PREFACE

HONOR THY FATHER AND THY MOTHER

We honor loved ones by remembering. We remember both good times and yes, we remember the not so good times. We remember parents as kind and loving and we remember them as strict enforcers of the family code of morals. That is why we feel a family history should be much more than names and dates. It should attempt to show our ancestors as they really were, real people, with real likes and dislikes; real joys and fears. Somewhere back there, we were ALL immigrants, eager to start a new life in a new world. A world so very different from the cities and small farmplots of Europe and Britain...a world of vast unexplored forests and seemingly never-ending plains. It required a strong determination and an adventurous spirit to leave the familiar behind and cross the Atlantic in a sailing vessel. It required determination to again leave the settled areas of the East Coast of America and head west into the Great Wilderness. That is why we have included items that show these ancestors as living human beings, not necessarily as plaster saints.

When working on a family history, it is not possible to start at the beginning and work our way forward. We must start where we are today and go back, always digging deeper and deeper into the past. Birth records were not kept in the early days, and even death records cannot always be found much before 1915 in many states. Old wooden court houses have burned, along with whatever records they did have, and families seldom took time from the hard work of providing for ever-increasing family to write things down. Many women were not taught to write, all they needed to know were housekeeping and cooking skills. Frontier schools were few and far between, and often a three-month term was the extent of the school year.

Searching out old records can be exhausting and frustrating. Some states considered marriage records the business of the church... but which church? Is it still in existence? And where are the old records? All too often, no one knows. Dissenter groups ("not official churches") have left few if any records. Justice of the Peace records were not public records, not recorded in the court houses. Also, look out for and beware of different spellings of a name. ADDY was often written by the clerk as EDDY, also as ADDEY, ADY or ADDIE. Spelling was influenced by the education and nationality of the writer, as well as his hearing. Many pioneers could not even sign their names. But it should be emphasized that just because a person's will is signed "X" does not necessarily mean that he was illiterate. Wills were seldom made before the death-bed, and the person was then too weak to sign anything more than an "X", after dictating the provisions of the will.

Throughout this work we have used the spelling of proper names as found in court records and other papers. This may vary, depending upon the writer.


BASIC LAWS OF COUSINRY

- 1. For two people to be cousins, they must share a common set of grandparents, great grandparents, gr-gr-grandparents, etc. somewhere back up the family tree.
- 2. Children of your first cousin and their children and their children's children and so forth, remain your first cousins. However, they may be once removed, or more, as the case may be.

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- Similarly, the first cousin of your gr-gr-gr-gr-grandmother 3. is still your first cousin, six times removed. This is a handy rule to know when you're looking for a relative slightly more respectable than old Uncle Albert to brag about. That many generations back, you have altogether 64 different gr-gr-grgrandparents, and at least one of them must have been GREAT.
- The same rules apply to the descendants of your second cousins 4 . and third cousins as well as to the second cousins and third cousins of your parents, grandparents, gr-grandparents, all the way back to Adam.
- . 5. If you have a first, a second, or third cousin without any "removes" involved, you both belong to the same generation. "Removed" signifies a different generation from a common ancestor. ,

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After studying several systems of identifying various descendants by generation from our progenator, William Addy 1st, it seemed that the one used by T. Grant Maple, PhD., in his <u>Genealogical History of the Maple/Mapel Family</u> <u>in America</u> was the simplest and easiest to understand. With Dr. Maple's permission, his numbering system is used throughout this work. The following quote from Dr. Maple explains his system:

"The children of the progenitor of the line are each assigned a number denoting the order of birth of his children, when known, otherwise as they came to the attention of the author. For the third generation, another such digit is added to the number of their parent. And similarly for each succeeding generation. Large families were usual in early days.....To avoid ambiguity in numbering, the tenth child is numbered A, the 11th numbered B, the 12th as C, and so on.

"With this scheme, the number of digits in the reference number is <u>one less</u> than the generation number, counting the progenitor as the first generation. To determine the reference number of the parent, drop the last digit from the child's number.

"<u>Example</u>: Assume 2C3 is the reference number. There are 3 digits in this number, so this person is in the <u>fourth</u> generation, and is the third child of 2C, who is the twelfth child of 2, and this last one is the second child of the progenitor."

Perhaps this sounds just a little confusing, but we feel it will become clear as you use the reference numbers to trace the lineage of any descendant.

To help trace this lineage, the ancestors of each family are listed in parenthesis. Example: John Addy (William, Robert, Wm 1st). Thus, John is the son of William, who is the son of Robert, the son of William 1st.

We have also chosen to follow each child of William Addy 1st with as much generational information as we have. Thus, in the chapter titled DESCENDANTS OF ROBERT ADDY, his known children are given. Then descendants of his eldest known child Eleanor, are shown. We have no further generations of her descendants, so we then continue with Robert's second child who was William. We have several generations of his descendants and these are all given before returning to Robert's third child, Anthony T. We feel this saves searching page after page looking for descendants of a specific generation.

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CHAPTER 1

THE ADDY FAMILY

The Brackens

Our history of the Addy family may well begin in Yorkshire, England in the year 1695, where we find that one William Bracken married a girl named Hannah. No other information is given. See LDS IGI microfiche D 0051 of 3/1988. We do not know just when the Bracken family arrived in the New World, but as early as 1702 records show that William had purchased land in * Newcastle county, on the Dela Ware. William's daughter Hannah married James Jordan on 02 February 1722 in Holy Trinity (Old Swede's) Church in Wilmington, Delaware, and at least three other couples of the Addy connection also married in this historic old church.

The will of William Bracken, written 08 April 1749 and probated 28 December 1749 mentions "my Grand Daughter Martha Jordan daughter of my s^d Daughter Hannah Jordan" and leaving Martha ten pounds to be put out to interest until her eighteenth birthday or her marriage day, if earlier.

Martha Jordan married Hugh Clark a few years later, on Ol August 1752, in Holy Trinity Church, and their daughter Eleanor Clark married William Addy on 22 December 1768 in Holy Trinity Church. William and Eleanor's daughter Martha Addy married Malachai Jones on 25 August 1789, also in Holy Trinity Church. See LDS microfilm number 0908217 for these marriages.

Information on the Bracken family follows, being taken from a book by H. M. Bracken, M.D. of Minneapolis, and dated July 1901. Dr. Bracken was interested only in the continuation of the Bracken name through his ancestor, William's son Thomas, and has practically no information on the daughters of William Bracken. This is easily understood, as following the female line is indeed difficult and confusing. We deeply appreciate Dr. Bracken's research and recording of the early Bracken family in America.

Some questions have been raised concerning why Martha Jordan is specifically named in her grandfather's will, but no mention is made of her brother William Jordan, (see will of Hugh Clark, Jr.) Perhaps Martha was "special" to her grandfather. There were probably several grandchildren by this time who were not mentioned by name in this will, the bequest going to the parent.

So far as is known, this William Bracken is the first of his line in America.

Where he came from is not positively known. Tradition says from England. Certain facts not only bear out this tradition, but point strongly to the probability that he came from The first records we have refer to his pur-Yórkshire.† chase of land in Delaware. Any attempt at an historical sketch must be very imperfect, for it can be made only from the records and public documents at Wilmington, and these are very incomplete. It would seem that he was fairly successful in accumulating property. The first record of land secured relates to one hundred acres. It states that William Bracken‡ of Names taken from his will.

*Names taken from his will. † Francis Bracken, of Scarborough, Yorkshire, was one of the early settlers of West Jersey. having secured land Aug. 27th, 1683. i The spelling of this name is not at all uniform in the early records. It would appear that the nationality and learning of the scribe might be responsible to some extent for this fact. In the will the name is spelled Bracken, Brackin, Brakin, Braken, Bracken and Brackons, while some of the records add to this Brakyn. The oldest son, Thomas, and most of his descendants, spelled the name Bracken; so, too, did John and some at least of his descendants, while the descendants of the third son, Henry, after wavering for a time, finally settled down to Brackin. Bracken is the spelling for the name in Scotland, England, and to some extent in Ireland. Brackin is quite generally an Irish spelling of the name. spelling of the name

Newcastle county, Delaware, requested a grant of one hundred acres near John Evans near Red Clay Creek, for which he agreed to pay twelve pounds ten shillings per hundred acres, and a bushel of wheat rent per annum; to pay the twenty-fifth of December (25th Xbr), 1703, with interest from the twentyfifth of December (25th Xbr.), 1702.* From this application, it would appear that he was recognized as a resident of Delaware as early as July 14th, 1702.†

On the fourteenth of December (14th Xbr.), 1702, Joshua Morgan requested one hundred acres adjoining or near to the one hundred acres lately granted to William Brakyn on Mill Creek near White Clay Creek, on the same terms, etc.‡ On April 9th, 1720, William Brakin "desires" the grant of two hundred acres of land in Christiana hundred, New Castle County, Delaware, formerly held by Thomas Graves. . This he secured May 8th, 1721.§

December 14 (14th Xbr), 1727, William Brakin requested the grant of a parcel of land at Fishing Creek near Susquehannah, and desired a warrant (wart) as soon as possible. Concerning this grant a James Robinson entered the following protest:

"That about seven years since, he made some beginning on a Tract of Land lying on the West side of Fishing Creek, in Lancaster county, (Penna.), but soon after William Brackin procured a survey to be made by Elisha Gatchell, which included the above improvement, under pretense of settling his Children, but instead therefore he has without regular warrant (Warrt) sold two quantities for about ninety pounds, besides which (what) he has given to his son-in-law and daughters,

and that part still left unsold by William Brackin, J. Robinson desires the Grant of about two hundred acres, for which he is ready to pay. (4th 12 mo. 1735.)*

It would seem as though William Bracken settled his children fairly well. In 1726-27 he gave two hundred acres to his son Thomas, and one hundred and fifty acres to his son John. Other children were provided for, judging from the complaint above of James Robinson. The records speak of William Bracken as a yeoman. It is uncertain whether he was married in England or in this country. Tradition says he was married and had three children (boys), when he first came from England, but tradition is not always correct. His oldest son, Thomas, died in 1780. The first daughter mentioned in his will-Hannah-was married in. Delaware, Feb. 2, 1722.† He himself died in 1749 (Dec. ?). These dates would point to the probability of his having been a comparatively young man in 1702, when he secured his first land in Delaware.

It is probable that he and his family belonged to the Church of England (Episcopal), for all his descendants were in the Episcopal church through one generation and some even to the present time. His will reads as follows:

"In the name of God, Amen-the eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fortynine, I William Bracken, of Millcreek hundred In the County of New Castle on dellaware yeoman being in perfect health mind and memory thanks be given to God, therefore calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul Into the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but that at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give bequeath and dispose . of the same in the following form-Item. I do leave unto my Son Thomas Brackon one shilling sterling Currt money which shall be in full of his portion and share of my real and personal Estate Item. I do leave unto my Son John Brackon one shilling Sterling Currt money which shall be in full of his portion and share of my real and personal estate. Item. I do leave unto my Son Henry Brackon one shilling Sterling Curre money which shall be in full of his portion and share of my real and personal Estate. Item. I do leave to my Daughter Hannah wife of James Jordan one shilling Sterling Currt money and I do leave to s^d James Jordan one shilling Sterling Curr^t which shall be in full of his portion and share of my real and personal Estate. Item. I do leave to my Daughter Margaret wife to Alexander Moore one shilling Sterling curre money and I do leave unto the said Alexander Moore one shilling Sterling Currt money which shall be in full of their portion and share of my real and personal Estate. I do give unto my grand Daughter Elizabeth Gillehan Daughter of the s^d John Gillehan the house and shop where John Lapsley lately lived it being on the main Road leading to the White Clay Creek landing and four acres of Land joyning to it and all the appurtenances thereunto belonging to her and to her heirs forever and fire wood sufficient and convenient for twenty-one years shee or her heirs cutting or hauling the same But if it should happen that she shou'd depart this life without lawfull Issue then it is my will and I do give and Bequeath the above s^d house and shop and four Acres of Land and priviledges afores⁴ to my Grandson William Gillehan and his heirs forever.*

Item. I do leave unto my Grand Daughter Martha Jordan daughter of my s^d Daughter Hannah Jordan ten pounds Curr^t money of Pennsylvania to be put out to interest for her in good hands and paid her at s^d age of Eighteen years or day of marriage by my s^d Executors both principal and Interest.

Item. It is my Will and I do give and Bequeath unto my Grandson William Brackon Son of my s⁴ Son Henry Brackou all of my real and personal Estate he paying all of my just debts and funeral charges and Legacies left by me to the within and above mentioned persons to him and his heirs forever. But if it should happen that my s⁴ Grandson should be taken away by death without lawfull Isue then it is my Will and I do give the s⁴ Real and Personal Estate to my s⁴ son Henry Brackon

The area of the Dela Ware was claimed by both William Penn and Lord Baltimore, therefore by both Pennsylvania and Maryland. The three Dela Ware counties waged a civil battle for years to become a separate colony; and finally succeeded only after the Declaration of Independence. On 20 September 1776, freemen of the Three Counties of New Castle, Kent and Sussex adopted a Constitution of Independent Sovereignty under the title The Delaware State.

It may seem strange that some heirs received only one shilling; however Dr. Bracken states that these heirs had previously received their inheritance, either in land or in money.

The Clarks

We have traced Martha Jordan from the William Bracken line. Now we find that Martha Jordan and Hugh Clark were married Ol August 1752 in Holy Trinity Church, Wilmington, DE. Hugh lived only three short years after his marriage, and his will . of 18 December 1755 names wife Martha, son Hugh and daughter Eliner; also his brothers James and William and a brother-in-law William Jordan. Further research reveals that he was actually Hugh Clark, Junior. An indenture of 13 August 1774 in which William Addy and wife Eleanor (note the spelling used) sell the Plantation (meaning cleared and plantable land) which she had inherited from her father, mentions dower rights of Elizabeth Clark, widow of Hugh Clark the Elder, as well as rights of Martha Robinson, late widow of Hugh Clark the Younger. No mention is made of Eleanor's brother Hugh, and under terms of the will Hugh, not Eleanor, would have inherited the land, had The plantation consisted of "200 acres, he lived to maturity. more or less" and was sold for the "just and full sum of sixty five pounds current lawful money of Pennsylvania". Hugh Clark Senior is mentioned as a trustee of White Clay Creek Presbyterian Church, Mill Creek Hundred, DE in 1727. This church had been organized in 1721 with Hugh Clark being one of the six trustees. This can be found in the History of Delaware, 1609by J. Thomas Scharf, pg 919. The Historical Society of 1886 Delaware in Wilmington has furnished this newspaper notice from the Pennsylvania Gazette dated 13 February 1750...

"Runaway from subscribers in Mill Creek Hundred, two Irish servantmen, Mark Loler and John Brady. -Hugh Clark and Walter Theadford"

Holy Trinity Church records show that William Addy and Elinor Clark were married 22 December 1768. The bride's name had been spelled Eliner in her father's will and Elinor in the marriage record, but all other records that we have found use the spelling of Eleanor. When copying from civil records or personal papers, we retain the spelling of proper names used in the original.

