# J. BRUCE ISMAY DENIES CHARGES

SAYS MANY OF HIS ACTIONS  
HAVE BEEN MISINTERPRETED  
AND MISCONSTRUED.

## WELCOMES SENATE INQUIRY

Declares He Saw Captain Smith Rarely and Had Nothing to Do With the Running of the Late Queen of the Seas.

New Halifax, N. S.—Sixty-four bodies, some of which are identifiable, have been recovered by the cableship Mackay-Bennett, according to a wireless report received here. The report received here states that several of the bodies were decomposed beyond the possibility of recognition, and as they carried nothing by which they could be identified, they were cast into the sea again. The report does not give the names of those identified.

New York City.—Before leaving for Washington J. Bruce Ismay, the vice president of the International Mercantile Marine Co., issued a long statement in which he denied in toto all the charges that have been made against him since the Titanic went down. Mr. Ismay says that many of his actions have been misinterpreted and misconstrued. He says that during the voyage he enjoyed no privileges other than those allowed first cabin passengers; that he saw the captain rarely and that he had nothing to do with the running of the boat.

Regarding the telegrams sent ordering the crew to be hurried back to England, Mr. Ismay says that his sole desire was to give the men a comfortable and early passage to their homes. He had no desire to get them away from the jurisdiction of the United States. In fact, he says, he welcomes an investigation.

# CONGRESSIONAL PROBE OF THE TITANIC DISASTER

New York City.—J. Bruce Ismay appeared before the senate committee investigating the Titanic disaster and, when asked the circumstances under which he left the boat, replied: "One of the boats was being filled. Officers called out to know if there were any more women to go. There was none to go. No passengers were on deck. As the boat was being lowered, I got into it."

Mr. Ismay said he was asleep when the ship struck. He said he knew icebergs had been reported in the vicinity; said he did not try to send any wireless messages from the Titanic after she struck; said he estimated the speed of the ship when she struck at 21 knots an hour; said he did not attempt to interfere with working of wireless on the Carpathia.

"There was a ball following a banquet of some kind going on down below when I went on watch at 9:30 o'clock," said Klein, "and the captain and the officers were there with many of the passengers. After the party, stewards served the champagne and wines that were left over to the crew. I knew that many of them were drunk. A passenger standing at the rail saw something dead ahead or may be a little bit to starboard. 'Look quick,' he said, 'see the hill over there.' I followed his arm as he pointed and I saw it was a big iceberg and ran for the bridge. The third officer saw me coming and yelled to me, asking what was the matter. I couldn't stop to answer. I was too excited. I ran for the spar with the crow's nest on it and shouted to the lookout I knew was up there to give the alarm.

"Not a word did I hear, so I started up. It was less than a minute after I left the promenade deck that I got to the top of the spar and found the lookout sound asleep. I rang the alarm bell myself."

"The only information I ever received on the ship that other vessels had sighted ice," said Mr. Ismay in his statement, "was by a wireless message received from the Baltic, which I have already testified to. This was handed to me by Captain Smith without any remark, as he was passing me on the passenger deck on the afternoon of Sunday, April 14. I read the telegram casually and put it in my pocket. At about ten minutes past 7, while I was sitting in the smoking room, Captain Smith came in and asked me to give him the message received from the Baltic in order to post it for the information of the officers. I handed it to him and nothing further was said by either of us. I did not speak to any of the officers on the subject. If the information I had received had aroused any apprehension in my mind—which it did not—I should not have ventured to make any suggestion to a commander of Captain Smith's experience. The responsibility for the navigation of the ship rested solely with him.

"It has been stated that Captain Smith and I were having a dinner party in one of the saloons from 7:30 to 10:30 Sunday night and that at the time of the collision Capt. Smith was sitting with me in the saloon.

"Both of these statements are absolutely false. I did not dine with the captain nor did I see him during the evening of April 14."

## ASSERTS LAX DISCIPLINE

Cleveland, O.—Telling a story of lax discipline on board the ill-fated liner Titanic, Louis Klein, a sailor who was rescued by the Carpathia, is held here under arrest until he can be taken to Washington to testify in the senate inquiry into the disaster. The man's story, which cross-examination by Hugo E. Varga, Austro-Hungarian vice consul, failed to shake, is that the lookout in the crow's nest was asleep when the ship struck; that the members of the crew, on and off watch, were intoxicated from drinking champagne which had been passed out to them by stewards who were serving it to a dinner party in a cabin, and that he, an ordinary seaman, was the only member of the crew on deck with presence of mind sufficient to sound the alarm bell which apprised the third officer, who, he said, had just returned to the bridge from dining in the saloon.

