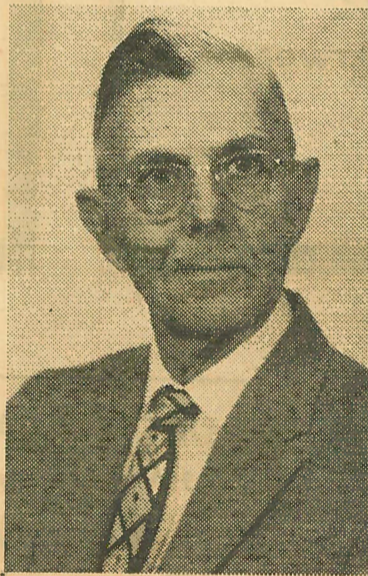

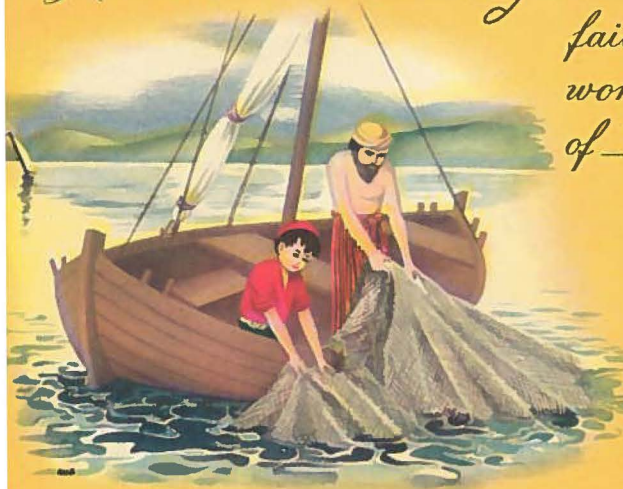

# ROBERT D. EMLER, 10 CRUSHED BY TRUCK DIES FROM INJURIES

Robert Dewey Emler, 10, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dewey Emler, Nuzen street, died in the city hospital, Coshocton, Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, from injuries received when he was run over by a truck, driven by his father. The accident occurred near the home on Nuzen street. The crushed chest and heart caused his death, and several ribs on each side of his body were broken.

The boy's father was driving away from the curb and it is thought the boy was trying to jump on the running board and fell beneath the truck, the rear wheel passing over his body. His brother, seeing him fall, shouted a warning, but it was too late.

He was taken to the office of Dr. Henry Kistler where he received first aid and was later removed in a Jones Lydick ambulance to the Coshocton city hospital where an X-ray picture was taken to determine the extent of the injuries. Dr. Kistler, assisted by Dr. Shaw of Coshocton, attended him.

Surviving are his parents and three brothers, Gerald, Earl and Donald, all of the home. Funeral services were held at the Baptist church Monday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, Rev. E. L. Greer of West Lafayette officiating. Burial was made in West Lawn cemetery.