<u>A Calendar of Delaware Wills, New Castle County 1682-1800</u> was prepared in 1911 by the Delaware Society of the Colonial Dames of America. Original wills then existing in the Registers office were used, and also original Records of Probate, where wills were missing. A thorough search of this work failed to reveal any will for Hugh Clark the Elder, even though his widow Elizabeth had dower rights in the Mill Creek Hundred plantation where Hugh the Younger lived. The compliers of this <u>Calendar</u> stated that many wills "had been carried away" and others defaced or destroyed by careless handling before their work was undertaken. The brief reference to Hugh Clark the Elder in the indenture of 1774 is our only clue to the Clark grandparents of Eleanor.

In the name of God amen the 18th day of November in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and fifty five I Hugh Clark of Mill Creek Hundred in the county of New Castle upon Delaware ? being very sick and sore in body but OF perfect soundness of mind and memory and calling to mind the frailness of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once today do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner following viz first I recomend my soul into the hands of all mighty God that gave it me and my body to the earth to be decently buried in a Christain manner at the direction of my executor hereafter named nothing doubting but I shall reacted the same again at the general resurrection by the mighty power of God and as ? ing such worldly goods where with it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and dispose of the same in the manner and form following.

? . It is my will and I do ordain that in the first place all my just debts and funeral expenses be fully payed and satisfied.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my dear and <u>loving wife Martha</u> all my personal estate and reasonable use of my real estate she commiting no waste there on nor clearing above the quantity of six acres of land besides that already cleared for and during the term of twelve years from my decease she paying all my just debts and funeral expenses and to bring up my children in a decent Christian manner and to give them sufficient schooling and other necessary learning and after the expiration of said twelve years it is my will that my wife Martha shall have the rents ishues and profits of the one third part of my real estate during her natural life and the rents ishues and profits of the remaining

) parts to be equally divided between <u>my daughter Eliner</u> and my son Hugh until my son Hugh arrives at the age of twenty one and then my son Hugh shall have the whole of my real estate to him and his heirs and assigns for ever he paying to his sister <u>Eliner</u> the sum of fourty pounds.

Item. But it is my will and I do order that if my wife Martha will not comply with the above device that she shall have one third part of my personal estate after my just debts are payed and the rents ishues and profits of the third of my real estate after all debts are payed during her natural life and the remainder to be divided as above.

Item. It is my will and I do order that if either of my children die before they come to full age that the survivor shall have the others share and if they both die before they come to full age <u>my brother James</u> shall have t? parts of that left to them and <u>my brother William</u> the remainder and I do hereby nominate and appoint as executor of this my last will and testament my dear and loving wife Martha and my <u>brother in law William Jordaine</u> and thereby revoke disolve and dis ? all other wills and testaments by me in any ways before this time made testifying and confirming this and none other is my last will and testament witness my hand and seal the day above and



7 CHAPTER 2

WILLIAM ADDY AND ELEANOR CLARK

What's in a Name?

<u>Surnames of Ireland</u> by MacLysaght, published by Irish University Press, Shannon, IRE, 1969, gives the following information on page 254:

ADDIS, ADDY: This English name (a pet form of Adam) came to Ireland early in the seventeenth century, first to Westmeath, later to County Cork. It has since become more numerous in northeast Ulster, where the variant form ADDY is also found; neither has been closely identified with any particular area.


Hugh Howell Addy, who spent several summers in England, and included research on the name, stated that the Addys went to Ireland under Cromwell, to put a Protestant population in that highly Catholic area. He also stated that the name is quite common in Yorkshire, and that the town of Sheffield has an Addy street.

Doris Addy Fitzpatrick has contributed the following on the Addy name:

The most ancient grant of a Coat of Arms was researched:

A red background with a silver stripe on which there are three black leopard's faces. The Crest is a gold leopard's face superimposed on a fleur de lis.

The following page gives various times and places where the Addy name has been found.

- English variations of the spelling of the Name "Addy" ("Addie") include "Aday", "Ade", "Adee", "Adey," "Adie", "Ady," and "Atty" All of these are the simple pet form of the name Adam, Hebrew for Red Earth.
- The ancient name was so rare, even in West Riding, Yorkshire that the Poll Tax Returns in 1379 have only 8 examples
 - A Richard Addi of Kexbourough, Korkshire, was made Rector of Dorton on 1 August, 1349 by Henry, Earl of Lancaster
- There is an Addy street in Sheffield, named after Addys who came there in late 1700's.
- A William Addy, baptised at Wath in 1618, later became a London Writing-master and stenographer (He published the Bible in 1687 in his own system of shorthand!)
- A William Addy (12 July 1722) of London, a merchant living at Windsor, left a will. (Buried at Windsor)
- A John Addy witnessed a deed at Cawthorne in 1280.
- An Addy was a librarian at Windsor Castle in 1600's!
- The spelling of "Addy" with two "D's" is a sure sign of Northern origin.
- The name seems to be originally English, but also exists in Ireland and Scotland, probably "travelled" there.
- Our 'Addy' supposedly emigrated to the United States from Ireland. He Would have been born sometime during the 1740's, probably, since he was married in 1768 and was still alive in 1810 for sure. (It is not certain when he died.)

We do not know when our immigrant Addy ancestor arrived on American soil, but our first reference to him, WILLIAM ADDY, is found in Holy Trinity (Old Swede's) Church, Wilmington, DE.

William Addy and Elinor Clark, married 22 December 1768

This can be found on LDS microfilm number 0908217. Eleanor had inherited the Mill Creek Hundred plantation from her father, and although this land was apparently sold in 1774, the young couple evidentally continued to live in that same area. William Addy is shown in the Reconstructed tax list of 1782 and the Reconstructed Census of 1790, the originals having been destroyed during the War of 1812. This census was reconstructed from local tax lists, and the following names are listed in Mill Creek Hundred, Newcastle county:

Eddy, William John, Enoch (Estate of) John, Enoch Esq John Malachia

Below is a copy of a letter from The Historical Society of Delaware, confirming that William Addy was still living in Mill Creek Hundred. Very incomplete records have survived from Revolutionary War days. It is difficult to imagine anyone continuing to live in this area throughout the war without having openly expressed patriotic views and actions. Those even suspected of Tory sympathies were treated very harshly; often their homes were burned and they might be quite literally tarred and feathered and driven from the area. Still, as of now, no "patriotic service" by William Addy has been found.

I must begin by apologizing for our delay in responding to your request for information on William Addy, but we have recently experienced both staff shortages and an unusually large volume of correspondence.

I have enclosed copies of information on Addy and his family that I found in various sources. He was on the reconstructed 1782 state census and the reconstructed federal census for 1790, but not on the 1800 census. He might have died or left the state by then; I found no death records for anyone in the family.

William Addy's name does not appear on any of our oaths of allegiance from the Revolutionary War, nor did I find any reference to him in our military records from that war.

For additional research, you may wish to employ one of the professional genealogists on the enclosed list.

We have not found either a birth or baptism record for William Addy in the LDS microfiche for Ireland or England, nor have we found his name on a ship's passenger list arriving in America. Still, he was definitely here, and as one person remarked, "You can be sure he didn't swim." Eleanor Stafford Weber found a possible clue to his arrival. Listed in Philby's Immigrants to America is a William Eddy, to be transported here for an unstated charge in 1761. An appeal date was given of 29 July 1761 in Cornwall. From British Deportees to America, Part I, 1760-1761, C. N. Smith 1974, Westland Publications, DeKalb, IL. Patrick Eddy, perhaps a brother, was to be deported to The Islands. Then in The Complete Book of Emigrants 1607-1776 and The Complete Book of Emigrants in Bondage, 1614-1775 by Peter Wilson Coldham (Genealogical Publishing co. Inc.) we found the following: William Eddy sentenced to 14 years for receiving, July 1761, Cornwall; to be transported. Patrick Eddy pardoned for entering service by August, 1761, Cornwall. We do not know that this was our William Addy. The fact that he was free to marry the daughter of a yoeman in 1768 (seven years before the bondage expired) certainly raises a question. This was the only William Eddy/Addy found in the above references between 1750 and 1768, but records are, at best, very incomplete. Many orphans were picked up from the streets and sold to ships' captains to be taken to the colonies as indentured servants, and freed when of age. Also, it was the custom to continue given names, and the name Patrick has not been found in later generations of our Addys. There was also a William Addie/Addy in Stafford co. VA during this same time period, with wife Jane; definitely not our William.

After their marriage in 1768, William and Eleanor lived on the plantation in Mill Creek Hundred which she had inherited from her father. The indenture of 1774 indicates the land was sold to a Charles Williams, and the microfilm appears to indicate a signature (not an "X") by both William and Eleanor. Although the name is spelled EDDY in the body of the indenture, the signature is ADDY. But as late as 1790, William's name appears on the tax list for that Hundred, perhaps indicating that another home had been obtained in the area.

At some time after 1790, William moved his family to eastern Berkeley county, Virginia, which was soon divided to form Jefferson county; their two youngest surviving children were born there: Joanna, exact birth date not known, and James born 03 May 1796, according to his own statement. Just across the Potomac River from both Maryland and Pennsylvania, this was an established community in the Great Valley area. In 1790 Shepherdstown began publication of the first newspaper in what later became the state of West Virginia. Public-supported schools began in that region in 1796, the year James was born. He attended "for years".

We have not found a record of the marriage of Nancy Addy to Enoch Jones, but feel it had taken place while they were living in Mill Creek Hundred, DE. Some of the Addy children married while in Virginia; James reports also that some died there.

This area, and the whole western section of Virginia stretching to the Ohio River, had different geographical features and was settled by people of different interests than the tidewater section. The final break came in 1863 when they voted to remain in the Union, and the new state of West Virginia was formed.

The eldest son, Robert, who married, some say for the second time in 1798 in Berkeley county, left for the Ohio country about 1804. In 1808 William and his remaining family were on their way to the Ohio wilderness and the land of the Three Rivers; Tuscarawas, Walhonding and Muskingum. Ohio was the first state to be formed from this wilderness known as the Northwest Territory. It entered the Union in 1803, but there were few significant settlements away from the Ohio River. No United States census exists today for the 1810 period, as it was destroyed when Washington D.C. was burned during the War of 1812.

It should be noted that William B. Craig, descendant of the McCune family who, he states, "travelled with the Addys", shows other marriages than those personally researched. He gives

We found a possible reference to this McCune family in the Miskimen Account Book, which has been a wonderful resource for proving the Addy residence in Ohio before court records or census records were kept. In this account book under date of October 8, 1808, the following entry is shown in the William Addy account:

In 1875 William's youngest son James was interviewed for a series titled "Old Folks Interviewed", which was running in the Pike county, Ohio <u>Republican</u>. Much of our information on William and Eleanor comes from this account. James stated that he knew nothing about his ancestry before his parents. Although Hill's 1881 <u>History of Coshocton County, Ohio</u> states that William Addy and family arrived in Guernsey county, Ohio on Christmas day 1806, and thence on to Coshocton county, James gives the year of 1808, and that land was cleared and wheat planted that fall. The 1806 date has been widely publicized, but we prefer to use the account as given by James, feeling that no pioneer would cross the Allegheny mountains and arrive

in the wilderness in the dead of winter. There would have been neither food nor shelter to get such a large number of people and their livestock through the winter. It is true that they stayed with Robert until their own cabin was built, but we still find it strange that they would delay travel until winter. The addition of nine people would put a severe strain on the winter's food supply. A recently published Old Account Book of James Miskimen, Coshocton County, OH 1807-1827 shows an account of William Addy on June 20, 1808 with an account of $57\frac{1}{2}$ cents brought forward. The descendant who published this book does not have, and does not know of, any earlier book still existing. Other entries for William Addy appear in the years 1809, 1811, 1816, 1818. There is nothing to indicate which William Addy. Under June 1, 1808 (possibly should be July), is shown "by spinning, Annah 1.00" and several other entries on that page state "per Anny". These could refer to Joanna, daughter of William 1st. The year 1808 is probably correct, and an early summer arrival seems indicated.

A page of the account book is included here. Entries shown as <u>to</u> indicate a purchase and those shown as <u>by</u> are payments. Most payments were worked off, as when Annah did spinning, or someone worked in James' field or helped with rafting or canoeing trips to Zanesville or Cambridge. We are somewhat astounded by the amount of whiskey consumed, which seemed to be the principal product carried by the trading post. Money of any type was scarce on the frontier, and trading work of some kind for needed products was the common method of exchange.

When the Land Office in Zanesville opened Military Lands to the public in 1812, William, Hugh and Robert Addy purchased land in Coshocton county from the U. S. government. Robert had arrived possibly two or more years before William and his family, and they all purchased land in the same area. In the next twenty to thirty years the rapid sale of lands in Ohio, Indiana and Illinois led to the expression "doing a Land Office Business."

Just as we are not sure of birth dates for William and Eleanor, neither can we be sure of their death dates or burial spots. Family stories indicate that Eleanor may have died in Coshocton county, which seems to be born out by the 1820 census record. Neither Eleanor nor William have been found on that census, living alone or with one of their children in Coshocton or Guernsey counties. Stories also indicate that William moved to Knox township, Guernsey county with his son William 2nd after 1826 and that his was the first burial in Hopewell cemetery. in 1827. If this is the case, why did not William 1st sell the land in Coshocton county, rather than his son and Wealtha? The first burial date of 1827 cannot be either proved or disproved at this time, as no stone has been found for him in recent years.

MORE OLD FOLKS INTERVIEWED - PIKE CO OH JULY 1 1875

I have not a very long yarm to tell. I was 79 years old on the 3d day of last May, consequently was born in 1796. Old Virginia is my native state. I was born in Jefferson county, within three miles of Harper's Ferry, on the Shepardstown road, and lived there till I was twelve years old, when my father came to Ohio and settled in Ooshocton county, on Wills' creek near a village now known as Jacobsport.

My father's given name was William. He was a native of Ireland. Mother's maiden name was Ellen Clark. I know nothing of my progenitors beyond my own parents.

I am the youngest of fifteen children. Only two of us are alive. My sister Mary married Reason Baker. They reside in Coshocton county.

I well remember the journey from Virginia to Coshocton county. We came in a wagon, to which five horses were attached. We brought out seven horses and several cows. Two of my sisters, Martha and Nancy, were already married, and they remained behind, but afterwards came to Ohio. Brother Robert was also married, and had also come out to Tuscarawas county, and we settled near him. Some of the children had died in Virginia. Nine came out at once, viz: Father and Mother, sisters Mary and Joanna, and William, Hugh, John, Thomas, and myself. As it was in 1808 when we journed, we did not meet with any great difficulty in getting along. One incident impressed me deeply. When we were on top of the Allegheny mountains we came across two parties who had met, strangers to us, but evidently relatives or old acquaintances. They were crying bitterly. They were on pack horses. It seems that one family had started for the west; the other was returning from the west to Virginia. I suppose the returning party gave a most lugubrious account of affairs in the west, and with such effect as to cause the emigrating party to turn back. When we arrived in Tuscarawas county we remained with brother Robert. There were no other whites within six miles of us, but plenty of Indians. Father and the boys proceeded to make a small clearing; erect a cabin, and we moved in, when clearing out the forest for a farm was at once commenced. We arrived in the fall. That fall we sowed some wheat, and the next spring planted corn. The com was healthy and good, but the wheat was sickly, and though it apparently made good flour and light, nice bread, it made us sick to eat it. A part of the grains had a red end, and it was those grains which contained the poison. Even the cattle and hogs were made sick by eating it. But the crop of wheat grown on the same land the second year was good.

