



Moment of silence Chief deputy's death noted

A moment of silence was observed when Newcomerstown Village council met Monday evening in honor of Chief Deputy Don Kehl who passed away on Saturday, Aug. 16.

"Don was a valuable asset to law enforcment in Tuscarawas County," said Councilman Dave Leading. "You don't find them any better," said a member of the audience.

The moment was especially poignant in what turned into a rather lengthy meeting punctuated by questions from the audience and a one-hour executive session.

The village has gained a police chief of their own following the swearing in of Chief Don Ryan. Ryan plans to begin work on Tuesday morning at a salary of \$30,000 per year. He was flanked by Sgt. Brian Hursey and Asst. Chief Larry McKinney during the brief swearing-in ceremony.

McKinney, who had been acting chief for over two years, has been reassigned to his former position of assistant chief at his current rate of pay, which is \$24,520 per year.

"I want to thank all members of council for their confidence as I begin this endeavor," said Ryan. "My first order of business will be to establish a personal meeting with each officer to discuss the scope of this endeavor."

Another new face joined the village payroll when council voted to hire Robert Fisher as a full-time laborer on the Street Department. The position had been filled by David Harris in an earlier meeting but Harris asked council to rescind his transfer from the Water Department to the Street Department. Fisher was hired at the starting rate of \$6.76/hour with a six month probationary period.

In what appears to be a spurt of growth in the area, council approved a 10-year 60% tax abatement for 3-D Diamond Tooling, Inc. for the purchase of \$800,000 worth of additional machinery. The new machinery will enable the company to service cutting tools returned by the customer for routine and emergency service. "Service in a timely manner is an important facet of this business," said Mayor Packy McFarland. The business expects to hire a minimum of three new employees to provide this customer service.

The tax abatement was questioned by audience members. Councilwoman Shirley Coker-Kerr voted against the abatement. "There is a difference of opinion on the actual return on the dollar," said Kerr. "I simply feel that we may be a little over extended."

That feeling was somewhat compounded by the question of Audrey Hanni regarding the legal level of debt a village can incur. According to Kerr, the legal limit is \$3 million.

"We're spitting it right in the eye," said Kerr. In fact, if you look at the current debt level, it is over that limit. However, council members were quick to point out that the level is somewhat offset by the funds currently on deposit with the bank which would bring it under the legal limit.

Concern over the expenditure of \$1500 to remove a tree and stump at the corner of Canal and Goodrich Streets prompted one resident to ask for reimbursement of the \$400 she paid for the removal of her tree and stump. Council explained their action by saying that the tree interfered with a proposed curb and that the tree roots were interfering with a sewer line. They said they would discuss her personal complaint at a later date.

Goldie Abbuhl, a resident of Goodrich Street, presented a petition asking council to re-examine their current ordinances regarding weeds, shrubs and trash. This was coupled with a request for enforcement which several members of the audience echoed.

MASSILLON — Carl Frederick "Ducky" Schroeder, a former Newcomerstown High School coach and a longtime baseball and football coach at Massillon High School, died Saturday (Nov. 1, 1997) following a brief illness.

Mr. Schroeder was born March 25, 1905, in Canal Fulton, a son of the late Elizabeth (Ruehling) and Frederick Schroeder. He got the nickname "Ducky" because he spent much of his youth swimming in the Ohio Canal and the Tuscarawas River and people said he "walked like a duck on land."

He was a standout athlete in baseball and football at Canal Fulton and Massillon. He played football at Kings College in Tennessee but transferred to Wittenberg University, where he was a standout pitcher for three seasons. He also still holds the records for most carries in one football game, with 44 carries for 176 yards. He also played linebacker. He went on to gain a master's degree in physical education from Ohio State University.

In 1930, he began a long and illustrious career as a teacher and coach. He began at Washington High School and served as head football and basketball coach at the Ohio Military Institute and high schools at Newcomerstown, Logan, Salem and Springfield, where he was also athletic director. At Newcomerstown, he was hired by Supt. W.B. Hayes, the father of Woody Hayes. On the collegiate level, he was assistant football and basketball coach at Mount Union College and was head football and basketball coach at Wittenberg University. During World War II, he trained over 700 Air Force cadets who went on to become pilots.

In 1948, he returned to Massillon, where he taught and coached until his retirement in 1972. As head baseball coach, his team went to the state finals in 1955 and the state semi-finals in 1960. During his 23 years as assistant football coach, the Massillon Tigers won 13 state championships. It was his job to supervise the winter conditioning program and he coached several professional baseball and football players.

Mr. Schroeder was also on the "Big 33" committee, which led to five Ohio-Pennsylvania all-star football games. He was secretary/treasurer of the Ohio High School Football Coaches Assn. and was inducted into the Ohio High School Coaches Hall of Fame. He was past president of the Professional Football Hall of Fame Club in Canton. In recognition for his service to Massillon athletics, one of the best high school baseball facilities was dedicated to him, The Carl "Ducky" Schroeder Field. He also served as a sales representative for the Rae Crowther Blocking Sled Company and was a long time member of St. John's Lutheran Church in Canal Fulton.

Mr. Schroeder leaves his wife of 63 years, Gertrude; his sister, Helen Ellis; and numerous nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews, and greatgreat-nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by three brothers and two sisters.