## Two Ohio Women Safe.

Mesdames Caroline and Lilly Bonnell of Youngstown, O., were the next to walk down the plank. One of the Ohio women said:

We were asleep in our berths when the Titanic crashed into the iceberg. We immediately rushed on deck, only stopping to throw on a coat over our nightgowns. The night was bright and starlight. We could see the crowds of passengers falling down the stairways, while the officers sought to reassure them of their safety. Major Butt and Colonel Astor stood by the lifeboats bravely and helped the women. They did not think the boat was going to sink. The Titanic kept settling lower and lower, however. Then word came that the engine room was flooded. There was some shooting.

## Mrs. Astor Unable to Talk.

Mrs. John Jacob Astor came down the gang plank with halting steps. She was fully dressed, wearing a black astrakan coat. She seemed to be on the verge of a complete collapse, and a half dozen men rushed to her. Asked for a statement, she said:

I can't! I can't! It was horrible! I am unspeakably ill. Oh, someone help me!"

Tells of Suffering.

Heley Stengel of Newark, N. J., had ordered two automobiles to meet him. He had several hysterical survivors in his car.

Mr. Stengel said:

I have no praise for anything connected with the rescue of the Titanic survivors. There were holes in the lifeboats uncaulked. I have a clear recollection that when the lifeboat in which I came off was leaving the Titanic a band was playing aboard the big ship. We suffered dreadfully. There was no food, no water and no light aboard any of the lifeboats, and from what I could learn none of the lifeboats was in good shape. I saw with my own eyes two lifeboats loaded with passengers go down. I can only attribute this to the bad condition of the boats.

Mrs. A. A. Dick, who was saved with her husband, said:

There was the wildest excitement after the ship struck. The crew first ran to the rails to prevent anyone from jumping overboard. I was standing near the first two boats that were launched. At first a few men struggled to gain seats, but when they saw us women they calmed down and put us aboard the boats. Their bravery was wonderful. The lowering of our boat into the sea was a terrible experience. The boats with the rescued passengers lay in the vicinity of the foundering vessel for about an hour. We had been assured by the captain that she could not sink. But she began to settle, and our oarsmen made frantic efforts to pull far enough away so that we could not be drawn down with the Titanic in her vortex. The marine band did nobly. An air was struck up soon after the crash came, and as we were lowered away we were cheered by the strains of music.

\*\*\*\*\* Washington.—In a glowing tribute to Major Butt, President Taft in a statement just given out expressed his high esteem of his personal aide, who lost his life when the Titanic sank. The statement follows:

"Major Archibald Butt was my military aide. He was like a member of my family and I feel his loss as though he had been a young brother. The chief traits of his character were loyalty to his ideal, his cloth and his friends. His character was a simple one in the sense that he was incapable of intrigue or insincerity. He was gentle and considerate to everyone, high and low. He never lost under any conditions his sense of proper regard to what he considered the respect due to constituted authorities. He was a soldier, every inch of him—a most competent and successful quartermaster and devotee of his profession. He leaves the widest circle of friends, whose memory of him is sweet in every particular."

## Sees Huge Iceberg.

E. Z. Taylor of Philadelphia said:

I was awakened at 12:10 o'clock, by my watch, by a dull, grinding crash that rocked the boat but was not sufficiently hard to throw me from my berth. I knew instantly that we had struck something, but was not frightened. We had plenty of time to dress, for when the ship struck it was 12:10, and she did not sink until 2:30 by my time. I saw the iceberg we struck and it was fully 80 feet high, above the water. It seemed to me that when we struck it we passed over part of it and under part, as if below the floor and ceiling of a room. Everybody rushed to the decks following the impact, or so it seemed; but it did not at first appear as if we were facing a horrible danger, and those not fully dressed retired to attire themselves to face the cold, which was terrible. The sea was as smooth as glass and there was little trouble so far as could be seen, in launching the lifeboats when the word was given but that we were sinking.