When about fifteen years of age, I imagined I was not so well treated as I ought to be, but for so thinking, I have since become fully persuaded, I was a very foolish youngster. I was jealous of my older brothers, and thought I was neglected because they were getting what befitted their age, and which I was eventually allowed in due course of time. So I, like many other foolish and undutiful sons, resolved to run away. So I "lit out" between two days, and clandestinely left kind parents and loving brothers and sisters to be pained at my conduct and apprehensive for my comfort and even safety. I went to Dillon's Furnace, near Zanesville, and hired out as a chopper. In the course of three or four months my brothers Hugh, William and John came down Wills' Creek and the Muskingum River with a raft of timber, and learning my whereabouts, came to see me and persuaded me to return home, where I remained awhile, till another runaway fit seized me, and I went away again, this time "toling" away a nephew, my sister's child. We were overtaken, when some miles away, by my companion's father, Enoch Jones, who took his son back with him, and said to me that my brothers would soon overtake and carry me back. We had agreed to go to Virginia, but on being left alone I changed my course and went to Cambridge, and from thence struck out to Zanesville again. On reaching that place I found a man going down the Muskingum and Ohio Rivers to Cincinnati with a boat load of produce, who hired me as a hand. Proceeded to that city where I hired out to work for ten dollars a month. This was in 1812.

After a while I became acquainted with James Guthrie, an anny contractor. He offered me \$20.00 a month to team for him. I engaged, and he sent me up to St. Mary's, Auglaize county, with a four-horse team, loaded with anny supplies. I was gone more than two weeks, and owing to the desperate condition of the roads and the cold winter weather, I suffered terribly. I could not

be induced to try another trip at teaming. I was gone from home a year or more, before I returned. When I did so, I found the latch string out, and my family were as glad to see me as though I had not been a very undutiful son.

In the spring of 1813, I went to Pittsburgh. But my badness had not been fully "sweated" out of me, for I again "toled" away my nephew. We reached Pittsburg. I was employed to go on a boat up the Allegheny. I afterwards followed boating several years, to some advantage, financially.

In 1818, when twenty-two years of age, I purchased and paid for 160 acres of land in Guernsey co, owned a horse, cow, and some other property. On the 19th day of November, I married Rebecca Warden, and we have had twelve children, viz: John, Hugh Clark, Jane, Ellen, Elizabeth, Isaac, Mary, Nancy and William, twins, Mahala, Susannah and George. All grew up to maturity but Mahala, and the others married except Elizabeth and Jane, who died when young women.

John married Nancy Walls, in Pike county. They have eight children. Hugh Clark married Rebecca Penisten. They have but one child, Joseph Allen. They reside in Newton Township, Pike county, on Chenoweth's Fork. Ellen married, first, Samuel Wilt, by whom whe had three children. He died and she married Allen Johnson, by when she had seven or eight children. They reside in Twin Township, Ross county. Isaac married Mary Ann Toops and removed to Iowa, where they now reside. They have nine children. Mary married John Hanna. They have four boys. They reside in Iowa. Nancy married Henry H. Finley, have four children and also reside in Iowa. William married Elizabeth O'Brien of Pike county, moved to Kansas and died there, leaving three children. George married Mary Ann Bishop and had two children. They are all dead.

I cleared a part of my original purchase, lived on it some years, sold out, moved to Sandusky, Ohio, where Jane died. Then came to Highland county and then to Pike, thence to Purgett's farm in Rose county where I resided six years. Then I bought $107\frac{1}{2}$ acres in Twin Township, Ross co where I now reside. My wife and I still reside on one-half of it, and our son John on the other.


In 1836 my wandering propensities returned, and I was induced to visit the Indian tribes on the Red River and west and northwest as far as Oregon. I was among them, in company with a few other whites, more than five months. The best land I found was in Texas, though I passed over much that tempted me to desire to own. I liked Oregon very much.

I possess some peculiarities of character. I never called a physician to administer medicine to myself. I never had a lawsuit, nor do I want one. Never have had any business in a court higher than Justice's and then only was a witness or juror. Have always belonged to the Democratic party. The first presidential candidate I voted for was Andrew Jackson. Have voted at each presidential election since, except for Martin Van Buren, and did not vote for him because I was among the Indians, and could not.

I attended school in Virginia, pretty constantly, for years and got a good start educationally speaking. I now enjoy reading and like to peruse your "Old Folks Interviewed," but I never expected to be the subject of one till you came along today (June 12, 1875). I have never seen my name in print, nor do I know how I shall feel when I do. And I expect my companion, who has traveled down the tide of time with me nearly fifty-seven years, will feel as queer as I will, when she learns that I have gone and put her name in the newspaper.

Although sons have been named HUGH CLARK, HUGH, and CLARK in every generation since William and Eleanor, it was not until this appeared reprinted in the OGS <u>The Report</u>, Winter 1978, that the family realized just where the names originated. James did not know the names of his grandparents.

Let us go back in time a couple hundred years, to try to understand the hardships and culture shock Eleanor must have felt as she made a home in the new state of Ohio. She had been born about 1753 in the family home in New Castle county, Delaware, the third generation of her family to live on that plantation. We can feel fairly sure they had a small but comfortable colonial farm home, a dug well and out-buildings for livestock. Neighbors were not far off. The city of Wilmington offered all the goods that were available to New Yorkers of the the time. She was only fifteen when married in 1768, and continued to live in that area until after 1790, when they moved to Jefferson co. Virginia. Their son James reported that they lived within three miles of Harpers Ferry, on the Potomac River. It was a settled area and life was not too different from her old home.

Now, at the age of 55, they had packed everything in the wagon and started off again. This time to a new, unsettled, unexplored wilderness, where the only neighbors would be those who had gone with them. Ohio was the first state to be carved from west of the Allegheny mountains. Hill's HISTORY lists William Addy among the very early permanent settlers in what was to become Coshocton Prior to this, trappers and hunters had roamed the woods county. but had not made a home. George Washington had surveyed Ohio in 1748-9, but only along the Ohio River had there sprung up permanent settlements. Early pioneers to eastern Ohio were largely from New England, Virginia, Pennsylvania and Maryland. They came on foot over the Alleghenys; only the very young and the very old were allowed to ride and add to the burden of the wagon, if, in fact, they had a wagon. That wagon could carry a family's entire possessions, including food for the trip, clothing, perhaps a piece of furniture or a farm implement. Some came on pack horse only, their belongings in the saddle bag. It took about 40 to 55 days to cross over with a wagon, pack horses were faster, but less comfortable.

Once their destination was reached, trees were felled and cabins of rough logs were erected, usually 15 or 20 feet square, with a dirt floor and a loft. This was their living, cooking and sleeping space; and might include a dozen or even two dozen people, as no traveller was ever turned away. Wild game was plentiful, and wild berries, nuts and fruits in season added to the bill-of-fare. A small garden would yield corn, beans, melons, potatoes, squash, pumpkins and turnips. The hominy block was in common use. Tt. was a section of tree trunk with a hole about a foot deep burned In this, corn and occasionally wheat, could be into the center. pounded into meal. It was truly earning their bread by the sweat of their brows. Mills were often far apart, as well as frozen up in winter and washed away with spring floods. The hominy block was the only way to have meal for bread.



For cooking, a lug pole would be built across the inside of the chimney, a chain suspended from it, with hooks attached for the mush pot and teakettle. Iron was scarce on the frontier and often one pot would serve for every function; boil water for herb tea or chicory coffee, boil potatoes, bake bread and fry meat. Hogs were earmarked and turned loose in the woods to live on mast, hence the expression "Root, hog; or die." Actually, they grew fat on the wild feast. Food was usually sufficient, but monotonous; cornbread and milk for breakfast, hog and hominy for dinner, and mush and milk for supper was the winter fare, perhaps augmented by a small garden in season, along with berries and nuts of the forest.

Eleanor and the other women in the group would have brought their precious herbs with them. Medicine was home made, and many soon found that friendly Indians had a vast store of wild herbal knowledge. Together they could often produce about the same results as the city doctor.

Within fifteen or twenty years after William Addy entered the Ohio wilderness, villages had sprung up along all the rivers and streams and it was rapidly losing its frontier aspect. The part of the Ohio Canal going through Coshocton county was built in 1827-30, with the first canal boat, the "Monticello", arriving August 21, 1830. From that day on, boats and rafts arrived almost daily, and Coshocton county ceased to be the frontier, but part of a bustling economic community. Neither William nor Eleanor, however, lived to see that day.

This sketch of life on the Ohio frontier was compiled from various histories, including Hill's HISTORY OF COSHOCTON COUNTY.

Below we see a typical frontier log cabin and the family it housed. We do not know the people nor the location, other than "southern Ohio". Two of the men are wearing what might be Civil War uniforms, which places this half a century later than our Ohio pioneers. But the sod roof, the spinning wheel, the dresses, would all be very similar to those used in earlier years.



John Chapman, known to us as Johnny Appleseed, was a well-known figure in the Guernsey and Coshocton county area. He was said to have thought himself a messenger sent into the wilderness to prepare the way for those who were to follow, much as John the Baptist was sent to prepare the way for Christ. Johnny gathered apple seeds from the cider presses of western Pennsylvania, saving them in leather bags, and carrying them on his back or by mule, and sometimes by boat on the Ohio River, to the Ohio country. As he was known to have a brother in eastern Indiana, he is also presumed to have trekked that far on his mission of planting apple orchards to provide fruit for the settlers. Johnny is shown here in typical frontier garb for summer, which would be supplemented in winter by buckskin jacket, trousers and boots. Clothing was of rough linsey-woolsey, a mixture of home-grown flax and sheep wool. A rare "dress-up" garment would be of fine spun linen or wool.

The city of Mansfield, Ohio, in Richland county, has a monument to John Chapman which reads:

In memory of John Chapman, best known as Johnny Appleseed, Pioneer apple nurseryman of Richland county from 1810 to 1830.

Many stories are told of William Addy. Perhaps he WAS a "wild and restless spirit", as one account states, but he was certainly a hard working and determined one. The indenture of 1774 would indicate that he could sign his name, and he quickly learned the lessons of the wilderness and survival.

In the area where the Addys settled, there was a rather irascible Indian called Chief Doughty, who preferred to loiter near the white settlements. One story concerning William and Doughty has been printed in two or three different versions, and we have heard that many others. In this particular version, William Addy and James Miskimen were returning from a canoe trip to Zanesville with a load of supplies, a two-day trip. At some point they saw Doughty, who was well known to them, walking along the bank. He begged them for a ride and they consented. A large part of their cargo was whiskey, and Doughty got into this, drinking until he became rather rowdy. As his boisterousness continued, they pulled in to shore and put him out forcibly. When they shoved off again without him, Doughty threatened to shoot, only to realize that his gun was not loaded. He began to reload, and William and James realized he was in earnest. They again pulled in to shore. Miskimen rowed while William kept Doughty covered with his gun. Then Miskimen jumped to shore, grabbed Doughty, knocking him down, took his gun and threw it out into deep water, leaving Doughty lying semi-conscious on the ground. They arrived home without further incident, but several days later a group of ten or twelve armed Indians called on the men, demanding Doughty's gun, or they would shoot to kill. At first our men refused the demand, but later gave in to the pleadings of their wives. An old gun was obtained from Miskimen's trading post and given to Doughty, and no further threats were made.

Not long after this incident, Indians began leaving the area for the west, but Doughty stayed for several years. When drunk, he would visit the cabins and give blood-curdling tales of savagery to frighten the women and children. He always attended log-rollings, cabin raisings and other gatherings, enjoying the food, telling stories, but never doing any work. Another version of this story states it was Thomas Addy rather than William.

"Coshocton" appears to be an English version of the name of the Indian town at the forks of the Tuscarawas/Walhonding/ Muskingum rivers...Goschachgunk...so spelled by the Moravian missionary, David Zeisberger, who established villages for Christian Indians in Coshocton and Tuscarawas counties before the American Revolution.



James Miskimen, a Pioneer of Birds Run.—About the year 1808, William Addy, many of whose descendants are now living in the northwestern part of Guernsey county, came to that section and established a home near the Indian town. Other settlers came to live in the same community, but the Indians did not molest them. One of the pioneers was James Miskimen who came from Virginia. He entered a large tract of land upon which he established a sort of trading post. He kept a store, selling to the settlers and trading merchandise to the Indians for fur and other commodities they might have to exchange.

Miskimen received his supplies from Zanesville. It was here, too, that he sold his fur. For transportation purposes he used a large canoe which was propelled by poles along the waters of Wills creek until the Muskingum River was reached, then along that stream to Zanesville.

Doughty Angered.—On one occasion, when his stock of goods was about exhausted, he took with him William Addy and the Indian, Chief Doughty, to assist on the journey. Nothing unusual occurred on the trip down. Laying in a supply of goods, which consisted mainly of corn meal and whisky, they started on their homeward voyage. A short distance below Jacobsport in Coshocton county, they saw a large band of Indians on the shore, who invited them to land. Under the circumstances they deemed it advisable to do so.

The Indians asked for a drink of whisky, which was given them. A jollification followed, in which Doughty took part. The white men became alarmed, knowing that their lives would be in danger if the Indians learned that a considerable part of the cargo was whisky. They jumped into the canoe and shoved off as quickly as possible, leaving Doughty behind. This aroused the anger of the Indian, who snatched up his gun and aimed it at Miskimen. Fortunately for the trader, it was not loaded. Doughty then proceeded with all haste to load the gun, threatening all the time he was doing so that he would kill them both if they would not return.

Miskimen Threatened.—Miskimen, in the meantime, had given the pole to Addy, and with his rifle aimed at Doughty's heart, repeatedly inquired of his companion if he should fire. Addy advised him not to do so, as it would bring on a conflict with the whole band of Indians and they could not hope to escape. Some of the more discreet Indians wrenched the gun from Doughty's hands, whereupon the two white men returned and took him on b ard the boat, following which they proceeded up the stream.

The old chief, believing that his dignity was insulted, behaved very ugly, so much so, that Miskimen felt it necessary to knock him down and throw his gun into the water. Doughty then threatened to take Miskimen's life at the first opportunity.

Peace Made. - For several days after returning home Miskimen kept close to the trading post. Doughty had been insulted in the presence of his braves and would probably attempt to kill him. One evening he saw six Indians coming towards his home. He closed the door and prepared to defend himself. One of them advanced as if for a parley. Miskimen opened the door and was told that their mission was friendly. They had come in behalf of Doughty, who, they said, was grieving over the loss of his gun, and if Miskimen would give them another, there would be no further trouble. Miskimen told them he had but one gun, which he could not spare; however, if they would stay till morning he would get them one. The next morning a gun was furnished by a neighbor, which the Indians bore off as a peace offering to Doughty, whose enmity was heard of no more. A few years later he was killed by a white settler near Zanesville.

Hugh Addy, Robert Addy, Rezin Baker and David Maple were in a company of volunteers composed of the 2nd Battalion, 2nd Regiment, 4th Brigade and 3rd Division Ohio Militia, who volunteered for the defense of the Mansfield Frontier under Captain William Beard, commencing 26 August 1812, by order of Return J. Meigs, Governor of Ohio. As this does not include William Addy 2nd, we feel he returned to Virginia upon purchasing land in Coshocton county. The above Militia information is from <u>Coshocton County</u> <u>Centennial History 1811-1911</u> by Samuel H. Nicholas

After peace returned in 1814, our Nation began in earnest its westward expansion. Coshocton county, "crossroads of the Nation", showed a total of 11,162 persons in the 1830 census.

WRITE ME A LETTER....SEND IT BY MAIL

Those of us today who complain of the seemingly frequest raises in postal rates need to pause a moment and acquaint ourselves with an earlier postal system. When our ancestors moved from the East to Ohio, envelopes were not used. A single sheet of paper was written upon, then folded and sealed, the seal usually furnished by the local postmaster. The address was written on the outside of the letter. Rates were based upon a "single letter" and upon the distance that letter would go. Up to a distance of 40 miles was eight cents, then ten cents for up to 90 miles, and so on, until a single letter travelling 500 miles or more would cost 25 cents. This was no small fee, considering that a man could pole a loaded raft upstream all day for fifty cents. Consequently, letters between the folks back East and those who had gone West were sent only to announce a marriage, a new child, or a death, if indeed, any letters were sent at all. Remember, that on the frontier schools were often nonexistant, and that many could neither read nor write.

"Double letters", those consisting of two sheets of paper, doubled the postage cost. Newspapers were important, and our federal government wanted an informed public. For one cent a newspaper could be delivered to any postoffice in the state where it had been printed. And the person who **received** any of this mail paid the postage. Hence "dead letters", or those not picked up and paid for at the local postoffice accumulated rather rapidly.

Postmasters would sometimes hand out letters, or especially weekly newspapers "on credit". Collecting these debts was difficult, and in 1825 Postmaster General John McLean sent out an order requiring all subscribers of magazines and newspapers to pay for each quarter's delivery in advance, or they would not receive their mail. As a postmaster's salary consisted of a commission based on a percentage of his collections, it was important to collect.

The first U.S. postage stamps were issued on Ol July, 1847, and this time the sender prepaid for delivery of his mail. Our postal system at that time covered a larger territory than any other in the world. The stamp for a single letter cost five cents and would take a letter 300 miles. But many senders refused to use the new prepaid stamps, as they were uncertain that the letter would reach its intended destination. Finally, the prepaid postage stamp became compulsory in 1855. This also eliminated the large amount of dead letters at local postoffices.

The above is from "Postal History of Coshocton County Ohio 1805-1961", sponsored by Three Rivers Stamp Club.

The world's first pre-glued postage stamp was issued in Great Britain in 1840. It carried a picture of Queen Victoria, and sold for 1_p .

In the 1930's a one ounce letter could be sent anywhere in the United States for two cents, and a stamped postal card could be purchased from the postoffice for one cent.

Some old cemetery listings show a William Addy died 1827, buried beside his wife Wealtha Ann. Of course the William buried beside Wealtha is William 2nd, and his stone clearly reads 1857. But by reading it as 1827 and subtracting the ag 77 yrs inscribed on the stone, we arrive at 1750, which has been given as the birthdate of William 1st.

Over twenty five years of researching records and talking with the few older relatives, we have learned much about William and Eleanor Clark Addy. But there is so much we do not know. Why, under what conditions, and when did William Addy leave his native Ireland and arrive in the New World? Why did he and Eleanor leave the snug home and well kept fields of Mill Creek Hundred for the wilderness of Ohio? What motivated these early settlers to keep moving on and on, forever westward bound?

Some of the facts that we do know include:

Eleanor Clark's ancestry back to William Bracken, 1702

Sale of Eleanor's ancestral lands in Mill Creek Hundred, 1774

Residence still in Mill Creek Hundred in 1782 and 1790

Names of their ten surviving children

Marriage dates and spouses of most of their children

Burial places of most of their children

William was evidentally a good provider, as shown by the number of livestock driven to Ohio

He was courageous, as shown in the account with Chief Doughty

He was evidentally well respected by his sons, as each one is thought to have named a son for him; James referred to "kind parents".

Although William stated he was born in Ireland, the Addy name has definite English roots.

We have no birthdate for William Addy, but feel it would have been ca 1740/5 in Ulster, Northern Ireland. We have been unable to find any early information on him, at this date. We do know more of Eleanor's background, as shown under Bracken and Clark. In fact, we know more that did their children. Eleanor was b ca 1753 in Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE to Hugh Clark the Younger and wife Martha Jordan; Hugh died just a short time later. William and Eleanor are both believed to have died before the 1820 U.S. census was taken in Coshocton co OH, and may have been buried in the early portion of the Plainfield cemetery... originally called Jacobsport. This very old portion is on a steep hillside facing north, and the old soft stones are so eroded that it is impossible to tell if any inscription had been on them. Many empty spaces indicate burials where stones no longer exist. Cemetery records do not extend back much before the year 1850.

Of fifteen children born to this couple, ten survived to adulthood. We are listing our best "guesstimate" of birth order.

- Robert Addy b ca 1770 Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE, d between writing will on 19 Apr 1846 and next Court Term of 30 June 1846 when it was presented for probate. Married 1) Elizabeth Hughes 14 Apr 1798 Berkeley co VA, 2) Margaret Ault ca 1812 in VA, 3) Ann Norris 15 Aug 1820 Coshocton co OH, who also d before probate of Robert's will. It is suggested that there may have been an earlier marriage in DE, but we have no records, if so.
- 2. Martha Addy b ca 1771 Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE d ca 1832 Linton tp, Coshocton co OH. No stonë or record of burial place has been found; m Malachai Jones 25 Aug 1789 Holy Trinity ch, Wilmington, DE
- 3. Nancy Addy b ca 1773 Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE, d ca 1835 Guernsey co OH. No record or stone known to exist. m Enoch Jones ca 1790 possibly DE or VA, but no record has been found. Enoch was brother to Malachai.
- 4. Hugh Clark Addy b ca 1777 Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE, will probated 28 Jul 1828, having been written on 08 Apr and signed with an "X", as did many of that time. This may mean he was too weak to write, or that he could not write. No marriage known.
- 5. William Addy 2nd b 03 Dec 1780 Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE d 21 Nov 1857 Knox tp, Guernsey co OH, bu Hopewell cem, Khox tp, Guernsey co OH; m Wealtha Ann Jones possibly 1805 in Jefferson/Berkeley of Loudon co VA. No record has been found. VA did not keep marriage records until many years later. Wealtha was not a sister of Malachai and Enoch, as shown by the heirs named in her father's estate administration. Wealtha b ca 1787 d 16 Feb 1848 "in her 61 yr", bu Hopewell, Knox tp Guernsey co OH.

- 6. John Addy b ca 1787 Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE, said to have d ca 1830's in AR; m 08 Jun 1818 Nancy Malone in Coshocton co OH. Was in 1820 Guernsey co census.
- 7. Mary Addy b 14 Oct 1789 Mill Creek Hundred, New Castle co DE d 31 Dec 1876 Coshocton co OH ag 87 yr, 2 mo, 17 da; m Rezin Baker 03 Aug 1813 Coshocton co OH. Only Mary and her brother James were living when James was interviewed in 1875 and told the story of the Addy family.
- 8. Thomas Addy b ca 1792 according ages given in various census records, which would put the family in Berkeley co VA. He m Nelly Marlatt 25 Mar 1816 in Coshocton co OH and m 2) Mary Shafer 26 Jul 1824 in Coshocton co OH. He was in the 1820 Guernsey co census, 1830 Coshocton co census, and the 1840 Pulaski co AR census. He died in Pulaski co 1842.
- 9. Joanna Addy b ca 1794 in Berkeley co VA m David Maple on 15 Oct 1818 in Coshocton co OH. They are in the 1820 census with no children, both their ages given as 26/45. In 1830 they are shown with 1 male under 5, 1 male 5/10, 1 male 20/30; 1 female under 5 and 1 female 30/40. David died Oct 1839 without a will but administration of his estate names no wife; Joanna must have preceded him in death.
- A James Addy b 03 May 1796 in Jefferson co VA d 09 Mar 1881 Ross co OH; m Rebecca Warden 19 Nov 1818 in Guernsey co OH. Although James was b in Jefferson co VA, it does not indicate a move of residence for the Addy family; Berkeley county had been divided, a portion of it becoming Jefferson co.

Ohio was the only state to be divided into counties before entering the Union as a state. These were large territorial areas that were subsequently divided again and again until the present 88 counties were finally arrived at. In 1810 Muskingum county included the present counties of Muskingum, Morgan, Coshocton and part of Holmes. The area that is now Coshocton county was separated into a political unit in 1811. The War of 1812 temporarily slowed the westward migration, and at the close of that war there were just one hundred thirty-eight resident landholders in Coshocton county. This does not include renters and "squatters". Land tracts varied in size from 35 acres to over 4,000 acres; some of those landholders were Hugh Addy, William Addy, James McCune, John McCune, and James Miskimen.


Oral records of this early period were full of the hardships and efforts to clear and plant the land and build homes. Sickness was everywhere. A form of congestive chills called "cold plague" was very prevalent, causing many deaths. Backwaters of the three rivers were excellent breeding grounds for mosquitoes. Yet, in spite of all this, settlers continued to arrive, children were born, and the area continued to grow.

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WILLIAM ADDY AND ELEANOR CLARK

This is the Ohio our ancestors knew, taken from the OHIO HISTORICAL SOCIETY PREVIEW, Spring 1995, which states:

"This map was drawn by John Melish and can be dated by internal evidence. Fort Meigs, built in 1813, is shown, but Columbus, officially the state capital from 1816, is not." We should also note that Coshocton is shown, but Cambridge, where town lots were sold in 1806, is not. In 1798 Col. Ebenezer Zane laid out his famous Zane's Trace, stretching from Wheeling, (W)VA to Maysville, KY. It was on this trail that a tavern was erected in 1798 by a Mr. Graham; the site becoming Cambridge a few years later. Please note the curved line stretching westward from Wheeling to Zanesville, then diagonally southwest to the Ohio River above the "E" in Kentucky. This is Zane's Trace, connecting across the river to the Natchez Trail, and finally, New Orleans. Cambridge is approximately 28 miles east of Zanesville and 38 miles west of St. Clairsville on the Trace, or I-70, as it is known today. The Ohio Historical Society dates this map as between 1813 and 1816.



CHAPTER 3

DESCENDANTS OF ROBERT ADDY, SR.

Although an early marriage in DE has been mentioned for Robert, we have no record of this, nor do we have knowledge of children from that marriage. Admittedly, we have very little information on his older children, and would appreciate receiving such from his descendants.

The 1820 Coshocton co OH census shows Robert Addy with 3 males under 10 years, 1 male 16/18, 2 males 16/26 (note overlapping age), 1 male 45/up and 1 female 45/up. We have no information on children of Margaret Ault other than **Jacob Ault Addy**, but there were two other boys under 10 years of age. The 16/26 category could also include the one son ag 16/18; in that case these 2 sons would be **William** b 1802 and **Anthony T.** b 1804, both unmarried and at home in 1820.

Robert's death can be fixed between the writing of his will on 19 Apr 1846 and its probate date of 30 June 1846. As wills were seldom made before the death bed, and as he signed the will with an "X", indicating a very weak state of health, it is felt that death came soon after execution of the will. Also it is noted that the introductory statement by the Court refers to the fact that Robert's <u>widow</u> had died before the probate date of 30 June 1846. Probably 19 or 20 April is closest to Robert's actual death.

Robert's will mentions by name only his wife Ann and two sons, William and Anthony, plus William's son John. It refers to "all my other children". He also names three women, with no relationship given; Catherine Tipton, Elisabeth Baker, and Ann Norris the daughter of William Norris. There were several men named William Norris residing in Coshocton county, and it is not possible to say which was the father of this Ann. None of the men mentioned by <u>Hill</u> were married to an Addy, however. Robert's sister Mary, who married Rezin Baker, had a daughter Elizabeth Baker born about 1820/21. She is in the 1850 census ag 29 and unmarried. Perhaps this is the Elisabeth referred to in his will.

The following is taken from <u>The History of Van Wert and Mercer</u> <u>Counties</u>, <u>OH 1882</u>...by Sutton

"John Addy was born in Coshocton county, Ohio in 1825. He was reared on a farm and has followed farming as a business all his life. In 1848 he went with his father to Mercer county and they, between them, entered 140 acres of land in Blackcreek township, for which they paid \$160.00 These lands had been in market for a number of years but had been considered worthless on account of being swampy. These lands were known as canal lands, and belonged to the State. Being unsalable, they were reduced in price and sold for one dollar and one-half cent per acre. After purchasing his land he returned to Coshocton county where, in 1849, he married Miss Catharine Albert and brought her the same year to his new home in Blackcreek. When Mr. Addy landed on his place in 1849 he had only money enough left, after paying moving expenses, to buy a cow, a barrel of flour, and a little meat. Then he commenced in the solid green woods with nothing but a strong and willing pair of hands. He cleared land for others to get means to support himself and wife. At intermediate times he would clear on his own land, till finally he had tillable land enough cleared to support themselves. Mr. Addy soon commenced a system of drainage on his, considered worthless, swampy lands, and has continued draining and tiling until he now has one of the finest and most productive farms in Mercer county. Some of the citizens claim that Mr. Addy has the best farm in the county. It is all under good improvement, with fine buildings. Mr. and Mrs. Addy now have a family of eight childing living, all still on the home place. Two of his sons were in the late war, viz, William and Jabez. Jabez died in the hospital at Nashville, Tennessee" (Author's note: William and Jabez were his brothers, not his sons.)

Descendants of William A. Addy/Addie (William, Robert, Wm 1st) Surname is spelled ADDIE in census records, enlistment and military records, and in Mary Ann's application for widow's pension. Perhaps William believed he had been discharged, as he lived openly in his home county, and was shown in various publications (county history, marriage and census records) as a veteran. What a terrible shock to his widow to learn that no pension was available, as her husband was classified a deserter. Mary Ann was living in Fremont, Sandusky co OH when filing the pension application . Application was witnessed by Maude B. Addie...no relationship noted. William died 27 Sep 1903. His military description states 5'10", dark complexion, black hair, black eyes.

It is not known why William changed the spelling of his surname. His parents, his brothers used the Addy spelling. When Addie was first seen, it was thought to be the spelling of the census taker; however, after obtaining his military records, it became apparent that William, himself, preferred that spelling.



Robert Addy was the first of his family to leave the settled area of Virginia for the frontier of Ohio. The <u>History of</u> <u>Coshocton County OH 1881</u> by Hill gives this information:

"Robert Addy, a wild and daring spirit, came from the Virginia banks of the Potomac in 1804 and soon after settled on Will's creek in Linton township. In 1815 or 1816 he moved to this (Adams) township, settling in the southwest portion of section 12. He had been drafted in the War of 1812 a short time before its termination, and was on his way to the seat of war when news of peace was received."