The rule in loading the boats was "women first" and I can say positively that we thought all the women on board were in the boats first. At last when not a woman was to be seen on the decks, the officers ordered the men to the boats. I dropped into one containing Mrs. Astor and several other women, whose names I do not know. We were four and one-half hours in the boat before the Carpathia picked us up, suffering intensely from the horror of what had just gone through, the thoughts those who had gone down, and from the cold that bit into our flesh like a knife. And I can say with assurance that a number of the lifeboats from the ship were accounted for and I do not believe over 500 persons have been saved from the wreck.

## Calls Butt and Astor Heroes.

Mrs. Churchill Candee of Washington said:

The action of the men on the Titanic was noble. They stood back in every instance that I noticed and gave the women and children the first chance to get away safely. Particularly heroic was the conduct of Isidor Straus, Major Archibald Butt, John Jacob Astor and Henry B. Harris. They formed a group. Most of the passengers were on the stern of the Titanic, for the leak was forward and it was known that if she sank it would be bow first.

An officer of the Titanic ordered Mrs. Straus into a boat. She said: "I will not leave my husband. We've been together all these years and I'll not leave him now."

It brought tears to our eyes to witness her great devotion for her husband.

Mr. Harris insisted that his wife get into a lifeboat. She refused at first, but was finally forced into the boat.

As we put away I observed Mrs. Straus waving her handkerchief at us. The Titanic was then settling. Her stern was out of the water and she was doing down bow first. There must have been 1,400 persons gathered together on the stern.

I saw Colonel Astor helping get the women and children into the boats. Then he went below, remaining there several minutes. I believe he was searching for more women and children. Finally he came back again. He was on deck when the Titanic sank, I believe, for when I last saw him he was still aiding in work of rescue.

Major Butt was one of God's nobles. I saw him working desperately to save the women and children into boats.

What need can there be of recount the heroic deeds performed by these who remained on the Titanic? To do upon them only sickens the heart, the realization of how they perished.





# *Grandson follows footsteps as trustee*

More than a quarter century of service was represented by a township trustee and his grandson, who were among the special guests at the annual spring banquet of the Tuscarawas County Assn. of Twp. Trustees and Clerks.

Earl Couts, Newcomerstown R.D. 3, and his grandson, James Earl Couts, 430 Pearl St., Newcomerstown, both Oxford Twp. trustees, have the distinction of being the only grandfather-grandson combination holding township offices, as far as Mrs. Mildred Cronebaugh, Stone Creek R.D. 1, can discover. She is secretary-treasurer of the county's township officers.

The elder Couts ran for trustee first in 1961 because of a challenge that no one on the north side of the Tuscarawas River would be elected as a township trustee because of the smaller pocket of population on that side. Couts has now been elected for five consecutive terms and is now in his 20th year of service.

Although it is Earl's final year, his grandson said he is sure his grandfather would be elected if he chose to run for a sixth term.

Jim, now 30, was only 11 years old when his grandfather was first elected. He often went with him cut brush and clean out culverts.

Those years influenced his decision to run for trustee and he was elected when he was 25 years old. He is in his sixth year as a trustee. He is vice president of the Oxford Twp. trustees and is their representative on the Tuscarawas County board of health, Tuscarawas County regional planning commission and the Tri-County Ambulance Service board.

An employee of Conrail, Jim and his wife, Ellen, have three children. His grandfather is a retired employee of the Eureka Hardware Store in Newcomerstown, where he worked for 27 years. He is still an active farmer on 193 acres.

Earl also reported he became a great-grandfather again recently. He has five children and 17 grandchildren. He now has 14 great-grandchildren.



#### 505.442 Fire protection service outside township district; status of fire department members.

In order to provide fire protection, or to provide additional fire protection in times of emergency, any township may extend the services of its fire department, or the use of its fire apparatus, to any other subdivision of this state, upon authorization by the board of township trustees.

Fire department members acting outside the subdivision in which they are employed and outside the territory covered by contracts authorized in section 505.44 of the Revised Code may participate in any pension or indemnity fund established by their employer to the same extent as while acting within the employing subdivision and such members are entitled to all rights and benefits of sections 4123.01 to 4123.94, inclusive, of the Revised Code, to the same extent and while performing service within the subdivision, provided that such members are acting upon authorization of a duly designated officer or employee of the employing subdivision.