The Addy family very soon spread out into several counties in Ohio, as well as several different states. To aid you in your research of early Ohio, a map of the final counties is shown, along with the year of organization. Although a county may have been established earlier, it did not function as a county until it was organized. The year shown on this map represents the year of formal organization, and the records of the County Recorder should begin in that year. Since many counties were formed from existing counties, earlier records may exist in the parent county or counties. It is possible for a landowner never to have moved, yet various records may show as many as four different counties of residence. From Ohio Lands, A Short History. (Auditor of State, Columbus,OH)

In pre-Columbian days, Coshocton county was home to the Native Americans whom we now call "Mound Builders", and there were many mounds in the valleys located along the rivers and major streams of the county. Years ago, most of these mounds were excavated and cataloged, to save them from just being plowed through in the course of farming, or from curoisity seekers. Some were burial mounds containing one or more skeletons, as well as stone implements and pottery vessels. It appeared to those doing this work that perhaps the importance of the buried person or persons dictated the height of the mound, which could reach a height of over 20 feet. Other mounds seemed to be sites of sacrifice containing a stone altar on the original ground level, charred remains of bones of animal and human sacrifices, and then the mound built over the spot.

After spending some days on a cousin's farm in Coshocton county about 1930, the author's brothers returned home with stories of one of these mounds which was the object of a "dig" at that time. These mounds have more recently been carbon-dated to about 1000 A.D.

Descendants of Robert Addy remained in or near the Coshocton county area, while others joined the growing emigration wagon trains that headed West on a weekly basis throughout the weeks of early spring. Coshocton county was sometimes referred to as "crossroads of the Nation" because of the traffic passing through it.

Today, Coshocton may be called "Freedom City", as it produces that most recognizable freedom symbol in the world, the Stars and Stripes. The Colonial Flag Company employs sixty workers and turns out thousands of flags of various sizes each week, according to an article in the June, 1995 <u>Legion Magazine</u>. These are all sewn from strips of cloth, with the fifty stars also sewn onto the blue field. They are not the small printed flags, which are usually made overseas. Colonial is a subsidiary of Annin and Company, the world's oldest and largest flag manufacturer.

2. Martha Addy and Malachai Jones, son of Enoch Jones, Esq. of Mill Creek Hundred, Newcastle co DE were married 25 Aug 1789 in Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, Wilmington, DE, the fourth generation of her family to be married in this historic old church. Originally built as a Swedish Lutheran house of worship, it also goes by the name of "Old Swedes Church".

Martha and Malachai are reported to be parents of seven sons and five daughters. We have very little information on either Martha or her sister Nancy, and would welcome any additions to our limited knowledge. We know from the interview with James Addy that this couple, as well as Nancy and Enoch, did not emigrate to Ohio with their parents, but arrived a year or two later. With no birth records for guidance, it is quite impossible to determine to which parents a child belonged, and we are showing here our best knowledge.

Jon R. Kime states that "Martha" has been a family name since "the early days", and that family stories indicate they are descended from Martha and Malachai Jones. The above Edward Zane Williams was a descendant of Jonathan Zane, Ohio frontiersman and brother of the noted Col. Ebenezer Zane. Jonathan's daughter, Eliza Jane Zane married John Williams in Wheeling, WVA in 1810, then moved to Coshocton co OH in 1823 and on to Benton co IA in 1854. A detailed history of this family has been preserved.

We do not have a marriage date for Nancy Addy and Enoch Jones, but it is felt that they married before the family left Delaware for Virginia. The Addys and Joneses were near neighbors in Mill Creek Hundred. It has been reported that Nancy is buried in Maple Ridge cem, Peoria co IL with a death date of 10 May 1844; however that is the date on the stone of her husband, Enoch Jones. His age is given as 80 years. There is no stone now existing to indicate that Nancy is buried in Maple Ridge, and it is thought that she was buried in Guernsey co OH, before the family left for Peoria co IL.

It was heartbreaking to see all those tiny stones for children, and knowing that there were probably many more stones that no longer exist.

Maple Ridge cem, originally called LaMarsh cem, is in Hollis tp, Peoria co IL. Twelve miles southwest of Peoria on US Rt 24 we find the village of Mapleton, founded about 1868 by a William Maple who soon afterwards moved to MO and then on to Oklahoma Territory. The village and U.S. post office still exist, and by driving up the hill north thru Mapleton and turning west at the section line road, we soon arrive at LaMarsh Baptist Church, and just beyond is the rather large Maple Ridge cem, comprising 8 or 10 acres. Graves date from the earliest days of settlers there up to the present day. The cemetery is well taken care of now, but in times past the oldest area was allowed to deteriorate, and even to suffer vandalism. It is, after all, located some distance from any residence and screened along the east side by a growth of trees between the church and cemetery. These trees have evidentally grown after the early burials, as evidence can be found of graves among the trees, although none of the stones have readable inscriptions at this time. Children's markers were usually very small "foot stone" type, and many have probably disappeared completely.

When William Maple, formerly of Guernsey co OH (and father of the founder of Mapleton) died in Peoria co in 1843, his will included his daughter Anna, wife of John Jones, as well as Mary (Polly) Jones, wife of his son Isaac Maple. Surely these folks were also Addy/Jones descendants, especially so as Isaac and Polly were married in Guernsey co OH

We do not have a marriage date for Nancy Addy and Enoch Jones, but it is felt that they married before the family left Delaware for Virginia. 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CHAPTER 5

HUGH CLARK ADDY, SR.

DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM ADDY AND ELEANOR CLARK

4. Hugh Clark Addy, although leaving no descendant bearing his name, it has been perpetuated throughout the generations as Hugh, Clark, and Hugh Clark. We really know very little about Hugh Clark Addy. We do know that he lived with his parents in Jefferson co VA and emigrated with them to Ohio in 1808. We know that he purchased 135 acres of land in Linton tp, Coshocton co when the Zanesville Land Office opened Military Lands to the general public in 1812. We have found no marriage record for him.

We know that Hugh Clark Addy died in Linton tp, Coshocton co OH in 1828...sometime between writing his will on O8 Apr and the day it was entered for probate on 28 July. Hugh signed his will with an "X", as did many of that time. This could mean either that he was too weak to sign, or that he was unable to write his name.

His will requested that he be buried in the same cemetery as his Father and Mother; unfortunately, we do not know which cemetery that was, but feel it was in Linton tp. We have walked a very large cemetery near Plainfield, and a very small cemetery a few miles away, and found no evidence of Hugh Addy or his parents. There were many small cemeteries in the early days, some of which no longer exist, and even their locations are unknown. Most stones of that age no longer are standing, and those that are, are too weathered to bear any readable inscription. This does, however, give credence to our belief that William and Eleanor died in Coshocton co, probably as early as 1820.

Hugh named as his heirs **Selame Baker**, daughter of Resen Baker and Hugh's sister Mary, and **Sally Addy** (Sarah), daughter of his brother William Addy; plus Hugh's illegitimate child **John Addy** living in Washington co, MD, with his mother Cleo Ingrum. Washington co is just across the Potomac river from Berkeley and Jefferson counties, WVA. Hugh left all his 135 acres of land to his son. We have no indication of John's age; he was referred to as "child" in the will.

As we do not know Hugh's age at death, we cannot determine his birthdate. The will was witnessed by <u>Resen Baker</u>, who also signed with an "X", and Eli Sparks. Hugh owned enough personal property in the form of livestock and equipment to pay off all debts, so the land was free of any encumbrance. We do not know if this child, John Addy, ever removed to Coshocton co to live. We find the name "John Addy" several times where we have been unable to determine where he fits into the family.

CHAPTER 6

5.

WILLIAM ADDY 2nd AND WEALTHA ANN JONES

Although family legend states that William Addy and Wealtha Ann Jones were married in Loudoun co VA in 1805, we have been unable to find any record of their marriage in either Loudoun, Berkeley or Jefferson counties. Virginia did not keep a marriage record. It was the "business of the church". Many parish records no longer exist and many of the early marriage bonds have also been lost. A search of Loudoun County, <u>Virginia Marriage Bonds 1762-1850</u> failed to reveal a marriage for this couple. It was noted that Loudoun County was divided into two parishes, and that the records for Cameron Parish are non-existent. It is certainly possible that their marriage did take place as stated, we just have no "papers" to prove it.


Wealtha Ann was not a sister of Malachai and Enoch Jones. Her parents were William Jones and wife Sarah, as shown by Administration of his estate 07 Oct 1809 thru 02 Oct 1810, Jefferson county, VA. Other heirs given were Mary Ann Jones wife of William Hunt; George Jones and wife Eve; Jonathon Jones and wife Barbara; Elizabeth Jones, John Jones, William Jones, James Jones, Jeremiah Jones and wife Mary; and Ann Jones. This is found in Jefferson co WVA Deed Book 5, pg 32. Sarah died before 04 March 1823, as shown in Deed Book 12, pg 500, where Jeremiah is selling land which included dower rights for the widow Sarah.

It is not known definitely when William Addy 2nd moved his family to Ohio. Some stories indicate that he journeyed with the family in 1808, stayed one year to get them settled, returned to Virginia for about seven years, then moved his family to Ohio. He would have either walked or ridden a pack horse for these trips. James mentions William in his account as being in the emigrating group in 1808 and again as being there in 1812. The Jefferson county, VA census of 1810 shows William Addy, a resident with the following family: 1 male under 10, 1 male 26/45, 1 female under 10 and 1 female 16/26.

Tax records of Coshocton co OH indicate that William Addy, a native of Delaware, was on the residential tax list of 1819, living on the land purchased in 1812 from the Federal Land Office. Wives were not indicated when a purchase was made, so we have no way of knowing which William Addy made the original But, as James mentions his brother William's presence purchase. in 1812, it is felt he was there to buy land when the Land Office opened unclaimed Military Lands for general sale. William and Wealtha Ann had sold her portion of her Mother's dower rights in Jefferson co VA to her brother John Jones on 02 Oct 1810; with William Addy signing his name and Wealtha Ann marking an Perhaps this is the money William used to make the "X". Coshocton co land purchase. Arriving in Coshocton co no later than 1819, their stay was short, as they again sold their land

to his brother **Thomas Addy** and wife **Mary Shafer**. Actually, although deeds were drawn up and a sum of \$800 mentioned, it seemed to be a trade of William's Coshocton co land for Thomas' Guernsey co land. Probably no money changed hands.

William and family appear in the 1820 Coshocton co census, a copy given below. According to our best information, those indicated are John b 1814, William 3rd b 1807, William 2nd b 1780; Ruhama b 1812, Sarah b 1816, Mary Ann b 1818, Eleanor b 1820, Eliza b 1809, and Wealtha Ann b 1787. As this census was not filed until 22 March 1821, births in late months of 1820 could have been included. The November 1820 birth for Eleanor would agree with her grave inscription. 1820 U.S. Census Linton tp, Coshocton co OH



Other family members shown in Coshocton co include Robert Addy in Oxford tp, <u>Reason Baker</u> and Malakiah Jones in Linton, and David Maple in either Linton or Perry, as both names appear at the top of the page. We did not find William 1st nor Eleanor shown living alone or with any of their children. William Addy

purchased land 20 April 1812, Zanesville Land Office.

The Knox twp, Guernsey co OH census records for 1820 are very difficult to read as the microfilm is dark, the writing faint, and there are marks or scratches on the film. We found two ADY entries there, THO ADY and JOHN ADY, both younger sons of William Addy 1st.

William's and Wealthy's move to Knox tp, Guernsey co OH after Ol Dec 1826 was this family's last move, the remainder of their married lives being spent near Hopewell, now called Indian Camp. Although the cemetery adjacent to the village has always been called Hopewell, the author's Father very frequently referred to the village as "Indian Camp", as it evidentally had been called in earlier days. Now a state highway sign announces INDIAN CAMP, although the houses, grocery store and gas station of the 1920's are no longer there, and the one remaining building, the former Methodist church, was struck by lightning and burned in 1995.

William and Wealtha Ann are both buried in Hopewell cem. Their daughter Sarah, wife of Elijah Starts, died in 1846 and was the first of the family to be buried there. Her parents' graves are beside Sarah's

Some accounts state that William's and Wealtha's stones have been set in concrete, but this is not the case. Over the years they had broken from their bases and sunken into the ground, being partially covered with soil. In 1991 they were cleaned of this and are now resting on the ground, as is Sarah's stone. The original bases have disappeared.

We believe that an incorrect reading of William 2nd's stone would seem to be the basis for the 1750-1827 dates given for his father. Grave stones of that era seldom carried a birth date or year, but rather the death date and then the age in years, months and days, or "in the 61 yr of her age", as Wealtha's stated. By reading William's stone as 1827 rather than 1857 and subtracting the aq 77, it resulted in the erroneous In the cemetery listing just quoted, Welthy Ann date of 1750. is shown merely as 61 years, whereas her stone actually reads "in the 61 yr of her age". She had not yet reached her birthday at the time of her death on 16 Feb 1848. We have been told that the reading of stones in the listing just referred to was actually done by youngsters for a "community service" project. Their work is appreciated, but it has also been the cause of several misconceptions and errors. Old stones are not easy to read and great care should be taken to get the most accurate information possible.

William Addy, as was the custom of the day, had his will drawn up only hours before his death. The will is dated 20 November 1857, and death followed on the 21st.

These are the main points of the will...after the usual payment for funeral expenses and just debts, a bequest of \$500.00 to grandson James Addy, son of Rezin, to be held in trust until James became 21 yrs of age. The balance of the estate to be divided equally between William, John, Hugh, Marion, Harrison, Eliza, Mary Ann and Rezin, each to have an equal share, except that FIRST Rezin was to have \$500.00 in addition to his share. Eleanor Starts to have only \$5.00, Hester Starts, daughter of deceased child Sarah \$5.00, and Ruhama Maple's heirs \$5.00. Rezin was appointed executor, and if any heir registered a complaint, then that heir was to receive nothing. There was also the condition that, should Eliza become mentally unable to handle her affairs, someone "other than her current husband" should be appointed her guardian.


Now, there is a will to promote many happy family gatherings for years to come.


Some descendants have told of a family legend that "William Addy was the wealthiest man in Guernsey county, and his young son ran off with the fortune." Our Mother had never heard of this "legend" until we began family research, and unearthed it somewhere.

According to provisions of the will, Rezin came by his "fortune" legally, even though it must have been a difficult pill to swallow...especially for Eleanor.

Money has always been a problem in this country, and it was especially difficult for the colonists and the early citizens of the United States of America. England forbid the colonies to mint coins (although some did), but there was neither gold nor silver locally and importing it was too costly. Strangely, most of the coins used in the colonies were Spanish, received by traders dealing with the Spanish West Indies. French and Dutch coins were also common. The coinage Act of 1792 established our first national mint and set up our decimal system based on the dollar. This was borrowed from the Spanish dollar, a coin which could be broken into eight pieces to make change. Two pieces would equal one-fourth of the dollar, or twenty-five cents, which is where the barbershop slogan "shave and a haircut, two bits" originated. "Not worth a picayune", an expression of our father, referred to a French coin equal to only six and onequarter cents...or practically nothing. Even as late as 1853 some states were issuing their own money, and it was "money of Pennsylvania" that Wealtha Ann and William 2nd received when selling her inherited land in Virginia in 1810.

We picture here the stones found in Hopewell cemetery October, 1991. There is one other stone that we did not photograph, ADDY for John B. Addy and son Albert. It reads John Albert 1814-1892 1848-1855 Welthy Ann wife of William Addy died Feb 16 1848 in the 61 yr of her age William Addy died Nov 21 1857 aged 77 yr 11 mo 18 da Sarah wife of Elijah Starts died Sep 13 1846 ag 30 yr 4 mo 0 da This cemetery is located on ST RT 658, "Hopewell Road", about one-half mi north of Indian Camp. It is on the east side of the road, which is going sharply downhill. Look quickly, you'll miss it otherwise.







FROLICS AND SUCH

Once again we owe a debt of gratitude to the Miskimen family for carefully preserving the journals of their ancestors, and for giving us the rare opportunity to see pioneer life through the eyes of those who lived it. A Journal covering the years 1833-1847 was kept by Isaac Miskimen of Wheeling township, Guernsey county. Born in 1805, he was perhaps a brother or cousin of James Miskimen, mentioned earlier. Isaac farmed 80 acres near Birds Run, and during those fourteen years he wrote a sentence or two daily in his Journal.

William Addy Sr. (actually the 2nd) is mentioned at least six times, and William Jr (3rd) is mentioned at least twice. Sometimes it was "doing business" and sometimes for a "Frolic". During those years Isaac and his wife Eleanor (they evidentally had no children) attended seventy-four Frolics. They could be working Frolics such as "grubbing" (removing tree stumps), or flax scutching, log sawing, corn husking, or applebutter boiling. Isaac sometimes took his fiddle, so we can be sure there were singing and dancing Frolics. On March 5, 1840, William Addy gave a Frolic that included "29 girls and 15 boys", although neither of the Addys nor Miskimen could be called a "boy"! Also mentioned is Abraham Maple and wife Ruhama Addy, daughter of William and Wealtha Ann. The Maples spent the night with Isaac and Eleanor; later they moved West to Peoria co Illinois, where Ruhama died tragically in a house fire, it is said.

In spite of the hard work and difficult travel, our pioneer ancestors had an active social life that included overnight visits with friends, camp meetings and preachings, in addition to the work and play Frolics.

We were particularly interested to see how holidays might be observed. Only once is the Fourth of July mentioned. In 1838 the Miskimens "celebrated at Liberty", a village in the area. There were Frolics attended on 8 July 1836 and again on 7 July 1842, but no mention of celebrating. Christmas was not mentioned at all, although a Frolic was attended in the week or two before Christmas in three different years.

We know that work was arduous and long for our ancestors, but we must not allow ourselves to think of them as "nose to the grindstone" twenty-four hours a day. By neighbors helping neighbors, difficult work was accomplished and friendships cemented. Men would discuss the weather, crops and taxes; while women spoke of their children, the school and their current quilting plans. We have not changed so very much, after all these years.

Many of our Addy ancestors were associated with Guernsey county, Ohio. A few years ago Cambridge, the county seat, was noted for having the largest Interstate cloverleaf in the nation at that time. This is not the first time that Guernsey county has figured importantly in our Nation's transportation efforts. In the early 1800's settlers were moving west of the Ohio River at a rapid pace. They soon began demanding a better road from East to West. The year 1811 marked the beginning of work on a road that would eventually reach from Cumberland, MD to Vandalia, IL, costing the federal government over \$7,000,000; a truly astronomical sum.

First called the Great National Pike, and later the National Road, it was referred to simply as "The Pike" in the 1920's and 1930's. Surveying began in 1806 and, to a great extent, followed Zane's Trace, cut through the forests in 1798. The roadbed was paved with up to eighteen inches of crushed stone...crushed by men, not machines. Every mile was marked with a stone indicating distance from Cumberland. Many years later The Pike was bricked, and was eventually blacktopped over the brick. By this time it was part of U.S. 40, stretching from coast to coast.

Although Interstate 70 now passes through Guernsey county, the old National Road was actually our first Interstate. An interesting and unusual feature of the National Road in Guernsey county was the "S" bridges, an architectural feature seldom seen elsewhere, but common in the Cambridge area at that time.

Where the road crossed a creek at an angle a stone arch bridge was built at right angles to the stream flow. "S" shaped walls were then built to guide the traffic around the jog from the direction of travel across the bridge and back onto the road line. An arch parallel with the stream flow and in line with the road would have been more difficult and costly to build.

Besides the stone bridges their are two historic covered bridges in the county.

In 1828 the National Road was constructed through Guernsey County. A legacy left by the construction is a series of stone bridges.

Starting at the east end of the county heading west along the National Road, the first bridge one would have come to was located at Bridgewater. It was an "S" bridge. The bridge was situated near the old toll house. This bridge and the toll house no longer stand. They were removed when Interstate 70 was constructed in the 1960s.

About two miles west of Middlebourne is another "S" bridge. This bridge is in good condition and one is still able to drive over it. This bridge is 185 feet long and has a single segmental arch spanning 40 feet. This bridge crosses Salt Fork Creek.

A short distance cast, a stone bridge is found. This bridge is 12 feet long and crosses a tributary of Salt Fork Creek. This bridge is still in use.

use. West of Four Mile Hill, near Southeastern Equipment, another stone bridge is located. This bridge sits near the old barn across from Southeastern Equipment. This bridge no longer has its parapets and has deteriorated somewhat, but is still in use.

The next bridge is located at the west end of the Dewey Avenue Hill. It is a partial "S" bridge. This bridge has a single segmental arch of 45-foot span and a total length of 180 feet. The east end of the bridge is in need of repair. The bridge is still in use. In the late 1930s this section of the National Road was bypassed when the roadway was changed to go over Tunnel Hill.

The last bridge on the old National Road is near Pike School. It is an "S" bridge 120 feet long with an arch span of 30 feet. This bridge is no longer traveled upon.

The history of Hollis township, Peoria county IL is largely the history of transplanted Guernsey and Coshocton county OH sons and daughters...most of them related to the Addy family. An area about twelve miles southwest of Peoria, it appealed to these emigrants, and is named for Densel Hollis, a large land owner there. We also find the names of Addy, Deselm, Jones, Maple, Marlatt and Starts from the early days of the settlement. The LaMarsh Baptist Church, organized 27 Oct 1838, had fourteen original members, all of them from Guernsey co OH. They first met in homes and later in a barn. On 28 August 1849, Abraham and Ruhama Maple donated a parcel of land containing two and one-half acres for the purpose of a house of worship. Work was begun immediately on a hewn log building

of ash, 30 by 45 feet in size. Pews were also handhewn of solid walnut. The cost of all this was \$1,000. What a truly lovely house of worship it must have been. A <u>History of</u> <u>Peoria County</u> published in 1873 names original member Abraham Maple as Trustee, and also Elijah Starts as Deacon.

The name "LaMarsh" was first used for the creek that runs between the LaMarsh Baptist Church lot and the cemetery, also called LaMarsh at that time. The creek then meanders down into the uncultivated, marshy bottom lands of the Illinois River. In the 1800's very valuable coal mines were located all along the bluff around Mapleton, but land above the bluff was heavily forested. When cleared, this land proved to be excellent for farming, the occupation of our Ohio emigrants.

A tall, four-sided obelisk style grave stone was erected by Abraham Maple with Ruhama's name on one side. At his death in 1889, his name was added on the second side; and in 1915 Mary, wife of A. Maple, was inscribed on the third side. Above Abraham's name is the Masonic symbol

Ruhama, wife of A. Maple died March 12 1854 aged 42 yr 3 mo 20 da



These pictures, taken at Naper Settlement, Naperville, IL are of a reconstructed pioneer village of the early days. Log cabins were constructed first, many replaced fifteen years or so later by frame houses. The vehicle of choice for the long haul was the prairie schooner.

"The covered wagon rolled right along, Oh, the covered wagon rolled right along. Pappy's pants wore out of leather, Mamma prayed for fairer weather, And the covered wagon Rolled right Along!"

The following account was written by Caroline Ball Pyle, wife of Isaac Pyle, who was a brother of James Craven Pyle. "Uncle Craven and Aunt Ellen" (Eleanor Marlatt, daughter of Jacob Marlatt and Eliza Addy) removed from Mt. Pleasant,OH in 1856 on their way to Mercer co ILL. There are currently two communities named Mt. Pleasant in Ohio, one in northeast Belmont co. and one in east central Hocking county, and it is thought that the Marlatts were living in the latter. This was copied from a Marlatt history in the Cambridge, OH District Library.

We started from our home near Mt. Pleasant OH in two covered wagons. The first place of interest where we stopped was at Richmond, Ind. We arrived here one Friday afternoon and remained in the ditty overnight. The next afternoon, we drove out a few miles into the country to John Piles (father's cousin). We visited here with other cousins until Tuesday. As they were well fixed, we had a very enjoyable time.

We soon found ourselves again journeying westward. I remember well one night we camped in a woods near Muncie, Ind. It turned very cold in the night and the next morning the ground was covered with snow.

It was Sept. 18, 1856 when we started for Illinois. Our little company consisted of your grandmother and grandfather Pyle, Uncle Craven and Aunt Ellen, Melissa, Sarah, Manda, and your father and I.

We often fell in with other movers who camped with us and made the evenings spent round our campfire merry by exchanging jokes with us. It was better too, for a large company to be together, as the country was unknown to us and often a close watch had to be kept for fear of horse thieves.

When we reached the Wabash River, there was no bridge, so we had to ford it.

One of the horses we drove was a small beast and often got spells of balking. We had just neared the middle of the river when one of these spells came over her. Uncle Craven slowly crept off the seat and walked down the wagon tongue and spit tobacco juice in the young lady's eyes. This immediately changed her mind for the better and soon the other side of the river was reached and we found ourselves on the bank with the river safely forded.

The scenery along the river was beautiful. High cliffs on either side covered with dense woods. Darkness fell upon us soon after we had crossed the Wabash, brought on earlier this night than usual, perhaps, a little by the denseness of the woods, but caused more by a dark cloud which lay in the west and which began to tell by its flashes of lightning and distant roaring of thunder, of a terrible storm. We hastily sought a place where we thought nature might help us for the night and from the on-coming storm, if it

proved to be mostly rain; yet which we feared on account of wind and lightning. We had just time to fix our coverings as securely as possible when the storm broke upon us. It was a severe storm, but it passed over us without harming us.

With but one exception, we never traveled on Sundays. This exception I speak of was one Sabbath when we had camped in a place where water was scarce for ourselves and our horses. So in the evening we drove to a farm house where we might secure water. These people were very kind to us and let us drive in around the straw stacks. They asked us in to supper and made us very comfortable. They had a very nice house and it was all lit up with lamps, the first we had ever seen, so we thought they must be very rich. An old woman sat at the table eating. She had "dyspepsia" and ate very slowly. After eating a few bites, she would spit it out into a cuspidor which she kept near.

Just a little way this side of Peoria, ILL one of our horses got very sick; as bleeding was a common remedy for all horse ailments, they decided to bleed the horse. The bleeding proved to be worse than the disease as it was almost impossible to get the flow of bleeding checked.

The last night of the journey was spent near Toulon, ILL. A Mrs. Tapp gave us permission to use her stove on which to cook our supper. We reached our destination Nov. 14, 1856.

While we did not meet with half the hardships of some movers of those times, we were glad enough when our journey was over. We lived with Milton Ball, my brother, near Aledo before we moved on our home place.

Craven and Eleanor Marlatt Pyle had three small children when this trip was made: Melissa, born 1850, Sarah born 1852 and Amanda born January 1855. After staying in Mercer county for a few years, they were later in Henry co. IL.

Please note that in 1856 this family was unfamiliar with a coal oil lamp. It is believed that the cook stove was also new to them. In fact, the cook stove came into being in the mid-1800's, and very few were in use in 1856.

Although the glass chimney lamp had been invented in the late 1700's, its use was not widespread. On the East Coast whale oil was the fuel used for such lamps, and by the mid 1800's kerosene and coal oil were coming into usage. The author, growing up in Guernsey and Columbiana counties, Ohio, studied by coal oil lamps. Only in the late 1930's did we have a gasoline mantle lamp, using white gasoline and pumping air into it

before lighting the very delicate mantles. It produced a bright, white light.

John B. Addy and Mary Lydia Griffen were m 16 March 1836 in Guernsey co OH, and their daughter Eliza is shown as being born 26 Feb 1848. The 1850 census taken 02 Oct 1850 shows Eliza as 3 yrs and Albert as 6/12. A stone in Hopewell cem, Knox tp for John and his son Albert gives dates of 1848-1855. The 1848 date for Eliza has been used by her descendants, and that is what we will show here.

Sarah Addy and Elijah Starts had a very short life together, as once again childbirth took its toll. Sarah died 13 Sep 1846, aged 30 yr 4 mo 0 da, with bu in Hopewell cem, Knox tp Guernsey co OH. Her baby survived and lived with her grandparents, William And Wealtha, until her father remar.

Mary Ann Addy and James Deselm (Dissallums/DeSelms) remained in Guernsey co OH approximately seven years, then started out for Peoria co IL with a team of horses hitched to a wagon and four small children riding or toddling along. Today, many shudder at the thought of all day in the minivan with two children. Back then, anyone able to walk was expected Taverns, the equivalent of our Bed and Breakfast to do so. motels, would put up the livestock and feed them, as well as the family... at a price, of course. Most people could not afford this luxury for an extended trip, and slept in the wagon or on the ground in bed rolls, doing their cooking in a dutch oven over a wood fire. Camp was made where grazing and water. would be available. Often livestock consisted of the twohorse team pulling a wagon filled with all their worldly possessions...the necessary dutch oven and spider frypan, a few tin or pewter plates and eating utensils, perhaps a chair or table, along with the feather or straw ticks which were made into bed rolls. A cow might be tied behind the Meals often consisted of fat bacon and corn bread fried wagon. in the spider for breakfast, with leftovers eaten cold without stopping at noon. A short stop would be made only when water was available for the horses, or in especially rough or up-hill terrain; otherwise it was travel from daylight to dusk. Then Father prepared the fire and made camp for the night while Mother finished cooking the beans that had been brought to a boil in the dutch oven over the breakfast fire and then hung on the sunny side of the wagon with hot coals packed in the upper "oven" section to continue the cooking. And of course more cornbread. After supper, Mother put more beans on to soak for tomorrow, work was finally completed for the day, and tired and weary bodies were soon asleep.

Eleanor Addy and Elijah Starts


In 1851 Eleanor, who had probably been caring for her dead sister's child since its birth, married the father, and the family set out for Peoria co IL. Eleanor was past thirty years of age when married...definitely an "old maid." Perhaps some of the delay in her marriage could be due to her father's seemingly dislike of Elijah Starts. When William died just a few years later, Eleanor received a token inheritance of only \$5.00, while his estate was to be divided evenly among his other surviving children...after first alloting an **extra \$500.00** for a special grandson. Eleanor was definitely not a favored daughter.