Section 701.02 of the Revised Code, so far as it is applicable to the operation of fire departments, applies to the political subdivision and fire department members when such members are rendering service outside of their own subdivision pursuant to this section. (131 v H 546. Eff. 10-8-65)

A township fire department has the primary responsibility to fight fires within the township or in any subdivision which the township trustees have agreed to protect, notwithstanding that such fire may be in connection with a vehicle traveling on a limited access highway to which no convenient entrance may be made within said township or protected subdivision but agreements or contracts may be made, by the township or the protected subdivision, with other subdivisions whose fire-fighting facilities could more easily enter the limited access highway and reach the fire in the said township or protected subdivision; while a subdivision with convenient access to the highway may extend its fire-fighting services via the highway to the site of a fire in a neighboring township, there does not seem to be any duty to do so. #### 505.443 Contracts for ambulance service.

In order to obtain ambulance service, or to obtain additional ambulance service in times of emergency, any township may enter into a contract, for a period not to exceed three years, with one or more townships, municipal corporations, or private ambulance owners, regardless of whether such townships, municipal corporations, or private ambulance owners are located within or without the state, upon such terms as are agreed to by them, to furnish or receive ambulance services or the interchange of ambulance services within the several territories of the contracting subdivisions, if such contract is first authorized by respective boards of township trustees or other legislative bodies.

Such contract may provide for a fixed annual charge to be paid at the times agreed upon and stipulated in the contract, or for compensation based upon a stipulated price for each run, call, or emergency, or the elapsed time of service required in such run, call, or emergency, or any combination thereof. ### 505.71 Joint ambulance districts


The boards of township trustees of one or more townships and the legislative authorities of any one or more municipal corporations within or adjoining such townships, or the boards of township trustees of two or more townships, or the legislative authority of two or more municipal corporations, may, by adoption of a joint resolution by a majority of the members of each board of township trustees and by a majority of the members of the legislative authority of each municipal corporation, create a joint ambulance district comprising the municipal corporations and all or any portions of the townships as are mutually agreed upon. A district so created shall be given a name different from the name of any participating township or municipal corporation.

The governing body of a district shall be a board of trustees, which shall include one representative appointed by each board of township trustees and one representative appointed by the legislative authority of each municipal corporation in the district. Members of the board of trustees may be compensated at a rate not to exceed twenty dollars per meeting, not to exceed twelve meetings per year, and may be reimbursed for all necessary expenses incurred. The board shall employ a clerk. Before entering upon the duties of his office, the clerk of the board of trustees of a joint ambulance district shall execute a bond, in the amount and with surety to be approved by the board, payable to the state, conditioned for the faithful performance of all the official duties required of him. Such bond shall be deposited with the presiding officer of the board, and copies thereof, certified by him, shall be filed with the county auditor of each county with a subdivision included in the district.

To provide the services and equipment it considers necessary for the district, the board may levy taxes, subject to Chapter 5705. of the Revised Code, and issue bonds and other evidences of indebtedness, subject to Chapter 133. of the Revised Code, after submitting the question of such issuance to the electors of the district in the manner provided by Chapter 133. of the Revised Code.

Any municipal corporation or township may join an existing district by the adoption of a resolution requesting such membership and upon approval of the board of the district. Any municipal corporation or township may withdraw from a district by the adoption of a resolution ordering withdrawal. On or after the first day of January of the year following the adoption of the resolution of withdrawal, the municipal corporation or township withdrawing ceases to be a part of such district and the power of the district to levy a tax upon taxable property in the withdrawing township or municipal corporation terminates, except that the district shall continue to levy and collect taxes for the payment of indebtedness within the territory of the district as it was comprised at the time the indebtedness was incurred.

Upon the withdrawal of any township or municipal corporation from a district, the county auditor shall ascertain, apportion, and order a division of the funds on

### 505.72 Employees of district; contracts for services; immunity from liability

(A) The board of trustees of a joint ambulance district shall provide for the employment of such employees as it considers best, and shall fix their compensation. Such employees shall continue in office until removed as provided by sections 733.35 to 733.39 of the Revised Code. To initiate removal proceedings, and for such purpose, the board shall designate a private citizen to investigate the conduct and prepare the necessary charges in conformity with sections 733.35 to 733.39 of the Revised Code. The board may pay reasonable compensation to such person for his services.

In case of the removal of an employee of the district, an appeal may be had from the decision of the board to the court of common pleas of the county in which such district, or part of it, is situated, to determine the sufficiency of the cause of removal. Such appeal from the findings of the board shall be taken within ten days.