Eleanor and Elijah settled in Hollis tp, Peoria co IL and had the following children: Descendants of Eleanor Addy (Wm2, Wm1) and Elijah Starts FOURTH GENERATION 571 Sarah Starts b 1852 Hollis tp, Peoria co IL 572 Mary Starts b 1854 Hollis tp, Peoria co IL 573 Violet Starts b 1862 Hollis tp, Peoria co IL

Elijah's first child, Hester Ann, was also a part of this family. Eleanor, called Ellen, died in 1863. She is bu Maple Ridge cem, her stone reading

Elijah Starts died May 12 1892, ag 73 yr, 4 mo, 26 da and is bu in Maple Ridge cem with his third wife and some children. Eleanor and Elijah were well respected members of the Hollis tp community, Elijah serving as Deacon of the La-Marsh Baptist church





Hugh Addy, son of William 2nd and Wealtha Ann Jones Addy, was born in Linton tp, Coshocton co, OH on 13 Sep 1821, and d 12 Aug 1903 in Knox tp, Guernsey co OH. Some cemetery listings show his birth as 1830 and death as 1908, but this is incorrect. A copy of death certificate is included, showing the 1903 date. In December 1826 the family of William and Wealtha moved to Knox tp, Guernsey co, and Hugh grew up near the villages of Indian Camp and Boden, and later lived near Kimbolton in Liberty tp. He farmed, was blacksmith, operated a sorghum press, and served for fifteen years as the Justice of the Peace for Knox tp. It has appeared in print that he donated the original land for Mt. Hermon United Presbyterian church near Indian Camp. The deed which follows shows that he sold one-half acre of land to the church trustees on 18 Aug 1856 for the sum of \$5.00, perhaps the equivalent of giving it away. It is in that cemetery that he and Margaret are buried, along with several other Addy descendants.

Kimbolton is said to be named for an English town of the same name. It is interesting to find a KIMBALLTON in Iowa, near where many Addy families settled.

We have seen Hugh's name listed by others as <u>Hugh Clark Addy</u>, but in all the legal papers and court records that we researched, he is <u>Hugh Addy</u>, no middle name indicated.

The Mt. Hermon United Presbyterian cemetery, Knox tp, Guernsey co OH, along with the church, is located about three miles from Indian Camp (Hopewell) on SR 658. It has been stated that Hugh Addy, although not a member of this church, was granted permission for burial for himself and his wife. Many of the following generation of Addys were members of Mt. Hermon, and are also buried in this cemetery.



Hugh and Margaret Warden were married 03 Jul 1851 in Guernsey co. Margaret was born in Liberty tp on 02 Sep 1832, the daughter of Isaac Warden, Jr. and Jane Murray. Her parents were early pioneers in Guernsey co, being married there in 1816. They

are in the 1850 census with a 17-year old daughter, Margaret.

Isaac Warden, Sr was born in Ireland (Ulster) about 1760/70, according to ages given in the 1820, 1830 and 1840 census; he was in Guernsey co at an early date. He died before 18 July,1842 when his will was probated. No wife was named in the will, she having already deceased. Adm Docket B:151, Guernsey co, OH. We do not know the name of his wife, census records showing her age as b 1760/70. She had died before the 1840 census. Isaac Sr. became a naturalized citizen in Guernsey co April 1822 (Common Pleas Court Records, 1822-1824, Minute Book C, pg 21) which also states that he was in the United States prior to 29 Jan 1795.

Isaac Warden, Jr is shown in census records as having been born in Pennsylvania or Maryland in 1797, according to the age given in 1850/60 census. Pennsylvania orginally claimed the area that later became Maryland. Isaac died between writing his will dated 16 Feb 1877, and Probate on 17 Sep 1877; his will names Margaret Addy, along with other children. Isaac's wife having died in 1854, he was living with a son Robert and wife in the 1860 census; however this son died in 1865 and his wife remarried in 1868. It is felt that Isaac then lived with his son James M. Warden, who was appointed Executor of his will.

Jane Murray Warden died 15 July 1854 and is buried in Lebanon cem, Adams tp, Guernsey co; her husband is buried beside her. From information given in a cemetery listing, Jane has been mistakenly placed as a spinster daughter of Isaac, Sr. With the reading of her stone itself, she is now correctly shown as the wife of Isaac Warden, Jr. Her stone has broken off its base and is lying on the ground, face down. It is covered with a black growth which may be a mold of some kind, and could not be removed by scrubbing with a stiff brush. It is easily read, but does not photograph well. Isaac's stone is almost non-existant. One small piece was buried under the soil, his name still very legible (June 1994). However, as soon as exposed to the air, it began to crumble into sand. A footstone of a very different stone type, inscribed I W was also buried there. These were replaced in the same position in the hope of preventing further deterioration.

So far, we have been unable to locate Jane Murray Warden's parents. Surrounding counties have been checked for Murray/Murrey/Murry present there by 1816, but have not found one that can be proven to be her parent.

It is sad to see errors appear in published cemetery lists. A good stiff brush, shaving cream, rubber squeege and a lot of patience can bring out most names and dates. Be sure to wipe the stone clean after reading it. If you prefer, rubbing the stone with sidewalk chalk can also bring out names and dates.

Jane, wife of Isaac Warden, died July 15 1854 in the 55 year of her age.

In this case, it was insufficient printed information, readily available on the stone, that led to years of confusion. The listing gives merely "Jane Warden 1799-1854"

Margaret Warden Addy was noted for her ability to put a quick meal on the table. It is said she could spot a visitor turning into their lane, grab a fat hen from the chicken yard, wring its neck, dress it, and have it in the pot by the time the buggy reached the house. How long was that lane? Hugh was evidentally considered well-to-do, as he had a good-sized farm, plus the business of blacksmith and sorghum press, but he was also considered rather close with his money. Some of his grandchildren, whose fathers worked for Hugh, stated they were not overly well fed as children and that they walked to school barefoot even with heavy frost on the ground. They never had "store bought sugar", using only their own sorghum for sweetening. The really bad part was that the sorghum they used was the bitter bottom-of-the-barrel product, which did not sell. In later years, these grandchildren avoided anything even faintly resembling sorghum.

Evidentally Hugh could not decide how, or to whom, to leave his worldly possessions. It would seem that he had accumulated

sufficient for a comfortable living, but continued to be very frugal. His will contains several codicils, changing different bequests at different times. Guernsey co has microfilmed wills and reduced the size of the writing until it is very difficult to read. We are showing here only the list of heirs as entered for probate, which is quite legible. Hugh had outlived many of his heirs.

We do not know what type of housing Hugh and Margaret lived in. Our Mother would have remembered, but no one thought to ask. She did mention sleeping in the loft, where snow would filter through the cracks and cover the bed during a winter storm.

A DAY IN THE LIVES OF


Once again we take a look into the everyday lives of our foreparents. We can be sure that Eleanor Clark Addy cooked in a kettle or a spider frying pan in the fireplace in winter. An outdoor fireplace was customary for warm weather use. Heating stoves were invented before the cooking stove. Benjamin Franklin's stove of 1744 was a cast iron "box" type stove, built into the wall similar to a fireplace, but extending out into the room with three sides giving off heat.

The first round "potbelly" heating stove was made about 1800 and an improved type called "baseburner" was patented in 1833, a coal burning stove. Cast iron cooking ranges were developed in the mid-1800's. These could burn coal, coke or wood, with a cooking surface, baking oven, and a little later, even a reservoir for warming water.

Iron and implements of iron were rare on the frontier. Local forges could produce small items such as hoes, sickles and scythes. Even though heating stoves were available on the East Coast, few, if any, were transported across the mountains. By the late 1800's Newark, Ohio in Licking county was manufacturing both types of stoves, but not until the railroads reached a community was either type of stove common in the average home.


Hill's HISTORY OF COSHOCTON COUNTY, 1882, gives various railroads chartered to run through areas of Coshocton county, most of them suffering financial problems at the time of his publication. After one and a half pages of very small print outlining the various railroad ventures, this statement appears on page 289... "None of the above mentioned roads have been finished." Both Coshocton and Guernsey counties had large coal fields, and railroads were needed to market this resource.

It is quite safe to assume that Wealtha Ann cooked over the fireplace. Probably Margaret Warden Addy did also, at least for the first half of her married life. Hugh was not noted for spending money frivolously.

A DAY IN THE LIVES OF

HUGH ADDY AND MARGARET WARDEN

We have been fortunate in finding some very old receipts... as recipes were called. These date back to the days of Hugh and Margaret, and perhaps even earlier. Receipts were seldom written down in early days, but word-of-mouth would pass them on for several generations.

Green beans were dried whole, buckwheat was a common crop, and persimmons grew in the woods of Coshocton and Guernsey counties, although not in any great abundance at that latitude. Caustic soda (lye) was made from wood ashes. Wood ashes were also used to polish pewter spoons and forks which were in daily use by the Hugh Addy family, a granddaughter doing the cleaning chore weekly.

SOME OLD TIMEY RECEIPTS

BUCKWHEAT CAKES

Take a half teacup of sourdough starter and a dab of sorghum and add a quart of warm water and about 3 teacups of buckwheat flour. Let set overnight. Now add 2 or 3 spoons of sorghum or honey and bake on a hot griddle greased with bacon.

SMEARCASE (Cottage cheese)

Take 1 gallon of buttermilk and pour into boiling water till the milk begins to curdle. Let stand about half an hour or so and strain through cheesecloth. When it stops draining and cools down, mix with cream and a pinch of salt.

PERSIMMON PUDDING

Use a gallon crock and put in a quart of persimmon pulp, a quart of sweet milk and 1 teacup of molasses. Stir this up and put in 2 scant cups of flour, a teaspoon of soda, and cinnamon and salt as you like. Bake this in the crock for about three hours when the fire is low, and stir several times while it cooks.

LEATHERBRITCHES BEANS

Take off the ends and strings of firm green beans. Use your big darning needle and a long heavy thread and run it through the middle of each pod. Push them down on the string until about a finger space between the beans. Hang up your strings in a warm, airy place to dry. When time to cook, soak overnight, drain, add more water and parboil slowly for half hour. Drain again, then cook slowly with ham hock or sowbelly.

(NOTE:) These receipts have not been kitchen tested by the author, although home-made cottage cheese



They continued to live on and work the Hugh Addy farm until 1883, when several Duff and Addy families were moving to Iowa, and the Harr Addy family joined them. In 1885 Harr was persuaded by his father Hugh to return to Ohio and again work the farm, only a couple years after leaving. They made these moves by train, according to their eldest daughter, Rilda. Ellie cared for her own babies and knit countless socks for the younger Addy brothers. In later years she refused to teach her daughters to knit, remembering the sore fingers from constant pricking with steel needles and irritated by homespun wool.



Hugh Addy spent several years in and around the village of Kimbolton, Liberty township, before returning to Knox tp. We have noted that James Miskimen mentioned in his Journal celebrating at LIBERTY. According to Conner and Goodpaster, this village was laid out in 1828 with the name of <u>Liberty</u>. Some time later, a man named Naptholi Luccock settled there and opened a store. He asked that the village name be changed to KIMBOLTON, as he was a native of Kimbolton, England. As Luccock was a prosperous country merchant and farmer, and was unquestionably the village leader, the name change was accepted. It is reported that he "amassed great wealth" through his various ventures.





But hard work and time were taking their toll; Har and Ellie began spending their winter months with their children. The winter of 1932-33 was spent with the Staffords in Columbiana co. where they had moved the previous spring. We lost Grandpa that May. Six years later, while living with Margaret Thompson just across the road from her own home, Grandma passed away peacefully as she was dressing herself one day. Robert Harrison Addy married Mary Eleanor Duff, the daughter of William Duff and Margaret Ann Lindsey, neighbors in Knox township, Guernsey co OH. They spent 1881-1883 in Madison co IA, but returned to Knox township, Guernsey co to live. Ellie made one trip to Iowa to see her father, her mother having died a few years earlier. She travelled by train and took the two youngest children with her. Her father made one trip back to Ohio not long before his death, giving Harr a Power of Attorney at that time.

Harr later was a tenant farmer in different areas, and after Hugh's death in 1903, moved his family into Cambridge, where he worked as a meat cutter in a butcher shop, losing a finger in the process. They lived in Cambridge for several years while Harr was employed; in 1925 they were at "Five Forks", outside of town, and by 1926 were living in a little house back in Hopewell (Indian Camp), where they remained until Harr's death in 1933. Their son-in-law "Jimmy" Randolph had purchased this home for them. Harr and Ellie were dearly loved by their children and grandchildren, and all the cousins have many fond memories of visits to Hopewell.

Harr and Ellie were married on July 3, and over the years the Fourth of July became a time for the wide-spread family to get together. We know these pictures were taken at those reunions because of the developer's imprinted dates on the backs of the pictures.

On July 4, 1928, a Golden Wedding Reunion was celebrated by over one hundred children, grandchildren and friends, at their home in Hopewell...as it was called. But everything old is new again, and once more the area is Indian Camp.



Frank and Rilda Mehaffey homesteaded in Oklahoma Indian Territory soon after their marriage, and were the only settlers in Osage county at that time. Rilda became seriously ill during pregnancy and was taken by wagon to the nearest train whistle stop, then to Kansas City on a pallet in a box car. Surgery was required, the baby lost, and Rilda was never able to have another child. She was always a strong advocate for her various nieces and nephews, active in the local PTA and many other events where children were concerned. After her recovery in Kansas City, she and Frank went to Northern California where lumbering was the main industry. Frank worked in the mill and Rilda ran the boarding house. For this, she contacted two sisters to help, and both Jeanette and Minnie answered her plea. The mill was located in the Eureka area, and a young man stayed at the boarding house who did not go into the woods nor did he work in the mill; he spent his evenings conversing with those who did work and his days writing. His name was Jack London.



Leah had worked as housekeeper and "hired girl" from the time she finished McGuffey's Sixth Reader (the end of schooling offered in the country schools). Before the Addy family moved into Cambridge, she began working for the Rev. Dr. T. D. Edgar, pastor of the First United Presbyterian church in Cambridge. She moved with the family to Wilkensburg, PA, a suburb of Pittsburgh when Dr. Edgar took a pastorate there. After several years, as the Edgar children grew older, she returned to Cambridge and was working at a boarding house where Ed Stafford was living. He often said "She was the prettiest thing I had ever seen." Ed had graduated from high school, a rather uncommon thing in that day, and taught country school for a while. Encouraged to become a lawyer by his father, Ed read law with a practicing attorney in Coshocton county, and is shown as "student" on his military records of the Spanish American War. But law did not appeal to Ed and after returning from the Army he became a licensed stationary engineer and spent many years in this profession. Ed was foreman during the construction of the viaduct over Wills creek and the railroads in Cambridge when he was critically injured and was no longer able to work in industry. He then returned to farming, the occupation of his growing-up days.

Today — Jan. 20 — marks an anniversary that probably would have gone unnoticed by most area residents. It is the 68th anniversary of the formal opening of the Dewey Avenue viaduct over Wills Creek in Cambridge to traffic.

Wills Creek is the only stream of importance that was crossed by the main highway between Wheeling and Zanesville. Since the opening of a road between these two points, four seperate means were provided for crossing this old stream at Cambridge. The first was a ferry boat; than a crude log bridge; next the old two-lane wooden covered bridge that stood 4 for almost a 100 years; and the viaduct that is in use today.

In 1798, Zane Trace was blazed through the forest from Wheeling, W.Va., to Maysville, Ky. The crossing of Wills Creek was a problem that was solved by Ezra Graham. He built a cabin on the north bank and operated a ferry boat for the purpose of transporting passengers and wagons across the creek. The ferry provided transportation for the next seven years. . Zaccheus A., Beatty, son of John Beatty, a prominent citizen of Cambridge, saw the advantages of a blidge over a ferry and financed the contruction of one. It was built of logs and had a puncheon floor. A toll was charged for those who crossed over it. This was the first bridge legally authorized to be built in the Northwest Territory. The territorial legislature of 1801, two years before Ohio became a state, authorized the construction of a bridge over Wills Creek.

Next came the old covered bridge, When the National Road was built through Cambridge, a more substantial means of crossing the creek was needed. The covered bridge was built in 1828 and served the public until 1913, when it was condemned. Previous floods of years past had weakened the structure, but the flood of 1913 brought about its demise.

After its being tom away, it was serveral years before the viaduet was built. There were considerable discussions of who was responsible for a new creek crossing; the Federal govemment, the State of Ohio, Guernsey County, the City of Cambridge, or the railroad companics? An agreement was finally reached and the cost was to be met by the State of Ohio, Guernsey County and the Baltimore and Ohio and the Pennsylvania railroads. The contract was let on Feb. 1, 1924. The total cost was \$200,000.

The visduct is 590 feet in length with a driveway for vehicles, 24 feet wide. The approach at each end has a grade of nine percent. The span is 22 feet above the railroad tracks. "The visduct was formally opened to traffic on Tuesday, Jan. 20, 1925.



THE DOUBLE BARREL BRIDGE

The Cambridge Daily Jeffersonian carried several articles about the "new viaduct", and upon its completion there were pictures of the new bridge and the old bridge it had replaced.

Called "the historic old covered bridge", it had every reason to be famous from Baltimore to Indianapolis. Built in 1828 when roads were wide enough to accommodate one team and wagon, it was of "double barrel" construction, with two traffic lanes separated by a partition. It also boasted an enclosed pedestrian sidewalk. The new viaduct, built over a century later, afforded no such comfort for the pedestrian.



The historic old "covered bridge," famous from Baltimore to Indianapolis in stage coach days, is now replaced by a handsome viaduct, known as the longest span erected by the Ohio highway department on the National highway.

The old structure gave splendid service for almost a century and its successor will serve many generations.

Although many prominent people had requested to be the "first to drive across the new Cambridge viaduct", Ed Stafford was one of the first who was granted this "privilege" a full five weeks before the viaduct officially opened. Not mentioned by name in this newspaper article of Friday, December 12, 1924, Ed was critically injured and remained in Wells Hospital a week until his condition stabilized enough to transfer him to a Columbus hospital for many more weeks. Ruth Stafford Maple believes he was still hospitalized when the youngest child, Doris, was born on March 21, 1925. She also notes that her brother Don had become ill with scarlet fever about the same time as their father's injury. The family was quarantined for six weeks and Leah, six months pregnant and with a critically injured, hospitalized husband in another city, had total care of the family. Eleanor, a high school freshman, had been sent to live with grandparents so as not to miss a complete school grading period.

It is thought that he removed to IA or KS soon after that date. We know of only one descendant, his son James, mentioned in the will of William 2nd.






Madison county, Iowa, located southwest of Des Moines, is an area of gently rolling hills with the valleys between criss-crossed by many rivers and streams, including the North River, Middle River, South River, Grand River, and various Forks, Branches, and Creeks. To aid in early transportation, covered bridges were built across several of these waterways. At one time, as many as sixteen covered bridges were in daily usage. In October, 1970, long before THE BRIDGES OF MADISON COUNTY became a best seller, the area began holding a Covered Bridge Festival each fall, celebrating their remaining seven bridges which had been placed on the National Register of Historic Places. Then the unbelievable happened in 1985...one of these historic structures was burned to the ground the night before the Festival It did not, however stop the festivities; in fact, it opened. may have drawn even more people to see the six remaining bridges.

John Wayne was born in Winterset in a small, four-room house. On May 10, 1972, many years later, The Duke, through his agent, wrote the Madison County Clerk of Courts requesting a birth certificate. Then The Duke, himself, phoned asking that it show his birth to be several years later than the actual event, as he had told his "friend" that he was much younger. This, of course, could not be done and he received a birth certificate with his actual birth date as well as his birth name, Marion Michael Morrison.


John Wayne Birth place






Cutler-Donahoe, built 1871 now in Winterset City Park




Roseman, built 1883 across Middle River, 107 ft long




Cedar Bridge

DESCENDANTS OF JOHN ADDY AND NANCY MALONE

6. John Addy, Sr., b about 1787 in Mill Creek Hundred, Newcastle co DE, m Nancy Malone 08 Jun 1818 in Coshocton co OH. They are in the 1820 Knox tp, Guernsey co census with one son under 10, two daughters under 10 (possibly twins?), John is 26/45 and Nancy is 16/26. John is said to have removed to Arkansas soon after this, and to have died there "in the 1830's". At this time we have no further information on his family. Present day descendants of his brother Thomas were surprised to learn of the two brothers in Arkansas, as no family stories mentioning John could be remembered.

It is possible that Josiah Addy, shown in the John T. Addy family in the 1850 census is a young brother of John T, or a son of John Sr., living with an uncle after his father's death. There is also a James Addy who m Mary Flood on 21 Mar 1841 in Pulaski co AR.

The first known Europeans in the area we call Arkansas were the Spanish, there by 1541. Later it was claimed by France, and the United States purchased the Louisiana Territory from France in 1803, which included the now state of Arkansas. It remained largely unsettled because of trouble with/from Indians until Fort Smith was established by the government in 1817 as a military outpost. Soon afterwards, waves of settlers from Kentucky and Tennessee arrived, pushing the Indians onto reservations in Okla-By 1828 the government had signed treaties with most of homa. the tribes, who "agreed" to move into Indian Territory. This is the Arkansas that beckoned to John and Thomas Addy. Our word "Arkansas" comes from an Indian word similar to Arkansan, meaning "down-stream people".

Arkansas became the 25th state on 15 June 1836. Its people were nearly evenly divided between the Union and the Confederacy, and in March 1861, voted to remain in the Union. But when Union volunteers were called to fight seceeding troops, Arkansas reversed its vote and joined the Confederacy in June, 1861.

Any war is a terribly, terrifying experience. A civil war is doubly so, as it pits brother against brother. Called the "War of the Rebellion" in the North, and the "War between the States" in the South, this conflict saw Addy men wearing both uniforms.

In March, 1862, Union and Confederate forces fought a bloody battle at Pea Ridge in northwestern Arkansas. On Sep 10, 1863 Union men captured Little Rock. Arkansas drew up a new state constitution abolishing slavery in 1864, and was readmitted to the Union in 1868. Addy men serving in the Confederate Army included Pvt. Josiah Addy, Co F, 3 Ark Cav., who d 09 Apr 1862; Corp Samuel Addy of Co D, Cocke's Reg. Ark Inf. 1862-to 15 Mar 1865; and Pvt Jasper Addy of Co E & D, 19 (Dockery) Ark Inf and Co C, 2nd Mounted Rifles, Ark.

CHAPTER 8

DESCENDANTS OF MARY ADDY AND REZIN BAKER

Mary Addy and Rezin Baker were married 03 Aug 1813 in Coshocton co OH. County Death Record shows Mary Baker, b in DE, d Linton tp on 31 Dec 1876, age 87 yrs, 2 mos, 17 da. Rezin was born in Little York, PA about 1780 and had a wife and two children by 1802. He left them in Harrison co OH for safety while he went to Coshocton co in search of a homestead. When he returned to Harrison co some time later, he learned his family had all died. He then returned to Coshocton co as a permanent resident. Later he and Mary Addy married. This family appears in the Coshocton co census of 1820 with 2 males under 10, 1 male 26/45; 1 female under 10 and 1 female 26/45.

Rezin's will is dated 05 Dec 1841 and was entered for probate when the Spring Term opened 05 April 1842. Historically, wills were written only when death was imminent; we can safely assume that Rezin's death occurred very shortly after the will was written, and presented for probate at the next Court Term. Heirs named are his wife Mary, sons John Baker, Reason L. Baker, "my son William Addy', and "my son Zebeday". As Mary was the daughter of William Addy, we feel these last two sons were William Addy Baker and Zebeday Baker. Daughters named were Slomey and Elizabeth. Reference was made to Slomey's inheritance from her "Unkel Hugh Addy", and in that will her name is given as Selame. Neither William A. nor Zebeday had yet reached the age of 21 years by 05 Dec 1841.

The name "Rezin", taken from the Old Testament story found in 2 Kings 15:37 and various other places, has been seen as <u>Resen,</u> <u>Reson</u>, and <u>Reason</u>. We use whatever spelling is found in the document being quoted.

Using the limited information we have been able to find, we place descendants of Mary Addy and Rezin Baker as follows:

Mary and Rezin were bu Southport cem, Linton tp, Coshocton co OH. Confusing our research were at least two other men named Baker in the same area at the same time. John Baker and Zebedee Baker served in the War of 1812 along with Rezin. Perhaps his brothers?

DESCENDANTS OF MARY ADDY AND REZIN BAKER

Hill's <u>History</u> includes the following in his biographical sketches, presumably submitted by a family member:

BAKER R. LANE, Linton tp farmer; born Linton tp Nov 17, 1818; son of Rezin and Mary (Addy) Baker, daughter of William Addy, one of the earliest settlers of Linton tp. Mr. Baker was married in 1849 to Melinda Loos, daughter of John Loos. Five of his ten children survive, viz: Mary Ellen, Barbara Ada, William A., John H., and Jessie.

From the above, it would seem that the Rezin L. Baker b 1814 d 1900 is not the son of Rezin and Mary Addy Baker. However, the marriage of R. Lane Baker and Melinda Loos gives his name as ROBERT LANE BAKER. We have found marriage records to often be as inaccurate as birth or death records. Hand writing was often difficult to decipher, spelling sometimes very confusing to the modern reader, and the custom of using only initials for given names of both male and females adds to the difficulty.

As the will of Rezin Baker, husband of Mary Addy, gives the name of his son as Reason L. Baker, we feel that the 1814 date and information are correct; but are certainly open to other information that may be sent us.

DESCENDANTS OF THOMAS ADDY, SR

Thomas Addy, Sr, son of William and Eleanor Clark Addy, was born ca 1792, according to ages given in various census records. This puts has birth in Berkeley county, VA, which later was a part of Jefferson co, WVA. Thomas removed to Ohio with his parents in 1808 and married there to Nelly Marlatt in Coshocton co on 25 Mar 1816, and after her death, to Mary Shafer on 26 Jul 1824, also in Coshocton co. Even so, he is in the 1820 Guernsey co Knox tp census, then in Coshocton co in 1830 census, and in Pulaski co AR in 1840, and at that time with no wife. One record gives his death as 1842, another states it was 1844.

The 1820 census shows Thomas with 2 sons and one daughter under 10 yrs, he is 26/45 and Nelly is 16/26. In the 1830 census he has one son under 5 yrs, 2 ag 5/10, 1 ag 10/15, he is 30/40; one daughter under 5 yrs, one 10/15, and Mary is 20/30. Thomas' first wife was **Nelly** Marlatt, but the name has been copied on typed lists as **Kelly**, however the original record reads Nelly.

On O1 Dec 1826, Thomas and brother William exchanged lands, as mentioned under the chapter on William. Thomas returned to Coshocton co and William moved to Guernsey co, which joined each other. Thomas had purchased Knox tp land on 26 Jul 1825 from the U. S. Land Office in Zanesville, receiving Patent for land as the original purchaser. The usual procedure, upon moving onto Military Land, was to decide on a tract of land, put up a log cabin and move in. When the Land Office opened the unappropriated lands to the public, be sure to get there early and buy the land you had built upon. The Land Office in Zanesville had opened these unappropriated lands in 1812, and it may be assumed that Knox tp, being rather hilly and rocky, was not immediately sold out.

We do not know the reason for the ADDIE spelling in Mt. Harmony cemetery, nor can we place Barbara, Dorothy and Ruie in our family, although they very well could be children or spouses of descendants of Thomas. Duffie Addy is definitely the son of John W. and Sarah Garrett, although we have no record of the variant spelling being used by them. Was he an official Judge, or is that an honorary title?

DESCENDANTS OF JOANNA ADDY

Joanna Addy, b ca 1790-1794 in VA, married David Maple in Coshocton co OH 15 Oct 1818. We know very little about this family except that tragedy struck early in their lives. Prior to her marriage, Joanna is shown in William Addy's account with James Miskimen as <u>Annah</u> or <u>Anny</u>. She did spinning to apply against her father's account, and also picked up items for him at the post.

Joanna and David Maple are in the 1820 census, Linton tp, with one male 26/45 and one female 26/45. In the 1830 census, both LINTON and PERRY tp names appear at the top of the page; David is shown with one male under 5, one 5/10, one female under 5, he is 20/30 and Joanna is 30/40.

David was b ca 1794 and died 14 Oct 1839 without a will, his brother William B. Maple was appointed Administrator of the estate, which was not settled until October Term 1848. Named as heirs were **Elizabeth**, Thomas and John Maple, said to be "living out of state", no mention of just where or with whom. Joanna was not mentioned, and it is assumed that she had died either before David, or before the 1840 census, as that family does not appear in the Coshocton co census.

We found no Guardianship case for the children, and they were probably just sent to live with relatives; but with whom or where, we do not know. Perhaps they were in Peoria co. IL where several Maple/Addy families had settled, but we have found no concrete evidence of this. David was a cousin of Abraham Maple who also married into the Addy family, not just once, but three times! David served on the Mansfield Frontier in 1812-1814.

DESCENDANTS OF JAMES ADDY AND REBECCA WARDEN

James Addy, b 03 May 1796 in Jefferson co VA, now WVA, d 09 March 1881 Ross co OH. He married Rebecca Warden 19 Nov 1818 in Guernsey co OH. We owe much to the James Addy interview of Most of what we now know of the family of William Addy 1875. and Eleanor Clark has come as a result of the republishing of this article in the Ohio Genealogical Society magazine, THE REPORT, VOL XVII, winter 1978; and following that, in the Newcomerstown, Oh News of Feb 07, 1979, a copy of which was mailed to our Mother by relatives in Newcomerstown. After the death of that first generation of Addys, much of their history had been lost. In fact, prior to the above republication, William and Eleanor's son William 2nd was being referred to as William Senior, seemingly completely unaware of the first William. Although our Mother knew that the Addys were "from Ireland", her known ancestors began with William 2nd and Wealtha Ann. One hundred years after he was interviewed, James Addy was telling his story for the first time to a generation who were seeking their roots. We thank you, James.

James named twelve children, but we are not sure of the exact order of birth. We are listing our best information from descendants of James and Rebecca.

JAMES ADDY AND REBECCA WARDEN

We know more about James Addy's ancestry than we do of Rebecca Warden's family background.

Rebecca is thought to have been born about 1800 in Ireland or possibly Pennsylvania. Her father was John Warden, born Ireland and died in Ohio 1831. Her mother's name is not known.

John Warden family legends tell that this family came to the United States about 1800, that Rebecca had been born in Ireland and that a son had died at sea.

Isaac Warden (b 1797, PA) who married Jane Murray (see William Addy 2nd chapter) in Guernsey co OH in 1816 was the son of Isaac Warden, Sr, born Ireland about 1760/70, from ages given in census records. He became a naturalized U. S. citizen during the April Term, 1822 in Guernsey co, OH. His naturalization documentation includes a statement that he had been in this country prior to 1795.

We do not know the relationship between this Isaac Warden and John Warden, however we do know that family groups usually went together to the New World, and even to new areas within the United States. There were several Warden families in early Guernsey county, most of which included both Isaac and John. We feel that there is a relationship, but at this time cannot define it.