(B) In order to obtain ambulance service, to obtain additional ambulance service in times of emergency, or to obtain emergency medical services, a district may enter into a contract, for a period not to exceed three years, with one or more townships, municipal corporations, joint fire districts, nonprofit corporations, any other governmental unit that provides ambulance service or emergency medical services, or with private ambulance owners, regardless of whether such townships, municipal corporations, joint fire districts, nonprofit corpo-

Expenditures of a district for ambulance services, emergency medical service, whether pursuant to contract or otherwise, are lawful expenditures, regardless of whether the district or the party with whom it contracts charges additional fees to users of the service.

Ambulance services or emergency medical services rendered for a joint ambulance district under sections 505.71 and 505.72 of the Revised Code shall be deemed services of the district, and these sections do not authorize suits against a district or any township, or any corporation providing, or receiving, or contracting to provide or receive such services under these sections for damages for injury or loss to persons or property or for wrongful death caused by persons providing such services.

## BUILDING CODE

### 505.75 Building codes; procedures for establishing regulation departments

(A) A board of township trustees may, by resolution adopted by incorporation by reference, administration, or force a standard code pertaining to the construction, repair, alteration, and maintenance of single-family, two-family, and three-family dwellings promulgated by the state, or any department, board, or agency thereof, or by any municipal corporation in the county in this state, within the unincorporated areas of the township, or establish districts in any part of the unincorporated territory and adopt, administer, or force such standard code in the affected districts. If adopted, all regulations contained in such codes, including those establishing service charges, shall be within all districts in which building codes are established, except that more stringent regulations may be imposed in flood hazard areas in order to reduce the hazard resulting from flooding. Any regulations shall not exceed the scope of safety, health, and sanitary conditions of buildings. Any person adversely affected by a regulation of a board adopting, amending, or rescinding a regulation may seek a declaratory judgment pursuant to section 2721. of the Revised Code on the ground that the regulation fails to comply with the law in adopting, amending, or rescinding the regulation.

### GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### 505.82 Emergency powers to clear roads; undedicated roads

If a board of township trustees by a unanimous vote, or, in the event of the unavoidable absence of one trustee, by an affirmative vote of two trustees adopts a resolution declaring that an emergency exists which threatens life or property within the unincorporated territory of the township, the board may exercise the following powers for the duration of the emergency:

(A) If an owner of an undedicated road in the unincorporated territory of the township has not provided for the removal of snow, ice, debris, or other obstructions from the road, provide for such removal. Prior to providing for such removal, the board of township trustees shall give, or make good faith attempt to give, oral notice to the owner of the road of the trustees' intent to clear the road and impose a service charge for doing so. The board shall establish just and equitable service charges for such removal to be paid by the owners of the road. The trustees shall keep a record of the costs incurred by the township in removing snow, ice, debris, or other obstructions from the road. The service charges shall be based on these costs and shall be in an amount sufficient to recover these costs. If there is more than one owner of the road, the board shall allocate the service charges among the owners on an equitable basis. The board shall notify, in writing, each owner of the road of the amount of the service charge and shall certify the charges to the county auditor. The charges shall constitute a lien upon the property. The auditor shall place the charges on a special duplicate to be collected as other taxes and returned to the township general fund.

(B) Contract for the immediate acquisition, replacement, or repair of equipment needed for the emergency situation, without following the competitive bidding

## Location of Oxford Twp. Schools

Pleasant View School - was located on Oxford TR 107 near the intersection with TR 108. The new name for this road is Church Road. The building is no longer standing. It is the site of two trailer homes. One half the land is owned by Reagan Clark and the other half is owned by Edith Norman.

Browning School - is located on SR 258 just east of the I-77 overpass. The building is still standing. It was converted into a dwelling owned by Durwin Sanders.

Stocker School - was located on Tuscarawas Co. Rd. 4 near (west) the arch bridge over I-77. The road is known as Stocker Ridge Road. The building was used for a community center for square dances and other types of entertainment.

Booth School - was located on CR 3 at the intersection of TR 4. The building was purchased by Merle Opphile to tear down. He built a house on the property. Junior Allen later purchased it.

Kings School - is located on ~~East~~ Bifford TR 107 also known as Kings Ridge Road. The building is still standing and is owned by Kings Community Church which is adjacent to the school site. It is used for annual reunions of Offord Township Schools.

Post Boy School was located in the little community of Post Boy on Tuscarawas CR 3 also known as Post Boy Rd. The building is no longer standing. It was torn down. The land is owned by Clara Morrison who owns the adjoining land.
